Miss Ima G\* Bugg, our own unique, lighthearted research associate, has agreed to try to answer our questions and give us some research clues. Dear Ima: Family legend has it that we are descended from an Indian Princess, daughter of a great chief. But, I am having a little trouble tracking down the details. What types of records are available to help me with my Indian research?

Dear Princess: So you have that legend in your family, too. Don't be disappointed if it doesn't prove out to be true, but it is fun to dream about. Meanwhile, check out the research aids provided on pages 156 through 162 of this issue of THE JOURNAL.



Dear Ima G: Over the past few years, I have seen family genealogies that trace ancestry to Adam and Eve. One publication referred to the "Hebrew Myth" and to Odin of the "Scandanavian Myth." Will you please explain what these terms mean?

Dear Seeking: You got me. Maybe some of you out there in "Reader-Land" can help us out with this one.



Dear Miss Bugg: Land records. Everybody tells me to look at the land records. What good will that do me?

Dear Miss Land: These records may tell you one or more of the following: name of wife, possibly her maiden name, names of sons-in-law, names of heirs, location of previous and next homes, description and location of the property along with the names of the adjoining landowners, economic circumstances (such as, they owned a great deal of land, or their land was sold to pay debts), and names of witnesses who might be relatives. Some records also contain transactions of personal property. Many land and deed records have been microfilmed and most have at least a buyer/seller (grantee/grantor) index. Although land records are sometimes slow to research, often you can locate information pertaining to birth, death, and marriage records. Land records are the oldest continuous set of records in our country, so don't overlook this valuable tool.

Dear Ima G\*: I get really excited when I find a query which seems to connect to my research, then to suffer disappointment when my letter comes back "Addressee Unknown, Return to Sender." People who do genealogy should never be allowed to move, right?

Dear Sender: Right on. But, we are a mobile society, and becoming more so, it seems. You might try writing a letter addressed to "Occupant" at the same address. In your letter, state why you are trying to locate the former occupant and how much you would appreciate his/her help. Give enough information to let him/her know you are a sincere researcher in honest pursuit of a relative. Be sure to include your SASE; you might also offer to take a collect call.



Dear Ima G. Bugg: Have you been reading the obituaries lately? You'd think most of these people were hatched from an egg in an unknown location, may or may not have married someone, and possibly had children, and maybe even grandchildren, nieces, nephews, etc. Didn't they ever hear of providing names, that is, full names, relationships, and places, not to mention a few other juicy details?

Dear Obit Reader: Yes, I understand your frustration. Since most obituaries are paid for by the family, some "family stuff" doesn't really seem all that important, seeing as how it costs more. However, we can make things a little easier for future genealogists by writing our own obituary and placing a copy with our will, a responsible person, or, if we've made advance arrangements, the funeral home. Having been in the situation of trying to write an obituary without having all the information I needed (and being upset, too), I believe that your survivors will bless you for this. A few things to include would be your maiden name, date and place of birth, names of parents (include your mother's maiden name) and siblings (including deceased siblings), where your parents came from, names of surviving relatives and whre they live, and a summary of where you have lived and worked and your religious and organizational affiliations. Of course, a picture would be nice, too.



Dear Miss Bugg: I seem to be finding discrepancies in the various census records - I thought the census takers were usually school teachers on summer holiday and were given specific instructions as how to take each census. What gives?

Dear I Thought: Quit thinking. That's the worst thing you can do when it comes to reading the census records. Just go with the flow; you'll learn a lot more in the long run. Just to give you an idea, the following was written by a census taker in Buffalo in 1865:

OCUPSYSHUN - CENCUS TAKER: "I am a cencus takers for the city of Bufflow. Out city has groan very fast in resent years & now in 1865, it has become a hard & time consuming job to count all the peephill. There are not many that con do this werk, as it is necessarie to have an ejucashun, wich a lot of pursons still do not have. Anuther atribeart needed for this job is god spelling, for meny of the pephill to be counted can hardle speek inglish, let alon spel there names!"



#### FLAGON AND TRENCHER

Those who can provide proof of direct descent from an ancestor who operated a tavern, inn, ordinary, or other type of hostelry in this country on or prior to July 4, 1776, may be eligible to join a hereditary society called Flagon and Trencher, a group that originated in 1962. The group's name refers to a flagon, or vessel with a handle, spout, and hinged lid that was used to serve liquors, and a trencher, a wooden plate or board that was used to cut food on. The establishments were initially called "ordinaries," but by the end of the 17th century, the term "tavern" was more commonly used in this country. # THE FORT JESUP INSTITUTE Sabine Parish, Louisiana

As extracted/abstracted from a publication shared by F.O.G. member, Earline Ellzey Carr.

Fort Jesup was a frontier military post before the war between Mexico and the United States and was headquarters for Gen. Zachary Taylor. Here, also, was Lt. U.S. Grant.

The institute seems to have had its inception and conception in a design of Sabine Lodge No. 75, F. and A.M., to secure better facilities for the education of their children, and those of the surrounding parishes than used to exist. A charter was obtained and commodious buildings constructed. There were seven grades in the high school department, a Normal course for those who expected to teach, and seven courses in the College department. There were also a Hypatian Society and a Columbian Society. Representatives of the lodge during the period 1891-94 were: J.W. TAYLOR, W.M.; T.J. FRANKLIN, S.W; C.W. COX, J.W.


