THE CASE OF SUCCESSIONS IN LOUISIANA

Long before Louisiana became a state in 1812, the laws that govern the manner in which estates are handled took effect. The legal history of the succession laws in Louisiana began when Louis XIV of France granted a charter to Antoine Crozat for development of the territory in 1712. This charter provided that the territory be governed by the French laws which had been written in the sixteenth century. When Louisiana passed from France to Spain in 1762, the first Spanish governor, Don Alexander O'Reilly, put into effect a code of practice which became known as "O'Reilly's Code." Then came a blending of laws that developed both under the French and Spanish governments providing Louisiana with the most unique law system found in the United States. Not only must attorneys be familiar with the English common law based on decisions of the court, but the written code of laws, unique to Louisiana. This written code of laws, known as the *Civil Code of Louisiana*, eventually evolved into the form it takes today. Thus, understanding the meaning of succession in Louisiana is imperative to the genealogist.

When someone dies, there must be an orderly way to determine what happens to his property and his debts. In Louisiana, this process is called *succession*. Succession laws are a part of Louisiana's unique law system. Succession is the transmission of the estate of the deceased to his successors. The successors thus have the right to take possession of the estate of the deceased after complying with the applicable provisions of law. But, there are certain requirements of the laws that the successors must meet before the succession can be closed.

Successions are either *testate* or *intestate*. If the deceased left a will, the estate is *testate* and the successors are called *legatees*. If there is no will, the succession is called *intestate*. Intestate successors are called *heirs*. Other terms that enter into the succession include community property, separate property, usufruct, and forced heirship. Community property is that which is accumulated during a marriage. Separate property is that that which was acquired before the marriage, inherited, or gifts. Usufruct is the nearly unlimited right to use community property as specified by the law. Forced heirship is a restriction of what one can do with property if there are direct descendants. Children under the age of 23 and children who are incapacitated regardless of age are forced heirs and one must provide a forced portion to them.

The intestate succession involves an order of succession that determines who will receive community property and separate property. For instance, community property will go first to the children or the children's descendants, with usufruct to a spouse. If there are no children or descendants of children, the community property will go to the spouse. Separate property goes first to the children or children's descendants.

Understanding the order of succession must include such terms as ascendants, going up the family tree; descendants, going down the family tree; collaterals, blood relatives who do not decend from one another, but from a common ancestor. Louisiana law then determines which of these inherit when the decedent dies without a will. Forced heirship, mentioned previously, means in Louisiana that if one has direct descendants who are forced heirs, the law restricts what one can do with his or her property in a will. Louisiana law requires that a parents leave a portion of his or her property to the children who are the forced heirs. If a person dies without any descendants, he or she has no forced heirship problem. It should be noted that the spouse is not considered a forced heir.

When a testate succession is opened, one of the first steps is to file the will with the court and have it *probated*. *Probating a will* simply means proving it. The procedure for probating a will varies depending on the type of will. An *olographic* will is entirely written, dated, and signed by the deceased. Witnesses must be found who can vouch for the deceased handwriting. Other types of wills include noncupative wills by public act, noncupative wills by private act, and statutory wills.

It is certainly apparent that an understanding of the laws of succession in Louisiana is necessary for the genealogist. It should also be noted that successions and probates can often take years to complete. As the records are searched, the genealogist should always look for the final judgement of the estate. For the most complete discussion of succession and probate laws, refer to the Civil Code of Louisiana.

RIVES IN THE ARK-LA-TEX AREA

Abstracted by Ron Massey

186. (descendant number) Claudis Green RIVES (9th generation from immigrant) son of George Wyche RIVES, now residing at 600 Egan, Shreveport, La. He was born July 22, 1856. He was brought up by his mother in De Soto parish, La., removing in 1865 to Shreveport. In 1872 he commenced work as a "cub pilot" and clerk on a steamboat plying between Shreveport and New Orleans, and later was engaged as a bank runner, bookkeeper and clerk. Since 1915 he has been a public accountant. Mr. C. G. RIVES has taken a prominent part in the civic affairs of his community. He was elected a Councilman in 1898, City Auditor in 1900, and City Comptroller in 1902, serving in the last-named office until 1910 when, upon a change to a commission form of government by the city of Shreveport, he was made Commissioner of Accounts and Finances. This office he held until 1914 when he was defeated for reelection. From 1900 to 1904 he served as an elective member of the police jury (county commission) of Caddo Parish, La., and during the incumbency of this office introduced the first good roads ordinance in 1900.

Soon after the War Between the States, Mr. RIVES, as a young man, joined with the leading men of Caddo Parish in their successful efforts to overthrow the infamous carpet bag government which had been foisted upon the South by a coterie of vengeance-seeking politicians of the North. He took part also in the agitation against the Louisiana Lottery, and in the movement to do away with the licensed saloon. Uniting with the Presbyterian Church in 1877, he was made a deacon in 1902 and an elder in 1926.

Mr. C. G. RIVES married September 22, 1885, Mary Lane WILLIAMS, daughter of Nathan Lane and Lucy WILLIAMSON WILLIAMS. (Nathan L. WILLIAMS was a son of Dr. Gideon Glenn WILLIAMS of "Egypt," Wharton County, TX., and his wife Mary LANE. Dr. WILLIAMS served in the War of 1812 from TN, in Capt. WILLIAMSON's company and moved to AL in 1818 where he assisted in the formation of the town of Courtland. Removing to TX, he took part in the Texan War for Independence and, later the War for Southern Independence. Mrs. C. G. RIVES is a member of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas, the DAR, UDC, and Colonial Dames.

42. Judson Carey RIVES (8th gen.) son of Green RIVES, was born in South Carolina on 18 August 1829. "When a young man he was the most splendid looking man my eyes ever looked upon," was the testimony of him left by his brother, J. R. RIVES. In 1833 he accompanied his father to Alabama and in 1850, after an attendance of some time at the University of Alabama, he removed to De Soto Parish, La, where he built "wildwood" about three miles from Mansfield, La., and where he spent the remainder of his life. He married 17 August 1851 to Eliza Frances DAVIDSON (b. 12 Jan 1832 in SC, d. 15 July 1885 in LA.) She was the daughter of Mark Paten and Margaret MCELHAINY MARTIN. James DAVIDSON was a son of John DAVIDSON and his wife, Janet HENDERSON, a daughter of John and Janet TOD HENDERSON).

199. Albert Martin RIVES (9th gen.) son of Judson Carev RIVES, like all his brothers and sisters, was born at "Wildwood" in De Soto Parish, La. He was reared on the plantation of his father, and received a common school education in the local schools of Mansfield. "He was a son of Judson C. RIVES, who was an early settler in De Soto Parish and his mother was a Miss DAVIDSON, a member of another of the first families that settled in northwest LA. In early manhood (15 May 1878) the deceased was married to Miss Emma (Virginia) DURHAM a leading citizen of De Soto Parish. Mr. RIVES followed farming for some time after his marriage although he was in the saw mill business for some years. He was always active in public life, and figured extensively in the struggle for the redemption of Louisiana during the days of reconstruction. After wards he served two terms as clerk of the District Court, and also served one term as a member of the Louisiana legislature, and in both positions he made a good record as a public servant. He was ever active in matters pertaining to public schools, and served on the parish school board, and was a member of the local board of trustees for the Mansfield High School from its organization until his death. He was noted for his good business sense and ability. Cautious and conservative in business matters, he accumulated a competence and leaves his family well provided for. He was a consistent member of the Baptist church and in fact, was in every respect a useful citizen and his loss is not confined to his family, but is felt by this entire community. He was a courageous man and dared to do what he thought was right under toe most trying circumstances. He was liberal and generous, without being extravagant, in the use of his money, and was ever true to his friends, and this made him a power for good in the community, as well as in public life. He was a leader of men but was never demonstrative in his work, and was good naturedly termed by his friends, "the silent boss," for his influence was wielded in such a manner, that his opponents never knew just how it happened until too late to oppose him. Of course he had his faults, and to say that he had not, would be to impute the teaching of the Bible, that tells us that the human race is born in sin, that must be wiped away by the teachings of Jesus Christ, but his faults were perhaps as few as those of the best of men. The entire Enterprise force is grieving because of his untimely taking away, for he was a charter member of the Enterprise Publishing co., and has served from its wise council has ever been appreciated and always found valuable by the management of the paper. Indeed a "sturdy old oak hath fallen" upon whom his family leaned with faith, love and confidence, his friends with respect and consideration, and the entire community with appreciation, for his example encouraged and enthused those stricken with lethargy, and calmed and reconciled those whose enthusiasm might have resulted in harm to themselves, as well as to others. His has truly been a useful life, and his place will be hard to fill."

This latter was a part of his obituary notice from the Mansfield Enterprise December 16, 1920.

1537 Joseph BOISSEAU, (8th gen.) son of Julia RIVES BOISSEAU, was born in Dinwiddle County, VA. He received his early education in Fayette County, Tennessee and in 1849 settled in Shreveport, La. where in 1853 he began steamboating on the Upper Red River to New Orleans, becoming in time commander successively of the steamers: Marion, Newsboy and Trent. In 1861 he enlisted in the 1st LA Inf., CSA, but subsequently hired a substitute and took command of the SS Trent which he ran in the service of the Confederate Government. In 1863 he was appointed pilot of the Confederate gunboat, Missouri, which he took to Alexandria, LA., in defense of the forts there and where he remained until 1865. After the war Capt. BOISSEAU entered the wholesale grocery and cotton business in Shreveport and died there December 23, 1905. He married April 11, 1866, in VA. to his third cousin Josephine Elizabeth BOISSEAU, daughter of Dr. James Poythress and Anne Elizabeth SCOTT BOISSEAU of Dinwiddie County.


Wanted: A Very Special Nurse to Care for 50 Patients at a Local Hospital

Duties and requirements:

- Daily sweep and mop the floors of your ward. Dust the patients' furniture and windowsills.
- Maintain an even temperature in your ward by bringing in a scuttle of coal for the day's business.
- Light is important to observe the patient's condition. Therefore, each day fill kerosene lamps, clean chimneys and trim wicks. Wash the windows once a week.
- The Nurses' notes are important in aiding the physician's work. Make your pens carefully. You may whittle nibs to your individual taste.
- Each nurse on duty will report every day at 7:00 A.M. and leave at 8:00 P.M. except on the Sabbath on which you will be off from 12:00 noon to 2:00 P.M.
- Graduates in good standing with the Superintendent of Nurses will be given an evening off each week for courting purposes, or two evenings a week if you go to church regularly.
- Each nurse should lay aside from each pay day a goodly sum of her earnings for her benefit in her declining years, so that she will not become a burden. For example, if you earn \$30 a month, you should set aside \$15.
- Any nurse who smokes, uses liquor in any form, gets her hair done at a beauty shop, or frequents dance halls will give the Superimendent of Nurses a good reason to suspect her worth, intentions and integrity.
- The nurse who performs her labors, serves her patients and doctors faithfully without fault for a period of five years will be given an increase by the Hospital Administration of five cents a day, providing there are no hospital debts that are outstanding.

THE FINLEY FAMILY

The research papers done by Mrs. Eva FINLEY SMITH on the FINLEY family are located in the Larkin-Edwards room of Shreve Memorial Library in Shreveport, Louisiana. Mrs. Smith's records provide some historical information and trace many FINLEY lines from their origins in Scotland through Pennsylvania, Virginia, Tennessee, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, and into Bienville Parish and the surrounding area. Some of the local families connected to the FINLEY family are PULLIG, TYLER, THOMAS, REGIONS, JOHNSON, GODWIN, CHIPLEY, SMITH, and others.

The FINLEY records consist of:

- A large Ancestral Record book containing charts for the for the FINLEY, MIDDLETON, GUYNES, HALL, CHIPLEY, KITCHENS, GODWIN, COOK, BERRY, and SMITH families.
- Two spiral-bound research notebooks containing historical information on the Scotch-Irish, the FINLEY name, and descendant information.
- One large loose-leaf notebook containing typed pages summarizing the information from the research notebooks.
- A photograph album containing some old photographs and more recent ones connected to Mrs. Smith's immediate family.
- A file folder containing copies of war records, pension applications, and other information for John Guynes FINLEY (20th Regiment of MS Infantry, CSA), William Calhoun GODWIN (13th Regiment of MS Infantry, CSA), and John Eldon GODWIN (World War II, Korea, Vietnam), and Edwin Burritt SMITH (Vietnam).
- A loose-leaf notebook containing various Bible records of the SMITH, WALLACE, and DAWSON families, descendant information from Aaron SMITH of Litchfield, CT to Mrs. Smith's husband, Elton Burritt SMITH of Bienville Parish, Louisiana, and a handwritten chart showing the structure of the royal houses of Scotland and England.

TOMBSTONE FACTS

A tombstone placed on a grave soon after the funeral may provide more reliable information than one place there many years later. Tombstone styles and materials have changed over the years and can provide clues about the time of placement.

Before 1830, most tombstones were slender, square slate or common fieldstone slabs with or without ornate carvings. Beginning about 1830, moderately sculptured stones of white marble and soft gray granite with cursive inscriptions were used. During the period 1860 through 1880, square towering marble stones were often elaborately shaped with ornate sculpture. Zinc monuments were used 1870 to 1900. Granite, now common, came into use about 1900.
