During this year's session (2004), the State Legislature passed a bill (Senate Bill 709) allowing the Parish Clerks of Court to record certain mortgage and conveyance records digitally rather than on paper. This bill became Act 679 and was signed by the governor.

Beginning January 1, 2005, the Clerks of Court will have the option of storing/recording mortgage and conveyance records, as long as they are not of a graphical nature (such as maps), via digital imaging or microfilm, and transferring the original documents to the State Archives. If the State Archives does not require the original record, the document can be returned to the filer. Furthermore, the Clerks of Court may destroy some of these types of records already in their possession or send them to the State Archives for storage, provided they have preserved them in an approved format and have received proper certification from the State Archivist. Under no circumstances, however, may any records dating prior to 1901 be destroyed.

In order to inform its members about the new law, Le Comite' des Archives de la Louisiane invited Carrie Fager, Records Management Officer at the Louisiana State Archives, to address the society at its annual meeting on September 26th (2204) Ms. Fager was a member of the study committee formed to draft the legislation and was well acquainted with the new law. She explained that some of the larger Clerks of Court had wanted the new legislation to address the increase in paper filings that have resulted, in part, from the growth in on-line mortgage companies. This new law gives them the option of recording these mortgages digitally or on microfilm rather than in paper form.

One archival organization expressed concern over the accessibility of these records. In its Fall/Winter 2004 Newsletter, the Louisiana Archives and Manuscripts Association took the position that these records are local and should be available locally. It should be noted, however, that the original records will only be transferred to the State Archives after they have been preserved by the Clerk of Court using an approved method. The need to consult the original record at the State Archives would become necessary only if the digital or microfilm copy at the local level failed in some way. Furthermore, LAMA does not take into account that none of the Parish Clerks of Court are open on weekends, whereas the Louisiana State Archives is open seven days a week. In this respect, these records will be even more accessible to the public than they are now.

Obituaries and Deaths from Northwest Louisiana Newspapers

1856/09/10 - Died on the 7th inst., Mr. Samuel Tallmadge, aged 74 years, a native of New York and for the last two years a resident of this place. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, September 10, 1856]

1856/09/10 - We are pained to learn that Colonel James B. Gilmer, late of Bossier Parish, died a few days since, on the island of Cuba of yellow fever. He went for years identified with this section of country and distinguished alike for his enterprise, energy and unbounded hospitality. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, September 10, 1856]

1856/09/10 - We regret to notice in the New Orleans papers the death of Captain D. D. Atkinson, an old Red River boatman. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, September 10, 1856]

1856/09/24 - Died on the 21st., Lillie, aged two years and one month, daughter of John and Sarah Walters. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, September 24, 1856]

1856/10/01 - Died on the 30th September, Harvey Elias, aged three years, five months and 12 days, son of G. W. W. and Martha Goodwyn. Friends of the family are invited to attend the funeral which will take place this morning at 10 o'clock from the family residence on Texas Street. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, October 1, 1856]

1856/10/08 - Died on the 3rd inst., Harriet Sims, aged 10 years and 7 months, daughter of T. P. and N. H. Hotchkiss. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, October 8, 1856]

1856/10/15 - Died on the 7th inst., infant son of James M. and Louisiana Coats. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, October 15, 1856]

1856/11/05 - We are pained to learn that Mr. Wm. G. Kerley, late Clerk of the District Court of this parish, died in Elkton, Kentucky on the 11th ult. He had been ill for some months and a few weeks since visited the west in hopes that the change of climate would restore him to health. His loss will be regretted by the whole community. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, November 5, 1856]

1856/11/12 - Died on the 11th inst., John, aged 11 months, son of Lawrence P. and Adelaide Crain. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, November 12, 1856]

1856/11/19 - Died at the residence of their father in Caddo Parish, on the 5th inst., Muggal, aged 4 years and 6 months, and on the 6th inst., James, aged 2 years and 6 months, sons of Hugh and Catherine Currie. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, November 19, 1856]

1856/11/26 - More Bloodshed: On Wednesday evening, a man named Riley was shot by Thomas Appleton, near the residence of Mr. John Cobert. Quarrel was carried on at the house of Cobert who was absent and his wife apprehending a difficulty went for an officer who she complains refused to accompany her and who might have saved the life of the man as he was not killed until after her return. Appleton fled to the bayou. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, November 26, 1856]

1856/12/03 - Died in New Orleans on the 15th ult., Adeline, aged 11 months and 6 days, daughter of Capt. H. T. and Pauline T. Summers, of Shreveport. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, December 3, 1856]

1856/12/17 - A lady named Mrs. Mary McCoy died in Palestine, Texas on the 21st ult., leaving three small children in a very destitute condition. She had formerly resided in Webberville in this state, from whence she came, that she had a husband living but who had recently killed a man near where they lived and had fled the country. She also stated that her father's name was Andrew R. or Reuben R. Craven and that he lives in Greenville, Green County, Arkansas and is in easy circumstances. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, December 17, 1856]

1856/12/17 - Sudden Death: A Mr. Anderson Robertson, aged about 60 years, of Pleasant Hill, DeSoto County, Mississippi (23 miles from Memphis) was seized with an apoplectic fit on Monday, while standing on the levee and died. He had been on a visit to his children in Texas, and was on his return home. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, December 17, 1856]

1856/12/24 - Explosion: The boilers of Mr. R. M. Gilmore's sawmill, 12 miles from town, exploded Saturday last, killing Mr. Saunders, formerly overseer for Mr. D. Gilmer. A negro man was so seriously hurt that he is not expected to recover and two or three other negroes were scalded. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, December 24, 1856]

1857/01/14 - More Bloodshed: Mr. Geo. W. Cashon, a native of Columbus, Georgia, who has been for some time employed as a stage driver between this place and Marshall, was shot in a house, near the old cemetery, on Saturday night and died of his wounds on Sunday evening. Coroner Bauman held an inquest over the remains of the deceased and the jury brought in a verdict that he came to his death by a bullet fired from a gun or pistol by some person unknown. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, January 14, 1857]

1857/01/23 - Died on the 22nd, Giles S. Taintor, aged about forty years, for many years an esteemed citizen of this place. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, January 23, 1857]

1857/02/25 - We are pained to learn by the latest advises from Cuba, that there are no hopes of Dr. Kane recovering his health. The report says he was still alive, dying very

hard, but could not live through the day. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, February 25, 1857]

1857/03/04 - The remains of Dr. Kane who died on the 16th ult., in Havana, arrived at New Orleans on the steamship Cahawba, en route to Philadelphia. (Other general information) [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, March 4, 1857]

1857/03/18 - A gloom was thrown over our community on Wednesday by the demise of Col. Sam'l Ford, one of our most worthy and esteemed citizens. He requires no eulogy for his memory is enshined in the hearts of our people. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, March 18, 1857]

1857/03/18 - A small colored boy belonging, we believe, to Mr. Cozart, was drowned in Silver Lake on Monday. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, March 18, 1857]

1857/03/18 - Died on the morning of the 15th inst., of consumption, Betty P. Hereford, aged about 32 years, consort of Capt. E. Perroncel, formerly of New Orleans. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, March 18, 1857]

1857/03/25 - Died in New Orleans on the 17th inst., Capt. Abraham (unable to read surname), age 77 years, of Washington, Arkansas. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, March 25, 1857]

1857/04/01 - More Bloodshed: We learn from the officers of the Lecomte that on Thursday last, Captain G. M. Branner (late of the steamboat Belle Gates) and Mr. Vercher, his overseer, were shot while riding in front of Mr. J. M. Brown's plantation, on Red River, about 20 miles from Compte. Mr. Vercher died in a few minutes. Captain Branner received two buck shots in the left eye and was very low when the boat passed, but the physicians entertained hopes of his recovery. We understand that a difficulty had occurred a few days previous between Captain Branner and Mr. Brown, during which the latter was shot by the former. The affair was to undergo legal investigation the day following and we presume the Natchitoches Chronicle will report the particulars. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, April 1, 1857]

1857/04/08 - Another Man Killed: A quarrel occurred on Sunday night, between Thomas Quirk and Dennis Stokes, two deck hands belonging to the steamer Joseph Holden, during which Quirk drew a pocket knife and stabbed Stokes, who died a few minutes later. Quirk has been committed to prison. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, April 8, 1857]

1857/04/08 - On Saturday, the jury in the case of the State vs Francis Marion Flynn, for killing S. Johnson, at Bethany, returned a verdict for murder in the first degree. Yesterday, Flynn's attorney moved for a new trail, on the pleas that Johnson died in Texas, & c. His Honor granted the new trail. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, April 8, 1857]

1857/04/22 - Died in Greenwood, on the 8th inst., Rachel, consort of Thomas D. Wilson, and daughter of Dr. A. Flournoy. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, April 22, 1857]

1857/04/22 - Died on the 20 inst., Robert J., aged about 17 years, only son of Dr. Lawrence. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, April 22, 1857]

1857/05/13 - Man Drowned: The body of a white man was found floating in the river, at this place on Sunday last. We understand that he was a deck hand on the Jos. Holden, but whether his death was accidental or not, we are unable to say. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, May 13, 1857]

1857/05/20 - Mrs. Sarah J., wife of John L. Effinger, died suddenly in Harrisburg, Virginia. One week before she died she lost a little son, who fell from a step and killed himself as the stage was passing the house. On Friday evening, Mr. E., who had been much distressed, heard the stage coming, and remarking that she was dying, expired in a few minutes. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, May 20, 1857]

1857/05/27 - Died at Ottawa, Illinois, on the evening of the 14th ult., Mrs. M. L. P. Cornell, aged 22 years, consort of Charles Cornell, late of Shreveport. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, May 27, 1857]

1857/06/10 - Died on the 3rd inst., at his residence, in Greenwood, Colonel J. G. Jones, aged about 50 years, an old residence of Caddo Parish. He was a native of North Carolina. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, June 10, 1857]

1857/06/17 - Died on the 14th inst., of consumption, Mr. H. Cozart, aged about 45 years, a merchant of this place. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, June 17, 1857]

1857/06/17 - Drowned: Mr. D. J. Dennie, clerk on the steamer Alida, was drowned on Saturday, by the capsizing of a yawl on the falls. The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, June 17, 1857]

1857/06/24 - Died at the family residence, 27 miles from Shreveport, on Wednesday morning last, 17th inst., Mrs. Eliza Mooring, aged 53 years, consort of Timothy Mooring, and one of the earliest settlers of Caddo Parish; leaving a numerous circle of fiends to sympathize with her bereaved husband and family in their irreparable loss. She was an exemplary member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and died as she had lived, in the affections of all who knew her, and in peace with God. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, June 24, 1857]

1857/06/24 - Died on the 19th inst., at a quarter past 11 o'clock, a.m., at the residence of her father, Caddo Parish, after a severe and protracted illness, Consuello Clementine, aged 4 years, 7 months and 25 days, daughter of E. M. and Sarah M. Coleman. [The South-Western, Shreveport, Louisiana, June 24, 1857]

Take the U.S. Highway 80, Ada-Taylor exit (#54) from I-20 and follow Highway 80 until you see the Taylor Baptist Church on the left-hand side, turn left and circle around to the back of the church, where te road divides. Take the Pine Grove Church Road, go approximately one and one-half miles; cemetery will be on the left. It is located in Section 7, Township 18 Range 8W (GPS 322357N-920749W). This survey was started at the Northwest corner of the main section. The survey was conducted on July 5 and 6, 2004. This survey began in the Third Quarter 2004 issue.

WWI Draft Registration Card Index Bossier Parish, LA

There were three draft registrations for World War I in which more than 24 million men born between September 13, 1873 and September 12, 1900 registered. Only a small percentage of those registering actually were inducted into service. Not all who served in our military branches participated in this registration, but the compilation of such a large number of male citizens and alien-born men is a useful source of information. This is a particularly good source for tracing African American men.

A typical WWI draft registration card possibly may include the registrant's full name and signature, home address, age, date of birth, citizenship status, occupation, employer's name and address, race, dependents or nearest relative, and physical description. Cards for registrants born between June 6, 1886 and August 24, 1897 may also include birthplace, previous military service, and marital status.

If you find a person you are interested in and want to obtain a copy of the full registration card, write to Friends of Genealogy, Inc., include a stamped, self-addressed envelope, and a donation to cover copying. This index includes B ossier registrants from all registrations and many are obviously not residents of Bossier Parish, but chose to register there. The series will continue until all who registered in Bossier Parish are listed.

Grandma's Apron

The principle use of Grandma's apron was to protect the dress underneath, but along with that, it served as a holder for removing hot pans from the oven; it was wonderful for drying children's tears; and on occasion was even used for cleaning out dirty ears. From the chicken-coop the apron was used for carrying eggs, fussy chicks, and sometimes half-hatched eggs to be finished in the warming oven. When company came those aprons were ideal hiding places for shy kids. And when the weather was cold, grandma wrapped it around her arms. Those big old aprons wiped many a perspiring brow, bent over the hot wood stove. Chips and kindling wood were brought into the kitchen in that apron. From the garden, it carried all sorts of vegetables. After the peas had been shelled, it carried out the hulls. In the fall the apron was used to bring in apples that had fallen from the trees. When unexpected company drove up the road, it was surprising how much furniture that old a pron could dust in a matter of second. When dinner was ready, Grandma walked out onto the porch, waved her apron, and the men knew it was time to come in from the fields to dinner. It will be a long time before someone invents something that will replace that "old-time apron" that served so many purposes.

The Shreveport Journal on Monday, September 3, 1945 listed all the casualties that could be gleaned from newspaper files during World War II. We are grateful to Elizabeth Lewis and her family for preserving this issue of the Shreveport Journal and sharing it with us. The introductory paragraphs state that servicemen and women who lived in rural portions of the parishes were not included. A lso, there were still some missing in action who had not been officially declared dead as of this listing. A good number of the listings included a photograph. Those for whom a photograph was included have an asterisk by their name.

Here are highlights from the opening paragraphs:

Little white crosses in many parts of the world and waves of the seven seas mark the last resting place of 309 Shreveport and Bossier City servicemen and women who paid the supreme sacrifice in four years of war that others might live in freedom.

Not all were killed in battle—some were killed in accidents and some died of illnesses-but all died in service of their country. One family, that of B. F. Kelly, Sr., 2920 Hardy Street, lost three sons. A fourth son, Sgt. Jack Richard Kelly, 31, served with the medical corps and survived.

Tom Jones Abington of 1447 Oakdale Street was the second man drawn locally in the national draft lottery and lost his life in France on July 29, 1944. Lt. Lal C. Blanchard, Jr., for whom the local AMVET post is names, was the first local serviceman killed in the D-Day invasion.

Capt. Lloyd DeMoss, hero of many missions over enemy territory in the Mediterranean and European theaters and holder of numerous medals, came through his many air battles without so much as a scratch, but lost his life while serving as an instructor at a California air force base.

Lloyd Baxter Jones, African-American mess attendant 2-C was the first Shreveport casualty of the war. Jones was killed in action in the Pacific in one of the first engagements there after Pearl Harbor.

CADDO PARISH CATTLE BRANDS

The registered cattle brands and cattle marks for residents of Caddo Parish are found in a ledger book in the Deed Room of the Caddo Parish Courthouse. As you enter the Deed Room they are against the wall on the left side. Joe Slattery of the Shreve Memorial Genealogy Department transcribed the registered marks from the inception of the parish up to 1880. There are more, so if your relative began raising cattle after 1880, then by all means check out this source. Some entries only provide the name and the date, but most include a reproduction of the mark, which is included in this listing.

The McWhiney Family of Gloster, LA By Danielle Neal and Nan McWhiney

Patriarch of the McWhiney Family of Gloster, LA was Thomas Elijah McWhiney. He ran a general store there for many years, was U.S. Postmaster, and had 4 children with his first wife, 8 children with his second wife.

Thomas E. McWhiney was born in Avoyelles Parish 12 November 1861 to Leander McWhiney and Melissa A. Laningham. The first census I have been able to find him in is the 1900 Census where he is a widower with four children, living in Gloster, LA. His childhood remains a mystery.

His parents were married in Catahoula Parish, LA on 9 November 1855. The microfilm of these marriage records is so poor as to be almost illegible, and I count it as one of those supremely serendipitous moments that I was able to find this record. In the 1860 census L. McWhiney and Melissa are part of the P. Hanes household of Catahoula Parish, page 14. Leander McWhiney is enumerated as a carpenter with \$200 of personal property, born in Pennsylvania in 1825. Thereafter I can find no trace of either of them until Melissa A. Perry appears as a member of Thomas E. McWhiney's family in 1907 in DeSoto Parish.

Once settled in DeSoto Parish, an abundance of records exists on Thomas E. McWhiney. First is his marriage to Emma Lucy Allen on 14 Jan 1886 by the Rev. Napoleon J. Roulleaux of St. Vincent's Chapel, Shreveport, LA. The marriage was performed in Gloster with dispensation due to the impediment of disparity of faith. Thomas E. McWhiney was not a member of the Roman Catholic Church at that time.

Emma Lucy Allen was the daughter of Lizzie (?) and step-daughter of Joseph Lacobee. I have not been able to find the marriage between widow Lizzie Allen and Joseph Lacobee. I do find a marriage for Joseph Lacoubiche (original spelling of Lacobee) and Marie Joseph Laffitte on 30 June 1838 in Natchitoches Parish, LA. The 1860 census listing for Joseph Lacoubiche in DeSoto Parish, page 96 is thus:

It is my belief that the enumerator erroneously recorded the fifth child as a female and that this child is Houston (or Ursin) Lacobee who is living next door to Joseph Lacobee in the 1870 DeSoto Parish census, page 413:

Thus we may conclude that Joseph Lacobee's first wife, Marie Joseph Laffitte, died about 1857 and that by 1863 he had married the widow Lizzie Allen who had two children by her first marriage and subsequently had a third child, Mattie O. Lacobee.

To quickly wrap up the Lacobees, I have found no further records on the first four children of Joseph Lacobee and Marie Joseph Laffitte. Houston (or Ursin) Lacobee married Amelia Rambin and in addition to the above four children had Emma Lucy Lacobee b. 6 January 1882 and Elizabeth Tranquilla Lacobee b. 26 Dec 1883.

I find the following marriages of record in DeSoto Parish, LA:

Estelle Lacobee (daughter of Houston Lacobee) to John V. Flores 26 Dec 1889 by L. H. Bell, J. P.

Emma Lucy Allen was born 1862, married in 1886 and had died by 1900. I have not been able to locate her gravesite, and the Sacramental Register of St. Vincent's Chapel has no record of her burial.

Baptismal records for these children from St. Vincent's Chapel are as follows:

Marie Ada McWhiney was born 6 September 1887, baptized 7 February 1888. Godfather was E. O'Toole, godmother was Mattie Hoell (half-sister of Emma Lucy Allen). Marie Ada was confirmed 16 May 1900.

Gertrude Emma McWhiney was born 24 January 1890 and baptized 20 April 1890. Godfather was W. R. Benoist, godmother was M. L. Prudhomme.

Henry Grady McWhiney was born 12 July 1892 and baptized 24 August 1892. Godfather was Louis Lacobee and godmother was Sr. Marie de la Crain.

Thomasina Lucile McWhiney was born 1 January 1895 and baptized 3 April 1895. Godfather was John Allen (maternal uncle), godmother was Mattie Hoell (half-sister of Emma Lucy Allen).

Thomas Elijah McWhiney was baptized 6 January 1900 by the Rev. N. J. Roulleaux and he was confirmed into the church on 6 May 1900. The Sacramental Register of St. Vincent's Chapel gives his middle name as *Elijah*; his death certificate lists his middle name as *Elisha*. When he married Elizabeth Tranquilla Lacobee 18 December 1900 he was a member in good standing of the church and the marriage was without dispensation.

Thomas E. McWhiney's connection to the Lacobee Family was close. His first wife was the step-daughter of Joseph Lacobee and his second wife was the granddaughter of Joseph Lacobee.

Elizabeth Tranquilla Lacobee was born 26 December 1883 to Houston (Ursin) Lacobee and Amelia Rambin. She was baptized 8 April 1884. Godfather was William Walpole, godmother was Elise Lafitte.

Marie Ada McWhiney married Jack Crawford 1 September 1904 in Caddo Parish and it appears that Gertrude Emma may also have been married by 1907, but I have found no marriage record for her. Ada and Jack Crawford were residents of Gloster at the time of Thomas E. McWhiney's death in 1945.

Henry Grady McWhiney married Mayme Holland in Caddo Parish on 23 December 1922. In the 1930 Shreveport City Directory he is residing at 2402 Woodford Street and working as a salesman at the Standard Oil Co. Station #907. By 1936 Henry G. McWhiney and Henry P. Farmer were operating a service station on the corner of Jordan and Fairfield Avenue. Henry G. McWhiney died 1 February 1956 and his succession is of record in Caddo Parish. He was survived by one son, Henry Grady McWhiney, Jr. who has made quite a name for himself in the area of Texas history and has authored several books, among them is *Cracker Culture: Celtic Ways in the Old South* and several books dealing with the Civil War.

Lucille Thomasina McWhiney married H. O. Kelly on 29 April 1916 and they operated a grocery store at the corner of Midway and Fairy Streets. Their sons operated Kelly's Auto Parts for many years on Greenwood Road.

Thomas E. McWhiney and his second wife, Elizabeth Tranquilla Lacobee, had eight children:

Clyde Boverd McWhiney, born 1902, made his home in Pineville, LA.

Viviane Cecilia McWhiney, born October 1903. Viviane was a school teacher; she married E. E. Norvelle, and had one daughter.

Hoyle Thomas McWhiney, born 4 April 1904. He married Jennie Ruth Rambin. They made their home in Gloster until 1950 when they sold all their property and livestock and moved to Shreveport and he had a sign painting business at the corner of Claiborne Avenue and Mansfield Road. Hoyle and Jennie Ruth had 13 children.

Genevieve McWhiney, born 12 April 1907. She married C. B. Temple, they made their home in Shreveport, and had three children.

Carl (or Charles) H. McWhiney, born 20 February 1910. Carl worked at the Kickapoo No. 3 near the Caddo-DeSoto Parish line on Highway 171. By 1941 he had married Lula Smith and was working as a collector for the Federal Credit Clothiers. In 1942 he was working for the LA

Ordnance Plant near Minden. In 1943 he was a guard at the Silas Mason Co. and in 1945 he was a machinist as J. B. Beaird Co. Carl and Lula had seven children.

Martin Newman McWhiney, born 22 November 1912. He married Sybil Rachel 22 July 1946 in Bossier City, LA. By 1945 he had moved to Shreveport with his parents and they lived at 2410 Drexel Street. At that time Newman worked as a guard at Silas Mason Co. Later he was a taxi cab driver.

Murry David McWhiney, born 17 August 1914. He married Violet Lorraine Sabin on 22 December 1935. He was a fireman with the Shreveport Fire Department and was survived by two children, Murry D. McWhiney, Jr. and Sally McWhiney. Murry D. McWhiney, Jr. as well as his son, Mark D. McWhiney, followed in the Shreveport Fire Department and thus the McWhineys were the first 3-generation family serving with the department.

Elizabeth Tranquilla McWhiney, was born 4 August 1919. On coming to Shreveport as a young lady, she worked as a stenographer for the Hicks Co. and lived with Murry and Violet McWhiney. She married L. L. Hamilton who worked for Sears. Elizabeth and L. L. moved to Baton Rouge where she worked as a stenographer at the State Capitol for many years. Elizabeth and L. L. had seven children.

When he died in 1945 at age 83, Thomas E. McWhiney had seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, but his grandchild count had hardly begun. Elizabeth Tranquilla Lacobee lived to 1957. Both she and Thomas E. are buried in St. Anne's Cemetery at Stonewall, LA.

Working on the McWhiney Family has been an on-going project of mine for several years. This research was unusual in that census records were of no help further back than 1900. When I obtained Thomas E. McWhiney's death certificate it stated his father was "Mr. McWhiney" who was born in Scotland. The mother's name was given as Miss Latham. I spent a good bit of time researching Lathams to no avail.

When I did realize I could get a death certificate on Melissa A. Perry who died in Thomas E. McWhiney's household in 1915, I finally got information that was verifiable. Her death certificate stated her father was T. L. Lanningham; her mother, Eliza Boyd. Melissa's date of birth was 17 July 1839 and place of birth was given as Limestone Co., AL. Indeed, T. L. Lanningham is found in the 1840 census in Limestone Co., AL. From there the Lanninghams moved to Catahoula Parish about 1845, and after the Civil War they relocated in Rapides Parish, LA. T. L. Lanningham states consistently he was born in VA and there is an early VanLaningham Family found in Northumberland Co., VA. As the family spread throughout the United States, some branches kept the *Van* prefix and some discarded it.

To date I have been unable to uncover any record to indicate Leander McWhiney was in the Civil War and died at Vicksburg, although that is thought to have been the case. Also to date I have been unable to find the marriage record where the widow Melissa A. McWhiney married Mr. Perry. Her residency between 1860 and 1907 is still unknown.
