YOU ARE YOUR OWN COUSIN

"You cannot go on doubling your ancestors for more than a few generations into the past for inevitably the same ancestors will appear on both your father's and your mother's sides of the family tree, reducing the total number. This does not allow you to double the rate during that generation, and surely this would begin to happen more and more often as you go back in time. Library Lagniappe by

The frazzled genealogist asks the librarian to "please help me find that small red book that I used in Virginia (or was it North Carolina?) last month." With more than 12,000 books in Shreve Memorial Library's Genealogy Collection, this is no small task. There is a proven way to avoid Desperation Time at the library: Cite Your Sources! You will save future time and anguish by writing down author, title, call number, page and which library holds the book. For periodicals, you need title of the article, author, page number and the magazine's title, volume, and issue number. A quicker way to get this information is to photocopy the title page, front and back, of the book or periodical and staple it to the information pages.

When you photocopy microfilm, be sure to write down census state, county and year, enumeration district (if available) and page number. When another genealogist shares information with you, copy down the donor's name, address and date you received it. Always assume that you will want to refer back to a source again and be sure to completely document it.

Whether you appublishing a book, trying to enter an hereditary society or doing genealogy for yourself and family, citing your sources gives credibility to your research. A standard manual for documenting family histories and genealogical records is available in the Genealogy Department. It is Richard S. Lackey's <u>Cite Your Sources</u>, 929.1 Lac. Give it a look/see soon.

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Four Generations of Lighthouse Keepers by Ralph Tabor WILLIAMS

Submitted by member Mary THRASH DAY, who reports the author's 2nd great grandfather Braddock WILLIAMS was the brother of her 3rd great grandfather, Jarrid WILLIAMS. (Thanks to you both for sharing it)

When I joined the U.S. Navy in 1940, I broke a career tradition that began with Braddock WILLIAMS, my 2nd great grandfather, was carried on by James Albert WILLIAMS, my great grandfather, continued by James Chester WILLIAMS, my grandfather, and ended with James Tabor WILLIAMS, my father. These four generations of men in my WILLIAMS lineage served as lighthouse keepers in stations from Florida to Texas. The years of their combined service began in 1854 and ended in 1939, the year in which the U.S. Coast Guard assumed control of the U.S. Lighthouse Service.

I pick up this WILLIAMS' trail around March 1817, when early settlers began crossing the Chattahoochee River from Georgia into Alabama. They came over the Old Federal Road from Virginia, the Carolinas, and north Georgia, and crossed the river at Ft. Gaines, Georgia. William WILLIAMS, my 3rd great grandfather, and two of his sons. John and Braddock, who became my 2nd great grandfather, were among these early settlers of the area that became Henry County, Alabama, on 13 Dec 1819.

Franklin was Henry County's first settlement, located on the west bank of the Chattahoochee River, across from Ft. Gaines. The second town established in Henry County was Williamston, in 1820, some 30 miles northwest of Franklin; it was named for William WILLIAMS. In 1832, Barbour County was formed from Henry County and land acquired by the Creek Cession of that year, and Williamston, by political fiat, moved into Barbour County. shift permits Anne KENDRICK WALKER to say that Williamston was first settlement in Barbour County. She also says it wa settled about 1820 by emigrants from South Carolina[?], and took name from the WILLIAMS family, who staked their claims near the east fork of the Choctawatchee River. The correct version of story doesn't really matter now, because the town did not W. Stuart HARRIS writes "The oldens town in Barbour County, Williamston was on the headwaters of Choctawatchee River, approximately 12 miles southwest of Eufaula and 6.5 miles southeast of Clayton Williamston existed until the Civil War but vanished soon after the conflict, when the farmers of the area began to trade in Clayton and Eufaula".

Marie H. GODREY has compiled 2 volumes on the early settlers of Barbour County and I have been able to learn something about

my 3rd great grandfather and his family.

On 22 Dec 1822, in Henry County Alabama, Braddock WILLIAMS, born in North Carolina around 1800, married Sarah Deborah WILLIAMS, born in Georgia. Their growing family appears in the 1830 federal census for Pike County, Alabama, and in Dale County Alabama for 1840. Then, in the 1850 census for Escambia County, Florida, I found Sarah D. WILLIAMS living in Pensacola with Joseph F. LEE and his wife Elizabeth: Sarah is now 47 years old

and has her 6 children with her: James A. aged 23, John W. 22, Seldon S. Walkly 16, Michael (should be Michelle) 11, Arad 9, and Victoria 7. All of the children were born in Alabama except Victoria, who was born in Florida. By deduction, Braddock and Sarah must have arrived in Florida around 1843. Braddock himself is not counted with this group, and I have not been able to fine him at all in the 1850 census.

Located off Apalachicola Bay, in Florida, there is a sand barrier 40 miles long known as St. George Island, and the next I locate Braddock WILLIAMS, he is the Keeper of the Cape St. George Light, located on the southernmost point of the island. He kept this light from 23 Feb 1854 until some time in 1860. His presence there in 1860 is confirmed by the census of Franklin County Florida, at age 61, with Deborah WILLIAMS, age 54, and 3 of their children: Arad 18, J. P. no age given, and Victoria 16.

From 1860 to 1866-during the Civil War time of 1861/65-I have no record of Braddock WILLIAMS and his family, but on 2 Nov 1866, he was assigned as Keeper of the Cape San Blas Light, located in Gulf County, Florida, between Apalachicola and Port St. Joe. He served in that station until 13 May 1868. Then he returned to the Cape St. George Light and served as Keeper there until 6 Mar 1874. In the 1870 census of Franklin County, Florida, Braddock is counted, age 75, occupation: lighthouse keeper. Mary (sic) aged 70 is there and Arad, their son, aged 34. Arad's occupation is assistant lighthouse keeper.

On 6 Mar 1874, Braddock WILLIAMS wa reduced in rank to Assistant Keeper of Cape St. George Light, Arad WILLIAMS, his son, became Keeper, and held the position until 9 Jun 1875, when he was killed in a fall from the lighthouse tower. James Albert WILLIAMS, Braddock's oldest son and my great grandfather, became Keeper of the Light, and served there until 1 Aug 1893. Braddock continued as Assistant Keeper of Cape St. George Light until 13 Jan 1879; on that date he resigned from the Lighthouse Service.

Braddock WILLIAMS, age 80, appears on the 1880 Franklin County Florida census, living in Apalachicola, for the last time. He is listed as having "no occupation". From this census, I learn that both his parents, William and Elizabeth WILLIAMS, were born in North Carolina. Sarah Deborah WILLIAMS, age 77, is with him, and I find that her parents were born in Virginia.

From "Burial Permits Issued in Appalachicola 1865-1885", permit #373 reads: "August 13, 1881; Lot: Old Graveyard Block; Body of Braddock WILLIAMS; Age 82 years." From North Carolina to Florida via Georgia and Alabama, he knew the dangers of being a pioneer and the loneliness of keeping lights, and if he was like most of the lighthouse keepers I have known, the salient feature of his character was self-sufficiency. Sarah Deborah WILLIAMS was still alive in January 1883, because she sold a house and lot she and Braddock owned in Apalachicola. I have a copy of the deed, and I'm still looking for her parents and obituary.

The search for James Albert WILLIAMS illustrates why anyone doing rigorous genealogical research need to look for more than one source of documentation on every event in a subject's life. Much of the data I have on the early years of James Albert were relayed to me from a Bible which belonged to one of his sons, Charles Henry WILLIAMS, but my research turns up conflicting

dates and places on some of the information.

On 22 Aug 1827, James Albert WILLIAMS was born in Dade co AL (Charles Henry WILLIAMS's Bible). The date may be correct, but there was no Dade County in AL in 1827, and there is none now. I found James Albert's father & family in Pike co AL in the 1830 census. There are 2 males listed with ages under 5 years. I don't know if James Albert was one of those two, but I assume he was. In any case, I must look further to make certain.

The same uncertainty arises for Lucretia FOSTER, James Albert's future wife. According to the Bible of Charles Henry WILLIAMS, Lucretia was born 5 Jan 1837 in Wilcox co GA. I know her father's name was Henry FOSTER & her mother was Harriet LIVERMAN, both born in GA. I wanted to check the 1840 census for Wilcox co GA, but that county didn't exist until 1857, when it was formed from parts of Irwin, Dooly, & Pulaski counties.

In 1850, James A. WILLIAMS appears in Escambia co FL. He was born in AL, is 23 years old, & his occupation is "sailor". In the 1850 census of Gadsden co FL, Lucretia FOSTER, age 14, is counted with her father Henry FOSTER, age 35, occupation Laborer, her mother Harriett, age 30, sister Ellen aged 12, & brother Henry aged 10. They were all born in GA.

On 30 Mar 1853, James Albert WILLIAMS & Lucretia were married (Charles Henry WILLIAMS's Bible). I have written to the Clerk of Courts in Escambia & Gadsden cos but they have no record of the marriage. I have not been able to find James Albert & his family in either the 1860 or 1870 census. On 9 Jun 1875, the day Arad died in a fall from the light tower, James Albert WILLIAMS was appointed Keeper of the Capt St. George Light.

The 1880 census of Franklin co FL lists James Albert WILLIAMS, aged 53, Lighthouse Keeper, wife Lucretia (FOSTER) WILLIAMS aged 43, & children: Alice aged 21, John W. aged 17, Chester (who became my grandfather) aged 13, James A. Jr. aged 6, & Charles H. aged 4. This census shows James Albert's parents both born in AL; my research indicates that his father was born in NC & his mother born in GA. It also shows Lucretia & her parents born in FL. My research tells me they were all born in GA.

James Albert WILLIAMS was reassigned as Keeper of the Apalachicola Bay Range Front Light on 29 Jan 1893. On 4 Oct 1895, he transferred to Crooked River Light, and remained there until 1 Jan 1906. Crooked River Light was built to serve the deep-water port created by the Crooked River at Carrabelle; James Albert lighted that light for the first time on 28 Oct 1895. It is still an active navigational aid.

On 18 Dec 1906, Lucretia FOSTER WILLIAMS died, & on 14 Apr 1908, James Albert WILLIAMS followed her (Charles Henry WILLIAMS's Bible).

My grandfather, James Chester WILLIAMS, was born 9 May 1866, presumably on St. George Island, FL. (HURLEY's book says Pensacola FL). I have not been able to determine the exact place. His wife-to-be, & my grandmother, Delia Cornelia VAUSE, was born in Wakulla co FL. Her father was Francis Marion "Med" VAUSE, born in Darlington District SC; he fought for the Confederacy in the 3rd FL Regiment. Her mother was Ann Marie KERSEY, born in GA.

On 2 Jun 1886, James Chester was appointed Assistant Keeper

of the Cape St. George Light. His father, James Albert WILLIAMS, was the Keeper. On 9 May 1889, James Chester married Delia VAUSE in Apalachicola FL. He resigned from the U.S. Lighthouse Service on 1 Aug 1893, but returned on 13 Nov 1896, to tend the Apalachicola Bay & St. George Sound Bulkhead Cut, 6-foot Spot, and Porter Bar Beacons. I don't know what he did to support his growing family between 1893 and 1896.

In the 1900 census for Franklin co FL, James C. WILLIAMS aged 34, & Delia C. WILLIAMS aged 33 are listed; his occupation is beacon light keeper. All of their 6 children have been born, apparently in Apalachicola FL. They were: John Leroy born 1 Jun 1890, James Tabor (my father) born 16 Nov 1891, Lola Geraldine born 20 Sep 1893, Ethel Antoninette born 2 Jan 1896, Elma Lucretia born 10 Aug 1897, & Buford Marion born 4 Mar 1900.

My father, James Tabor WILLIAMS, born 16 Nov 1891 in Apalachicola, Franklin co FL. My mother, Nora Marguerite GORDON, was born at Round Island Light, located in the Mississippi Sound, off Pascagoula MS. Her father was Ralph GORDON, Keeper of the Round Island Light, born around 1881, in London England; her mother wa Nanetta "Netta" Haasis MILLS, born 15 Jan 1885, in Orrville AL.

On 16 Nov 1911, James Tabor was appointed Assistant Keeper of Gasparilla Island Light, FL. He resigned from the U.S. Lighthouse Service on 10 Nov 1914. All future references to James Tabor will be taken from his papers, which were passed on to me.

I don't know what my father did to support himself between 11 Nov 1914 & 26 Feb 1916, except that at some time during 1915, he worked approximately 6 months as a clerk in the Boca Grande Mercantile Company, Boca Grande, FL. On 27 Feb 1916, however, he returned to the U.S. Lighthouse Service as Assistant Keeper of Merrill Shell Bank Light, which is located in the vicinity of Cat, St. Joseph's, and Grand Islands, in the Mississippi Sound. He served in this position until 16 Oct 1916.

He was next assigned as Second Assistant Keeper of Bolivar Point Light on 17 Oct 1916. This light was located at the entrance to Galveston Bay TX, & James Tabor served there until 28 Apr 1917. The light was discontinued by the Lighthouse Service on 29 May 1933. From 29 Apr 1917 until 18 Jun 1917, he was Assistant Keeper at Sabine Pass Light in Texas.

On 19 Jun 1917 he was given leave from the Lighthouse Service & joined the U.S. Navy. When he was discharged, he was issued a War Service Certificate. #260625, which states that "James T. WILLIAMS, E2, U.S.N., performed honorable active service in the United States Navy from 19 Jun 1917 to 31 Jul 1919, on board the following ships & stations: USS Nevada and the USS Allen".

On 19 Sep 1919, James Tabor returned to Sabine Pass Light as Second Assistant Keeper, & remained at that light until 23 Nov 1919. Then he called on his wartime experience & requested to be transferred to the U.S. Lighthouse Tender Magnolin. Between 24 Nov 1919 & 31 Mar 1922, he served as Radio Operator in that ship.

On 9 Mar 1922, James Tabor & Nora Marguerite GORDON were married in Gretna, Jefferson par LA. I was born 5 Dec 1922 in Port Eads LA & my brother, Norman Gerald was born 11 Apr 1927 in

New Orleans LA. They had no other children.

My father was transferred ashore on 1 Apr 1922, when he relieved my grandfather, Ralph GORDON, as U.S. Lighthouse Depot Keeper, at Port Eads LA. Port Eads was located in the South Pass of the Mississippi River, just before the river makes its final run into the Gulf of Mexico. The place was never accessible by road, and now it is a ghost town. The Lighthouse Depot was decommissioned, & the lighthouse in Port Eads was automated. Recent maps of LA no longer show Port Eads. James Tabor retired on 30 Sep 1930, & we moved to Covington LA.

James Tabor WILLIAMS was a restless man; he seemed to always be on the move, so his retirement didn't last long. He applied for reinstatement to the Lighthouse Service, & was assigned as Keeper of New Canal Light, New Orleans LA on 16 Jun 1932. The light marked the entrance of the canal with Lake Pontchartrain. It is still an active light; Coast Guardsmen man the station there & are responsible for all rescue work in Lake Pontchartrain

& bayou country surrounding the greater New Orleans area.

On 16 May 1938, James Tabor became Assistant Depot Keeper, New Orleans LA. The depot is located on the Industrial Canal, which links the Mississippi River with Lake Pontchartrain. On 1 Sep 1939, the U.S. Lighthouse Service was absorbed by the U.S. Coast Guard, & my father was forced to retire again. This time his retirement lasted until his death, on 13 Nov 1963, in the Veterans Administration Hospital, Bay Pines, Pinellas co FL. He is buried in the Bay Pines Veterans Cemetery. My mother, Nora Marguerite GORDON WILLIAMS died 21 Dec 1990, in Virginia Beach VA.

As researchers, we all want to know how certain names, traits, etc. were passed along to the present generation. The medical field is increasingly making us aware that our heritage also includes some unwanted diseases.





Le Comité des Archives de la Louisiane recently presented the Louisiana State Archives with a new microfilm cabinet, 220 reels of microfilm containing the New Orleans ship passenger list indexes, and two reels of muster rolls of Louisiana soldiers who served in the Mexican War.

The ship passenger list indexes are contained on two separate series of microfilm. The first, National Archives microfilm series M334, consisting of 188 reels, indexes the pre-1850 records not only for New Orleans but for all East and Gulf Coast ports except New York. The second, National Archives microfilm T527, consists of 32 reels of only the New Orleans port arrivals for the years 1853 to 1900.

The Archives already had 93 reels of New Orleans ship passenger lists covering the years 1820 to 1904, but their usefulness was limited because the Archives had none of the available indexes. The passenger lists themselves were microfilmed in chronologial order and unless researchers knew the arrival date within a very narrow range, finding an ancestor could be very time consuming. Researchers in Baton Rouge were further hampered by the fact that no research facility in Baton Rouge had the first index set. Now, researchers will have all the 19th century New Orleans passenger lists and available indexes in one place. Volunteers at the Archives are also working on indexing the two unindexed years, 1851 and 1852, which will be available to researchers on computer in the near future.

The indexes are very easy to use. Each name is indexed on a separate card and the cards are arranged alphabetically on each set of microfilm. An individual's card provides the name of the vessel and date of arrival which are needed to retrieve the passenger list itself. The passenger list will then provide the names of all persons on the vessel, age, sex, occupation, and country of origin. Deaths and births on the vessel may also be noted.

Obtaining the two reels of microfilm of Mexican War Muster Rolls was another major accomplishment for Le Comité. Last year, the society commissioned the National Archives to microfilm all its records pertaining to Louisiana soldiers who served in the Mexican War, which the United States fought between 1846 and 1848. These records are not available in any research facility outside the National Archives.

The purchase of the microfilm was funded in large part by a generous donation from a Le Comité member. The Archives, however, lacked space to store the microfilm where they would be easily accessible to reseachers. Therefore, Le Comité purchased a new 12-drawer microfilm cabinet and placed it in the Research Room near the microfilm readers. This cabinet will be used solely to hold Le Comité microfilm donations and will be accessible free of charge to all patrons.
