WORKSHOP ON RESEARCH IN TENNESSEE

To be Conducted by Mrs. Hermione Embry

The Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association will hold its annual workshop in the banquet room of Holiday Inn, I-20 and Hamilton Road, Bossier City, Louisiana, from 9:00 am to 4:45 pm, 8 August 1970. Registration will be from 8:00 am to 9:00 am, at which time an outstanding authority on Tennessee Research will be presented.

MRS. HERMIONE EMBRY (Mrs. Charles A. Embry, Sr.) needs no introduction to many of you, and certainly not, if you ever visited the Library at the Tennessee State Archives prior to her retirement as Geneslogical Research Librarian in 1969. Mrs. Embry is famous for her charm, wit, skill, and graciousness to all who came to know her in the course of their research at the Tennessee State Library. She is particularly and especially qualified to conduct a Workshop on Research in Tennessee, as evidenced by this brief biographical sketch.

Mrs. Hermione (Dunlap) Embry was born in Demopolis, Marengo County, Alabama, the daughter of Robert Lee Dunlap and Caroline Amable (Taylor) Dunlap. She attended Winston Salem Academy 1915-17, St. Mary's School 1919-20, Converse College 1920-23, University of Alabama 1923-25, American University 1955, and hold a Master's Degree in Geneslogical Research. On 21 October 1925, she married Charles Akin Embry, (Criminal lawyer, deceased 10 October 1947) and her children are Charles Akin, Jr., and Hermione Caroline.

Mrs. Embry served as Genealogical Reference Librarian, Tennessee State Library and Archives, 1945-1969; Teacher of Genealogical Research at Columbia Community College 1967-69; and is author and compiler of books and articles for professional journals in the field of genealogy. She is a member of the following organizations: Daughters of the American Revolution, Daughters of the American Colonists, N.S.D. 1812. Colonial Dames of America, National Society of Southern Dames of America, A.L.A. Tennessee, Nashville Librarians Association and Alpha Gamma Delta Soriety, and has held various offices in most of these societies.

There is such a great need for information on Research in Tennessee for genealogists in this area that we want all of you to have an opportunity to learn about
it from a real expert. Registration forms, a map showing location of Holiday Inn

BOOK REVIEW 3

QUAKERS IN THE SOUTH CAROLINA BACKCOUNTRY - WATEREE AND BUSH RIVER, by Willard Heiss, published by Indiana Quaker Records Committee. The first part of this book is devoted to a district above and below Camden, known as "The Waterees", which was settled by a small colony of seven Quaker families as early as 1733. Land records, letters and affidavits give a fairly clear picture of this small colony. Strain, Alexander, McGowan, McCutchin, Harris and Seawright were the names that appear in the first records of this area. Later, in the 1740's, Irish names began to appear in the records. Several excellent diagrams showing the landowners in and around Camden are included.

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COMMANDERS AT KINGS MOUNTAIN, by Rev. J. D. Bailey, DeCamp Publishers, Gafney, S. Box 123, Cowpens, South Carolina, 29330, for only \$6.50 per copy, postpaid.

This hardback book of 431 pages contains biographical data and details of the activities of the Commanders at the Battle of Kings Mountain, and much background information is included on each of the following: General William Campbell; Colonels Issac Shelby, Benjamin Cleveland, Frederick Hambright, Edward Lacey, James Williams, John Sevier; Majors Joseph McDowell and Joseph Winston; and Colonel Patrick Ferguson, the British Commander. This book is a very easy to read and interesting supplement to other books dealing with the Battle of Kings Mountain, and is particularly desirable for libraries with Genealogy or Historical departments. ---- Reviewed from privately owned copy by Mrs. Ema Lee Tipton.

REVIEW

January 10, 1970: Milton Almond, Bossier City Police Dept., gave a lecture and demonstration on the use of an instanatic camera with special closeup attachment that could be used in genealogical research. Black & white, 3½x5" closeups of original Bible records, old letters, medals and portraits were shown. These were taken with a 35 mm Cannon camera, without flash or special lighting and were very clear and legible.

February 4, 1970: Mrs. Fern Ainsworth discussed research in Washington, D.C. and some highlights of her recent research trip there. Members discussed and offered suggestions on several important matters and authorized the Board of Directors to secure a speaker and meeting place for the Annual Workshop.

March 14, 1970: Mrs. Willie Farley gave a very informative demonstrated lecture on the use of county maps and land records in genealogical research. Copies of Articles of Incorporation (Charter & By-Laws) were given to all members present, and after discussion were approved for adoption, with the Board being authorized to complete all necessary details for incorporation. As a result we have some very lively and interesting sessions, all of which are tape recorded, except one program, last fall.

SKELETON IN THE CLOSET Ema Lee Tipton

Few of us can collect records on four or five generations of ancestors and the collateral lines without finding a creaky-jointed skeleton in some old forgotten family closet. Our first reaction is to cram him into the corner and pile a lot of paper and junk on him, or pretend he isn't there and hope he will creep silently away and disappear. It is impossible to hide a skeleton and none ever crept silently to anywhere - they always rattle. You may just as well look him straight in the eye, shake hands with him and seat him at the family table with as much gracious hospitality as you can muster, because you dug him up, and there he is, and you are stuck with him, for better or worse, from now on.

He was your very own relative, so he couldn't be too bad — or could he? Whatever his mistake, it was made long ago and standards of right and wrong were much stricter then than now, especially in some less conservative circles — but you are an ultra-conservative — so what? If he were convicted of some crime, it only means he probably didn't have a good lawyer, or was framed? or was the victim of a prejudiced court? or a member of some minority group, such as a Quaker in a Methodist community? or Mormon in a Baptist neighborhood? Can't you find any reasonable excuse or alibi? Why don't you try? No matter what he may have done, under today's laws he could have appealed his conviction until he was acquitted. We have no right trying to be judge and jury of any of our ancestors. They lived in a different time, with different laws, and different standards of behaviour and honor. Justice was swift. Too bad if they hung the wrong man and too late to undo it.

If you can't think of some way to minimize your skeleton's mistake, then try to combine the right words in the right way to make him seem more acceptable. You are writing a family history, not a fairy tale or scandal sheet. You must be scrupulously honest but you don't have to be a blabber-mouth. I love the story of the lady who was compiling her family history and had a relative who had been electrocited for some crime. Unwilling to omit him, she wrote: "Of this man little is known except that for a short time he occupied an important chair of applied electricity at the State capitol." Her ingenuous use of words and strict adherence to fact came from a deep and fierce family pride. We would all do well to follow her example in dealing with such situations, so that we could proudly introduce our own skeletons without the slightest reluctance or queezy embarrassment.

Our ancestors were not perfect — at least, not many of them, and certainly not many of mine. If mine had been, I'd have an awful inferiority complex wondering what happened to me. My ancestors were just plain middle class southerners - maybe not so plain, but definitely middle class. A few were farmers, but most of them were not too fond of hard physical labor and became merchants, teachers, real estate dealers, or followed other less strenuous professions. As far back as the l6th century there have been artists, writers, non-conformists and off-beat types in my family, some quite unconventional, to say the least, but with such charm their transgressions seemed unimportant and were usually forgiven. If I were extremely narrow minded, I might consider them skeletons in my closets, but when these skeletons rattle their bones, I hear the sound of laughter, and joy, and wit, and love, and kindness and human understanding, and who can be ashamed of these things?

You should see my skeletons! I've taken each one down, dusted him off, given him a full pardon for whatever mistake he made, and stuck a halo on his head. Some of the haloes seem tilted at rather rakish angles, but they shine just as brightly as those set straight and square. I can tell you something fine and wonderful about each one of them. They were not perfect, but they were prefectly charming, perfectly human, and each in his own way, perfectly marvelous, and they are my favorite relatives. I'm very proud of them and feel much closer kin to them than to those who were stern, strict, straight-laced, tight-lipped, and so pious and sanctimonious they couldn't possibly be real. So far, I haven't found many that fit in this last group - and most of them were in-laws.

EDITOR'S NOTE:

Prior to 1752, the Ecclesiastical, Civil or Legal Year began on March 25, but from 1066, the Historical Year began on January 1. To make things just as confusing as possible, it was the custom to use both years after a date, and to call the old style "OLD STYLE" (before 1752) and the new style "NEW STYLE" (after 1066), Buch as February 15th 1725 O.S.-1726 N.S., or simply February 15th 1725-26; and to write March 24, 1725, followed by the next day, March 25, 1726. Obviously, these old Abingdon records are dated in Old Style with no explanations. Don't risk a mental collapse by trying to understand this - just accept it: Before 1752, March 25 could be, and usually was, the first day of the New Year. After 1752, January 1 was accepted universally as the first day of the New Year. From habit, some clerks may have continued to use the old style for a while, just as I still date things as 1969, when I'm rushed or interrupted.

Mrs. Frank J. Slimer, Jr.

This ISAAC LEE was the son of WILLIAM LEE, Captain in the Revolutionary War, who was born 1745 in Ireland, died 1803 in Pendleton District, South Carolina. ISAAC LEE was born 1776 in North Carolina, married ELIZABETH PREWIT of Tennessee, and is buried in the old Robertson Cemetery in Northport, Alabama. The inscription on his tombstone is:

"In memory of Isaac Lee, who was born in the State of North Carolina about the year 1776 and died June 26, 1856. He was a man of the strictest integrity of character and by his general upright course won the esteem of all who knew him. He was in the army with General Jackson in the Indian War and participated in the Battle of Horse Shoe. In peace he is gathered to his Father's. --- This stone erected by his surviving widow." From Mrs. Slimer's records. The following records from the old ISSAC LEE family Bible, now in joint possession of Mrs. Frnak J. Slimer, Jr., 216 Topeka St., Shreveport, La., and her aunt, Mrs. E. H. Historical and genealogical research in Arkansas will benefit greatly if the Arkansas Extension Homemakers Council succeeds in carrying out its plans for compiling information found on markers in all cometeries in the state. The council will work through its county affiliates.

A committee in each county will take the responsibility for making as full a record as possible of all known graves. Members of the county councils will copy the inscriptions on tombstones in the cometeries in and near their home communities. It is a practical plan for a big undertaking.

Although the task will be interesting to any volunteer worker who wants to know more about the history of the home county and state, the job will not be easy in the many rural graveyards which have been abandoned. Throughout Arkansas there are small cemeteris taken ever by forest growth since the sharp decline in rural population started with cotton acreage quotas and mechanized farming. In numerous instances nobody was left to care for graves after families moved off and congregations were too small to maintain old churches. Even the roads to certain abandoned cemeteries have been made impassable by the growth of thickets.

Regrettable as it is, the maintenance of many of these abandoned burial places would be impractical where there no longer is a possibility of rejuvenating a community. But at least the fullest possible record of these cemeteries should be prepared and kept where it would be convenient for public use.

County offices and the Arkansas State History Commission receive large numbers of inquiries from persons searching for genealogical data. Often during the summertime tourists stop at chamber of commerce offices to ask about the location of cemeteries in which ancestors are buried. If each county has on file a fairly complete report of the information compiled by the local homemakers group and a master record is placed at the State History Commission and Archives, the local agencies and the state commission will be able to give greater and faster assistance to persons desiring information about families.

A state-wide project of this type for Louisiana would prove equally useful. It is to be hoped that a rural organization with units in all parishes will undertake it.

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The Ark-La-Tex Geneslogical Association is deeply interested in any effort to save records from all old cemeteries, not only in Louisiana, but all other states as well. We urge individuals and other groups to join and support this movement, whether it is the project of a church or civic group, State agency, or a group of housewives in a rural community. These old cemeteries, our ancestors and this nation all began with many separate individuals from many economic and social levels. Let's get together and salvage what we can of all the old cemetery records. Old cemeteries of the Ark-La-Tex will be discussed at our next meeting, April 11. See Preview Section for details. Again, let's get together on this urgent matter.
