Col. Robert COLE (Chief of Okla Falaya Choctaws, 1825-1828)

Shumaka, of the Shakchihoma tribe, is said to have had a sister who married a Mr. FRAZIER and had three children: (1) Charles, (2) Billy, and (3) Nelly, who married a Mr. DYER and went to Indian Territory in 1837.

Some sources claim that Roscow COLE and Shumaka had a daughter named Mishahoya (one record renders it Emich-ah-ho-yea) who married Moses Perry, probably a son of James Perry and his Chickasaw wife Susan. It is known that Susan was his mother. The daughter of Moses Perry and Mishahoya was Amy, wife of George Oxberry.

In all likelihood, Roscow COLE, husband of Shumaka, was a son of Roscow Cole (b. c1721 in Warwick Co., Va.) and his wife Rachel Robinson, mar. c1741. Roscow Cole, Sr., son of William Cole and Mary Roscow, was an Episcopal minister, and after his death, his widow married Charles TURNBULL, possible father of John Turnbull.

John TURNBULL, born in Dumfriesshire, Scotland, immigrated to America c1775, settling in Mobile with his father, mother, brother and sister. All the family, except he and his brother William, died of yellow fever the first summer after their arrival. William, a child of 11 or 12 years of age, was put with the greater part of their property in the store of an English merchant. William moved with the merchant's family to the Bahamas, where he died leaving a wife and two small children. John bought a mule and a peddler's pack and started a trade with the Choctaw and Chickasaw Indians, and after a time, was made agent under the Spanish rule and became very wealthy, owning much land in Mobile, on the Tombigbee and in East Baton Rouge. John met Catherine Rucker, age 16, when she was taken by Mrs. Philip Alston to the Choctaw Nation in 1781, when the English colonists of the Natchez District fled from the Spanish. John's son William Turnbull (b. c1780) achieved some distinction among the Choctaws, earning the rank of captain. In the early 1800s he was living on a hill west of present-day Grenada. A story is told that one day when he came into his cabin and sat down to dinner, something under the table bumped his leg. Thinking it was one of his dogs, he gave it a kick, only to suddenly find it was a wildcat, which emerged full of slashing fury and jumped on William's back. A quick thinker, William backed into his fireplace and the cat disappeared out the door with its tail still smoking. William is said to have drowned c1830 while crossing a creek. He was buried at his home.

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A JAMES PERRY was living in the Yalobusha Valley with family in 1830, including sons named Levi and Oliver. Probably Chickasaw. JOSEPH PERRY, according to a document from the National Archives, was in 1830 the head of a Choctaw family residing on the waters of the "Loociscooner in the Choctaw countrey..." in Capt. Turnbull's company (present day Scuna River in Yalobusha Co.). Another record says he was married to a Chickasaw woman and lived on Turkey Creek near the present site of Coffeeville on Turkey Creek at the time of the 1830 treaty. Some sources claim that he was married to a daughter of Roscow Cole and his Indian wife Shumaka, but no firm evidence has come to light as yet supporting this claim, though it is possible.

Some descendants of the Coles claim that MOSES PERRY married Mishahoya, another daughter of Roscow Cole and wife Shumaka, but this too is unproven, though it is known that Moses' wife was named Emich-ah-ho-yea (phonetically very close).

JOHN PERRY lived at the time of the treaty just east of the present site of Hardy, Miss., on land later purchased by a group including Pres. James K. Polk. He was a captain among the Choctaws of the Yaloba-aiasha settlement.

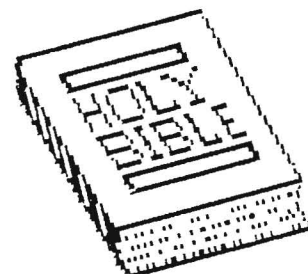
ISAAC PERRY was also a captain. He lived near present-day Holcombe, Miss. and was instrumental in encouraging the establishment of Eliot Mission near there by the Presbyterian Board of Missions in 1818. HARDY PERRY, Sr is said to have been

the first to bring "neat cattle" (oxen) into the Choctaw Nation, having purchased them from the French at Mobile. He is also supposed to have had a wife named Elizabeth and family in the Chickasaw Nation (see TURNBULL chart).

Joseph Cicero HEARD

The family came from GA. The  
 father, Ansell Cunningham HEARD,  
 was a farmer and came from GA to TX  
 in 1841. In due time, he married a  
 Miss YEATES, and 7 children were born

to them. Mrs. HEARD died in 1863 and he in 1881. Son Joseph was  
 born in TX 8 May 1861 & was educated in the country schools.  
 He had been a farmer until 1887 when he became a ginner and has  
 owned a number of gins in different scetions of Van Zandt county.  
 Commonly called Joe, he married Miss Tennessee HODGES on 11 Oct  
 1883. They were the parents of 5 children: 2 boys and 3 girls.  
 He was a Mason, an Odd Fellow and WOW. In 1902, both of his gins  
 ginned & packed 1630 bales of cotton.

T J WOOD

Of Irish extraction, the family came to SC in an early day.  
 They were a family of farmers and were slave holders before the  
 war. The father, William WOOD, was reared in SC but soon moved

to GA. In 1857 he moved to TX & settled in Smith co, dying in 1873. T J was born in the GA home 22 Sep 1847, therefore less than 4 years when he arrived in TX & was reared on the farm. Educated in country schools, he continued to farm & married Miss Nancy WOOD on 16 Oct 1873. She died 15 Mar 1895, he then married Mrs. Hope WILLOUGHBY LYNN on 18 Mar 1897. Mr. WOOD fathered 9 children, seven of whom lived. They were Baptist, he a member of the Farmers Union & a Royal Arch Mason.

#### J W ANDREWS

Coming from AL in 1857, he hired for wages and rented land and saved his money. In the latter part of 1869, he made his first purchase of land & moved to his own home in Jan 1870. Since that date he has steadily accumulated real estate & personal property. At one time, he owned more than 3,000 acres. Besides successful farming, he also owns city property. He told of this experiment: in a single year he cultivated 1½ acres in cotton and sugar cane in alternate rows. He made 467 gallons of syrup, put up for seed 5,000 stalks of cane & gathered 1,660 pounds of seed cotton. He also raised cattle & horses. As the children grew up, he gave parcels of land for their homes.

#### Warren Jackson HENDLEY

The HENDLEYS were Irish. They came to GA in an early day, and both Warren & his father were born there. Warren born 1 Dec 1863 and the family moved to TX in Dec 1867. William, the father, died in Jan 1889. His mother was a HARRIEL and she died in 1888. Warren married Miss Lucretia JOHNSON. They raised 5 of 8 children. He not only farms but also is a merchant. He is of the Methodist faith and a WOW.

#### Thomas McAdams POST

The POST family is from Holland. The first one of the family that came to America arrived in colonial days & fought with WASHINGTON for American Independence. A branch of the family finally settled in GA. William POST was in this line and was born in Jasper co GA 30 Jul 1806. His father moved the family to Autauga co AL in 1818, later on to Shelby co AL. He married Miss Elizebeth MERRILL in 1826. She died in 1840 & he married Miss Elizebeth McADAMS. In Jan 1856, he moved to Union parish LA, where he died in 1884. Of this latter union, 4 children were born, of whom Tom, our subject, was the oldest. He was born in Shelby co AL 11 Jul 1843, and at age 13, his father moved the family to LA and in June of that year, Tom was converted to the Christian religion. He was raised on the farm & was educated in the common schools of AL & LA. He married Miss Ceney C HOWELL on 20 Mar 1862 and of 8 children, 7 lived to be grown. In 1874 Tom entered the gospel ministry as a Baptist and they left LA in 1879 & settled in Bowie co TX. He has pastored churches in both Bowie & Van Zandt counties.

#### Dr. Charles Pinkney SMITH

The SMITHs are Georgians. Stephen G SMITH was the doctor's



grandfather and John Thomas SMITH was his father. They were both farmers and lived & died in GA. They were large planters & slave holders in the antebellum days. John Thomas married Miss Elizebeth RICHARDSON also of GA & they were the parents of 13 children, 9 of whom reached their majority. Charles was born in the GA home 3 May 1856 & remained there until his 18th year. He then went to FL & from there drifted to TX, arriving in Smith co 13 Jan 1877. He was educated in the common schools of GA & later attended Charm WOOD Institute at Tyler, TX. In Jan of 1880, Charles began the study of medicine under Dr. E JONES of Tyler, then a full course at St Louis, MO college. He married Miss Lula D PEEL 12 Oct 1884 & they raised 7 children. Besides his practice, he had 154 acres of farm lands with several acres in Bermuda pasture for the stock.

#### John Wesley DAVIDSON

Five generations ago the ancestor of this family came from ENG & settled in NC. He was the father of 3 sons, all of which died in NC. William was a son of one of these 3 and moved to FL about the close of the Rev war. He, in turn, was the father of John W, who in turn was the father of Leaston, who is the father of our subject, who was born in FL 1 Jan 1847. In 1854, William, John W & Leaston (then quite a boy) came from FL to TX and set up farms. Leaston grew up & married Miss Annie GERMANY, whose mother lived to the age of 85. Annie died however in 1872 & of the 2 children born, John was the oldest & was born 3 Aug 1869 in Van Zandt co. He went to county schools & clerked in his father's store, then attending Southwestern Univ. He married Miss Katie LONGMIRE, whom he had known for many years, 28 Apr 1889, daughter of Dr. R R LONGMIRE. John taught for 7 years but law was his desire & so in 1895 he began to study in earnest. He was admitted to the county bar in 1896 & entered into partnership with R M LIVELY. He was elected county judge in 1900 & 1902. He is a Methodist, Odd Fellow (past Noble Grand), & a WOW.

#### John Wesley MILLER

The MILLERS were from SC. George MILLER was a slave holder & large planter in SC & the father of 4 children. The eldest was William Tresvan, born 9 Oct 1832 in the SC home. He grew to manhood there, but soon moved to Winston co MS where he married Miss Jane LUDWIG, whose parents came from NS & her grandparents came from GER, 9 Jun 1861. Their 1st child, John Wesley was born 16 Mar 1862 in MS & at age 4, the family moved to Henderson co TX. The father died in 1885, leaving the mother a widow with 9 children. The support of the family was largely on John and he attended only a little school. He married Miss Melvina MORTON 11 Dec 1884, she only lived 4 more years & mothered 1 child. He re-married Miss Belle MORTON, a niece of the deceased wife, 19 Nov 1889 & they were the parents of 3 children. John re-entered school when his oldest boy was the age to go with him. He pursued his studies until he was able to teach & held a first grade certificate. He was a great lover of music & taught

vocal music. He was a member of Martin's Mill Band & loved music in all its branches.

#### Elijah Robison KUYKENDALL

The family is of German extraction. On coming to America, they first settled in NC. Jesse was the grandfather & lived in NC & came to TN. Peter was the father & he was a Christian preacher & preached in early TN. He moved with the family to TX in Feb 1848. Elijah was born in TN 14 Dec 1836 so was in TX in an early day. They settled in Grand Saline where few persons lived. Some that lived in the area at that time were: Peter S BENTON, a tanner; J D WRIGHT, a doctor; John CHRESTMAN, a farmer; and Allen BLAIR. There was a settlement on McBee's Creek & Mr. McBEE owned a "tread" mill. The Shreveport and Dallas Road ran through the county from east to west & the PORTER's Bluff Road ran through the southern end of the county. These roads were traveled a great deal by immigrants, stock drovers, adventurers, etc. There was a settlement at the head of Saline Creek where the YOES, RAWSON & KING families lived. Also a group in the now Edom community lived Uncle John RILES, John COTHERN, Clabe COTHERN, John MARRS & Henry MARRS, Jack HORSELY & his father. The BRUTONS & HARRISONS lived on 4 mile Prairie. J J KUYKENDALL, an older brother of our subject, was the first teacher in the county, also the first deputy sheriff. Elijah married Nancy Ann BRATCHER 18 Oct 1858. She lived until 20 Jul 1881 & he married 2nd Mrs. M J SMITH 21 Jan 1882. In 1862 he volunteered into the Confederate service & served until the surrender, in TX, LA & AR. He lost his health during the war but recovered well. At age 50 he entered the Christian ministry besides working as a mechanic.

#### John Newland REYNOLDS

The REYNOLDS family are of Irish extraction. This family, however, united early with one of English blood (the NORTONS). For 2 generations they lived in NY. Nehemiah REYNOLDS & Truman NORTON paternal & maternal grandfathers, lived there. Both were planters. The father, Robert REYNOLDS was born & reared in NY. At age 24 he married Miss Permelia NORTON, a girl born & reared in the same community. They were the parents of 9 children. Of these, John was the 5th. He was born in Columbia co NY 19 Apr 1832, raised on the farm. He attended school half the year & worked the farm the other half. He afterwards went to school in Albany. At age 17 he entered an apprenticeship as carpenter & bridge builder & later became an expert in that line. He build 25 railroad bridges of importance in AL & TX. In 1859, he moved from NY to Monroe, LA & conducted the sheriff's office for a kinsman & in 1863 entered into the Confederate service. He came to Harrison co TX in 1868 & married Miss Mollie YOUNG 12 Sep 1869, she the daughter of G W YOUNG, assessor & collector for Harrison co. She died 25 Aug 1873 & he married 2nd Miss Jennie YOUNG, a younger sister of his deceased wife. They were parents of 3 children: George Robert, Mollie, & Janie. He has owned grist & saw mills, cotton gin, nursery, a small farm plus

160 town lots in Myrtle Springs. He was an elder in the Christian church & Royal Arch Mason.

#### David Love RILEY

The family lived in Talladega co AL where David was born 27 Jul 1846. The father was a neighbor the CURRY family & they came west together. David was aged 4 when the family moved to TX in the Edom community where Mr. HAMBRICK was probably the first slave holder in the county. David received the best available education during the war & married Miss Mary HOBBS 26 Aug 1866. 6 children were raised & the wife died 13 Sep 1879. He married 2nd Miss Nannie THOMPSON who was also a native ALabamian. They raised 5 of 7 children. He embarked in the drug store business in 1873 & the general merchandise business in 1880. David was a writer for the paper & a Baptist. His sons assist in the business with son Claud as manager.

#### Benjamin Franklin STARNES

The STARNES family is of Irish-German extraction but are South Carolinians for 2 generations. John Melton STARNES was born in Benton Dist SC in 1815. He moved to AL in early life & there married Miss Mary Ann FREEZE, who had also immigrated from SC. They moved to TX in the 40's & settled in Upshur co. Later they moved near Quitman in Wood co. John died in 1878 but the wife lived to an age older than 86 years. Ben was the 7th of 9 children, born in Wood co 29 Sep 1855. He was brought up on the farm & educated at the country schools. When Ben was 10, the family moved to Van Zandt count & settled near Cedar Grove where Ben remained until 1888. He married Miss Margie A KELLEY 22 Feb 1878 & they reared 3 children, 2 girls & 1 boy. Ben was a farmer, ginner & lumberman. He was of the Methodist faith, an Odd Fellow & WOW.

#### L G PHILLIPS

Mr. PHILLIPS came from Calhoun co AL. He rented land for 4 years, working & saving his money; then purchased land & implements to farm 129 acres. Cotton is the main crop with some corn. He was public-spirited & helped in all public enterprises.

#### Joseph Augustus HENRY

Joseph was born in Sumpter co AL 4 Jan 1839. While an infant his parents moved to Neshoba co MS. Most of the inhabitants were Choctaw Indians; the family farmed & hunted & fished. On 28 Feb 1861 he married Miss Elizebeth T PHILLIPS, the ceremony being performed by Rev P F MOREHEAD. In Aug 1861, Joseph enlisted in the Confederate service, at first for 12 months, but later for 3 years or during the war. Most of his service was in the 33MS Regt, Featherstone Brigade. He saw service in MS, AL, GA & TN. Joseph did not get a scratch & was in the final muster. He returned home to broken fortune & began to re-build their life by farming & a general shop. He was postmaster at Zion MS for 8 years. In 1902 he sold everything & moved to Edgewood TX. First he was in the gin business, then lumber.

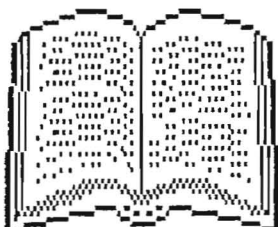

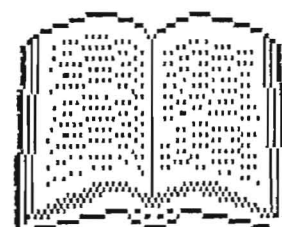
