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REVIEW AND PREVIEW

<u>11 July 1970</u>: The Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association met in Shreve Memorial Library. Dr. Thomas V. Holmes, Jr. gave a very interesting report on The Institute of Genealogy held at Samford University June 22-26, which he and Mr. E. M. Tipton attended. Mrs. Alyese T. Menasco explained plans of the Shreveport Beautification Bureau to restore the old Oakland Cemetery in Shreveport. This project is of special interest to all genealogists throughout the Ark-La-Tex area.

8 August 1970: Our Fourth Annual Workshop was attended by 75 genealogists of this area and each received a copy of the Special Edition of The Genie, with those holding lucky numbers winning valuable door prizes donated by members of the Association. Mrs. Charles Embry, Sr. began her lecture with a history of early Tennessee and migrations, followed by the history of various areas and counties, and records available at the Tennessee State Archives. She presented the Association with a large and valuable collection of books published by the Tennessee State Archives and Library. This is an extremely important addition to the Tennessee records of Shreve Memorial Library and will be helpful to many genealogists of this area.

12 September 1970: This meeting was primarily a business meeting. Mr. Billy Randolph reported on progress of the cemetery committee and set dates for copying tombstone inscriptions at Oakland Cemetery. The committee has made considerable progress on this work during the past month. Publication of Caddo Parish Cemetery Records was discussed and members voted to make this the main project of the Association for the coming year, to complete it as soon as possible.

10 October 1970: Members will report on summer research trips and any new sources of information they have found, with a summary of records and facilities available in the areas they visited.

14 November 1970: Plans for this meeting are not complete.

<u>12 December 1970</u>: The last meeting for this year and present officers, with election of officers for the next two years to be held at this meeting. Members should begin thinking about whom they want to fill the various offices and in what capacity each of you can serve. Officers can only lead and direct the activities of the Association, and success will depend greatly upon the efforts of every member to assist in carrying out the many details of work. Several new committees are needed and an editorial staff for <u>The Genie</u> must be established since it has outgrown the capacity of any one individual to handle it alone.....This is urgent.

NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS: All material for the January issue of The Genie must be submitted by <u>November 25</u>, and a great deal is needed. Special emphasis should be placed on Ark-La-Tex data. We need complete listings from old cemeteries outside Caddo Parish, Indexes to early marriage records, estate settlements, wills and other data, Bible records, Pedigree charts of members not published in the Special Edition, and articles of general interest to genealogists, as well as comments and suggestions from all our readers, and QUERIES and QUERIES. Let us hear from you as soon as possible.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION: Greene County Alabama was formed in 1819. On May 20, 1868, the courthouse at Eutaw burned, with all records, papers, etc. of the Circuit Clerk being lost. However, records of the Sheriff, Register in Chancery and County Treasurer were saved, and PROBATE RECORDS are intact. There has been much confusion over records of Greene County which may be available, but we found Estate Files complete, indexed and in excellent condition, Marriage records, Deeds, and other Probate records, in good order, all going back to 1819. The Probate Office is well organized and the efficient, courteous staff is glad to assist anyone who needs their records.

BOOK REVIEWS

SKETCHES OF VIRGINIA, HISTORICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL by WILLIAM HENRY FOOTE

This is a history of the Presbyterians in Virginia from 1688 through the late 1700's. A brief background of the religeous, political and financial situation of the Scotch-Irish in Ulster helps explain the mass immigration to the United States. The Presbyterians, made up largely of the Scotch-Irish, settled in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, where they built their homes, churches and schools. Good descriptions of early ministers are given. The biographical sketches include Makenie, Robinson, Carey Allen, Samuel Davies, James Waddell, John Blair Smith, William Graham, Drury Lacy, Mary Moore, Legrande, Marshall, Lyle and Hoge. Through the history of the growth of the faith, one can follow the migration west into Kentucky. The section on Kentucky's circuit preachers includes James Moore's narrative of his captivity by the Shawnees. Many names are given. In fact, the index is 48 pages long.

MISSISSIPPI VALLEY MEDICAL BLUE BOOK, 1903.

This book lists the doctors in each town in Alabama, Arkansas, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee and Wisconsin. In most instances, the name of the doctor's medical school and limited information about his practice is given. In some instances, a list of the organizations that the doctor belonged to is given.

SOUTH CAROLINA SILVERSMITH, 1690-1860, by E. MILBY BURTON

Three hundred twenty biographical entries make this book a good "clue" book for the genealogical searcher in South Carolina. There are over 800 personal names indexed, since the biographies include names of wives, children and business partners. A few pictures are included.

FIRST MARRIAGE RECORDS, 1838-50, BARBOUR COUNTY, ALABAMA by HELEN FOLEY

Mrs. Foley gives the Volume and page number of the original marriage books. This book is indexed and very easy to use.

MARRIAGE RECORDS, 1850, BARBOUR COUNTY, ALABAMA by HELEN FOLEY

This book is also indexed.

ALABAMA SERIES, VOLUME II and VOLUME III, by HELEN FOLEY

Volume II is a listing of death notices appearing in newspapers in Barbour Co., Henry Co. and Pike County, Alabama newspapers for the years 1846 through 1890.

Volume III is an abstract of social notes and news items from these same newspapers. Many of them are informative, others would give good clues for family relationships and where they moved. For example, "Orbie Flournoy left Eufaula after the war for Texas and a year or two later moved to Louisiana. He is back in Barbour County now."

These four small books are a gold mine of information on Barbour County Alabama. Mrs. Foley has done a good job of abstracting.

NOTE FROM THE EDITOR: THE HISTORY OF GREENSBORO (Hale Co. Alabama) has been reprinted and we hope to obtain a copy for the library soon. Good books on early Alabama records are very scarce. If you know of any that may be available, let us hear from you. This applies to other southern states, also. 3

Texas courthouse burned in 1875 with all records lost, but after the timber boom started, all titles to lands had to be cleared and old abstracts show family connections and heirships. Many affadavits are in the deed records. Marriage records begin in 1875, in loose files 1875 to 1880, and Mrs. Toole has copied all marriage records up to 1900. Probate records are complete from 1875 with only one book missing. Death records begin 1930. Daughters of the Republic of Texas in Sabine County Texas are gathering early Bible records and other records from every other available reliable source. Hemphill is about 100 miles from Shreveport and genealogists of that area frequently do research in Shreve Memorial Library. Mrs. Toole stated that she had received a copy of our Special Edition and is interested in what the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Assoc. is doing, and wants to become a member of our group.

From Letter: NATIONAL ARCHIVES AND RECORDS SERVICE 30 July 1970 "Closing of Revolutionary War Pension Application Files for Microfilming"

As of January 2, 1969, work began on arranging Revolutionary War pension and bounty land warrant application files for microfilming. This project is expected to extend over a period of about four years, if there are no unforeseen complications.

To permit arrangement and microfilming it is necessary to close segments of pension files. All reference service will be discontinued on closed segments until microfilming of records is completed and a copy of the microfilm is available for use. Letters <u>Co</u> through <u>Mz</u> are presently closed. Negative microfilm copies of these will be available in approximately six months.

Some segments will be closed up to six months, although as the project continues we may be able to reduce this period slightly. The minimum period is expected to be at least 90 days. During this closed period none of the files from that segment will be available to a researcher nor will copies of any document in a file be made.

Two microfilm publications will result: (1) The complete contents of each file, and (2) Documents selected from each file as being the most significant from the genealogist's point of view. The latter publication will be available for purchase as a fraction of the cost of the former. From the shorter publication we also plan to make available paper print-outs of a quality similar to that of the electrostatic copies we now offer for \$1 per file (ordered on GSA Form 6751, formerly NAR-288).

The Pension files are being microfilmed as a part of our contribution to the upcoming bicentennial celebration of the Revolutionary War, as a means of making the records more readily available to researchers, and as a means of preserving an historically valuable group of documents from possible loss and from deterioration that constant use brings.

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Ema Lee Tipton

"Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, --" Luke 6:38

This ancient truth should be heeded by every genealogist, professional and ametuer alike. If you think that you have invested too much time, work and money in collecting your family records to share them with anyone else, then think again. You are like the man who hid the one talent he received for fear of losing it instead of investing it for an increase, then had it taken from him; or the man who hid his light under a bushel rather than let it guide some stranger on the road, then stumbled in the dark and broke his own neck. I may not be quoting this exactly right, but that's how I remember it.

You've read and heard many experts urge you to share your records with others and they have stated it far better than I could ever do, but it needs repeating over and over again. Many of you already know the value of sharing records, and those who do not know or believe in it will probably be very bored with what I have to say, but I must say it - the only way I know - from my own experiences.

If you hide your family records away in some dark secret place, you are cheating yourself. If you refuse to take time to help someone else get started with their research or to share what you have learned with others, you will lose far more time than you could ever hope to gain. If I tried that with my records, I'm almost sure all my ancestors would rise up out of the file cabinets, give me a tongue lashing I'd never forget, then take up residence with some of my happy-go-lucky relatives who never think of doing one bit of research, but wait with eager hands outstretched for every scrap of information I find as soon as I find it. Don't you have relatives like that? I thought everyone did.

I'm no sweet sentimental Pollyanna or sanctimonious self-sacrificing Do-Gooder. In fact, I'm just naturally as arrogant, prejudiced, cantankerous and selfish as can be, but I do know what is worth having and doing, and being stingy with my family records would destroy me. The research would not be worth doing and would become only dull drudgery instead of the real pleasure it now is. If I had gained nothing except hundreds of newly found relatives and friends in many places within the past few years, I would be more than overpaid for the little time I have given to sharing information with others.

However, I have never given one minute of time or one brief bit of information to anyone without it coming back to me multiplied many times over - not always from the one I tried to help, but in some way, from some source. I've done ten times more research on collateral lines of our families than on our own direct lines, but as a result have received far more than I ever gave, or could have ever hoped to find alone, on the very people I was most interested in. I don't think this is pure blind luck. The fact that I've been able to locate so many old records and have a husband who supports me in everything I try to do - even does much of the actual research himself - does not entitle me to keep all this information to myself, for myself alone.

Beginning my research in the prescribed manner, I wrote to every relative I could locate for any information they could send me. Many letters were unanswered. Some sent back short sarcastic comments but no information. Some wrote, "How nice of you to do this. Let me know when you dig up a rich famous ancestor for us." Only a few bothered to send any information at all, but one or two were eager to help. These first few months of trying to learn something about my families by correspondence were filled with bitter disappointment and I was about ready to take up fruit jar collecting when things began to improve.

The trouble was that I had been interested only in what I wanted, offered nothing in return, and didn't even know what I was doing wrong. This experience has affected my entire approach to research. I do little research by correspondence, but traipse off to distant courthouses and archives to collect the records rather than ask someone else to do it for me. I've had little success publishing or answering inquiries in magazines, seldom initiate correspondence any more, and have almost worn out a \$1 bill sending it back to the National Archives for records I never receive. As an inquirer, I'm almost a total failure, but answering requests for information usually turns out fine.

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It doesn't take long for correspondence on any family, no matter how brief, to get passed around. Someone will tell someone else, they will tell another, and then somehow, somewhere, it may be picked up by a contact who can furnish old records that you would find nowhere else in all the world. There is an invisible, but very effective grapevine communications system in genealogical circles. Drop a small pebble into a pond and watch the ripples grow and spread. That's how it is with helping others and sharing your family records. However, I'm not at all sure it will work if you do it only for what you expect to get from it. I suspect that you have to be sincerely interested in what the other person needs, even more than in what you want, and truly feel this in your heart to have it be successful.

We had barely scratched the surface on the Tipton family when we received a letter about them from a lady in southeast Mississippi. On our next trip to Baton Rouge, we drove over to see her, taking our pitiful thin little folder of data with us. A few weeks later a large collection of information arrived from southwest Texas, then another from California, later 31 zeroxed pages from Kansas, and soon after,2500 typed pages of priceless records sent from Montana by a man whose father had done research on this family for over forty years. All we did was answer a few letters and share the meager bit we had with others - so meager we were ashamed of our ignorance. We expected nothing in return except perhaps a few suggestions on how to begin our search. This may seem unusual, but it is true.

On our first trip to Alabama, I called a lady whom I thought may help me with my family, but she insisted we couldn't be related because we didn't spell our names the same. This was my first research trip. I didn't even know my great-grandfather's first name, could barely get inside the doors of a library or courthouse, and felt lost. Rebuffs and disappointments were hard to take, so I just sat down and wept in anger and frustration, vowing I'd never bother with that stupid family again as long as I lived. Six months later, happily engrossed with the Tiptons, I received a letter from a lady in Texas, saying that her cousin in Alabama now thought we may be related after all and they wanted to know more abour the family. I answered the letter, still determined not to get involved with that bunch of screw-balls who couldn't spell their own name. After several more letters from this lady, filled with a confusion of names, dates and places, I began to worry about how badly she had things mixed up, and because she was so eager to get her family records in order, I found myself, against my will, wanting to help her any way I could, although I knew it would be just one big stupid mistake, or worse.

Getting involved with this family is the happiest "mistake" I ever made. They are most charming, friendly, gracious, helpful and numerous, scattered all over the south and southwest, delighted to have a part in compiling the family history. Records have poured in from everywhere, most of them amazingly accurate, some go back almost 200 years. About all I have to do is the technical research, check them out, and fill in missing details. Again, all because I took time to share the little I knew with others, and wasn't too eager to do that.

Don't go about your research like an old mule with blinders on, braying loudly, "This is mine, and I don't have time." Answer every inquiry you receive, even if only to say, "Sorry, I don't know." I'm provoked when someone writes for all the data we have on one of our surnames, sends no identifying clues, and doesn't even

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enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope. I may be slow to reply but eventually get around to it. Some of the most unlikely, unpromising, seemingly unrelated inquirers have turned out to have records that I need badly. Sometimes the ones I take the most time to help don't even write back to say "Thank you." Sometimes they write back suggesting I'm as nutty as a pecan orchard and don't know what I'm talking about. Sometimes what they send fits nothing that I have, then a year or two later, everything falls into place. Sometimes nothing happens, but sometimes bells ring from Virginia to California, then being so far behind I'm still using last year's calendar seems very worthwhile after all.

It is very easy to become too busy, too involved, too absorbed in our own problems for our own good. This realization hit home with a bang recently and made me take a long hard look at the narrow-minded short-sightedness that had crept up on me while I had my nose glued to a grindstone, blinded by its dust.

Last summer a young lady wrote that her husband did not spell his name the same as mine, his family did not claim kin with those of different spellings in their area, that they knew nothing past his grandfather, but she wanted to collect the family records for her children and would appreciate any help I could give her. Reference to this troublesome name spelling was the wrong approach. I sputtered for a week, then sent her several pages of suggestions, clues and instructions, plus a few records and some standard record forms, thinking, "That is that! A pure waste of time! She is so prejudiced she will never see the forest for the trees, although she lives in the middle of the big woods!" It was I who was prejudiced, but I couldn't see that then.

A month later I received a batch of closely typed pages from her, glanced over the first page of recent data, assumed the rest was the same, put the material in the envelope to read when I had more time, and forgot it. Recently, the envelope turned up and was put in the "Miscellaneous" drawer when I decided to take a fast look - and almost fell out of my chair! It contained four generations of a family I was searching desparately to find, down to the last infant only a few months old, births, deaths, marriages, individual family groups and all! I hastened to send the writer four more generations of her husband's family, so ashamed of myself I didn't even try to explain the year's delay.

To be guilty of such carelessness and neglect is unforgiveable. I was relieved to learn what I had done had not discouraged her forever from continuing her interest in genealogy. This is probably the greatest risk we run in not helping those who write to us for information. Those of us who have the priviledge of collecting great masses of information also have the responsibility of sharing it with others who need it. This often involves a great deal of work, but if you can't swim, you had better stay out of deep water, and in the field of genealogy, you are very rarely able to "touch bottom." Family records, no matter whose, are important to me, and I believe with all my heart that sharing information is the most important part of any research on any family.

If you are hoarding your family records, hoping to make a lot of money by publishing them, quit dreaming. By all means, publish your records, even if only a few typed copies fastened in file folders, but not for profit. You may break even on the cost of compiling and printing them, but you won't get rich by it. Compiling family records should be a way of living, not a way to make a living. Don't keep your records hidden away. Share them with those who need them, any way you can, by publication or free copies, bits and pieces, or complete sets of records. This takes time - time most of us don't have, but can find if we try. It may mean turning off the TV, staying up a little later at night, and organizing our work a little better, but it will be worth all we put into it - not only to ourselves and those directly concerned, but to the whole great overall purpose of genealogical research. Many of the priceless records in great archives throughout the world were collected and placed there by individuals just like us - dedicated people who were willing to share their records with others.

A granddaughter says Elijah was the son of Jonathan Clark, and was born in Allentown, Jew Jersey, educated in Dublin, Ireland, and of Roman Catholic faith. Elijah Clark m. 1841 in Natchitoches Ph. La. to Sophia (Sheets) Flemming, widow of Charles Bartlett Fleming. Five children of this marriage are listed below. Elijah Clark lived in Caddo Parish in 1860 and died in Shreveport, La. ca 1861-62, but place of burial is unknown. He is said to have been a clerk on a merchant ship for many years, lived for a while in New Orleans, and had a commission business in Shreveport, La. and Jefferson, Texas after 1856.

Sophia Sheets, b. in Georgia, m. (1) Charles Bartlett Fleming and first three children born in Alabama. Moved to Natchitoches Ph. La 1835-38, where Charles died 1839. Sophia m.
