PREVIEW OF PROGRAMS

12 May 1973: Jonesboro, Texas by Col. Henry Lee Sommerville, USAF, Ret., of Clarksville, Texas, author of over 70 short stories and recently published full length novel "Charge of The Model T'S", based on actual battle on Texas-Mexico border in 1917. He received BA from Sam Houston College and Masters at Texas A&M where he taught Air Force ROTC. A student of Northeast Texas History for many yrs, one of his favorite subjects is Jonesboro, a Red River crossing as early as 1816 with a population of over 2350, a school and several business houses by 1834. This was on the wagon train route from Tennessee to southwest travelled by such famous Texans as Sam Houston, David Crockett, et al. Although Jonesboro was on the Texas side of Red River in 1820, it served as county seat of Miller County Arkansas as well as Red River County Texas at the same time, but by 1840 was a ghost town and few people today realize it ever existed. This lecture will be of special interest to all Texas History buffs and to those whose ancestors settled in this area or traveled this old trail to the Southwest.

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9 June 1973: Heraldic Design by Ray K. Cadle, 2nd Air Force Staff Arts and Crafts Director. A member of the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association, Ray Cadle is one of the best known exponents of the finger painting media in the United States. He studied at Dayton Art Institute and later under several Japanese Masters, becoming the first American to be admitted as a member of the Japanese Honga Association. Mr. Cadle's work has been shown at numerous art galleries in the U.S. and in 1964, two of his paintings were displayed at the International House Gallery in Tokyo. An active member of several Art Groups, he will be listed in Who's Who in American Art in 1973. Heraldic Design is a program designed to inspire more interest in the areas that once held our ANCESTORS OF GENTLE BIRTH. Shreveport and Barksdale Air Force Base is most fortunate to have an artist of such international fame in our area.

14 July 1973: Library Research by our own Margery Wright, Genealogy Division, Shreve Memorial Library. This is a program of instruction designed to better acquaint our members with the many new materials received during the past year, how to use these sources, etc. Shreve Memorial Library in Shreveport, Louisiana has one of the finest genealogical libraries in the country. Many of our members are not taking full advantage of these facilities, nor do many of us know how to go about using much of this valuable research material. Be on hand for this informative program concerning our library, and how to use its facilities. Shreve Memorial Library is our official home - make it your research headquarters.

SHREVE MEMORIAL LIBRARY'S COLLECTION OF MICROFILM  
OF ALL LOUISIANA PARISH CLERK OF COURT RECORDS  
IN PARISHES FORMED BEFORE 1900 TO BE COMPLETED SOON

In 1961, the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association entered into an agreement with the Genealogical Society of the Latter Day Saints of Jesus Christ whereby the Ark-La-Tex would secure permission from Clerks of Court in all Louisiana Parishes for the LDS to Microfilm their records. For this assistance Ark-La-Tex would receive free donor copies of all microfilm from all parishes to be deposited in the Genealogy Department of Shreve Memorial Library.

Microfilming was completed in 35 parishes and 3,196 rolls of microfilm were received by the Ark-La-Tex Association and presented to Shreve Library. Then, in 1970, changes in policy, personnel, rising costs, and other factors resulted in cancellation of the agreement to the effect that we would not receive free donor copies of the microfilm from the remaining parishes formed before 1900.

After lengthy negotiation, a new agreement has been reached so that the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association will be able to purchase the microfilm from all remaining parishes at a special price. When this is completed, Shreve Memorial Library will be the only public Library in Louisiana to have the entire collection of all Louisiana Parish Clerk of Court Records prior to 1900 which were microfilmed by the LDS Genealogical Society.

This totals approximately 4,400 rolls, plus film from three parishes not yet microfilmed, valued at \$8 to \$10 per roll, or about \$40,000.00. Its total value to all genealogists, historians, patriotic Societies, attorneys, students, lease departments of oil companies, others needing such data, and to Parish Clerk of Court is beyond estimate.

Clerk of Court offices do not have time or personnel to do your research for you or to locate the records you need. To order copies of original courthouse records in most parishes or counties, the document must be identified by Book, page and entry number, title or name and date. Many searchers can not travel from courthouse to courthouse to find this information. With the microfilm available in Shreveport Library, we can locate the records and order certified or photo copies by mail from the Parish Clerk of Court without difficulty or delay. We are requesting a price list of certified and photo copies from all Parish Clerks of Court for publication in the July GENIE to make it easier for all of you to obtain such material. This will also enable these Clerks of Court to serve you better.

We are deeply grateful to the Genealogical Society of the Latter Day Saints of Jesus Christ for the donor copies already received and for their generosity in making it possible for us to purchase the rest of this microfilm. They have done an outstanding job in helping to preserve these old records, and have cooperated in every way possible to enable us to complete the collection for Shreve Memorial Library.

Our only problem now is to raise the necessary funds to purchase the film. All our members, other organizations, groups and individuals interested in genealogy, history, libraries, cultural and educational resources in the Ark-La-Tex Area are urged to contribute to this project at once. DARK-NEAL CEMETERY - HENDERSON HILL

4 Miles from town of Boyce - Rapides Parish, Louisiana, near site of old Cotile post office; established ca 1816 by Francis Henderson.

This cemetery remained in open range for cattle for over a hundred years. Some of the family plots were fenced. Was marked and fenced in the 1960's - now well kept by citizens of the community.

Perhaps the most picturesque and romantic burial ground in the state is the Plaisance Grave Yard near Deloache's Bluff on the Rapides side of Red River about six miles below Colfax, situated on top of a high hill about five hundred yards from the river. Here are fractional parts of a single Creole family, the clime Citizens of two generations ago.

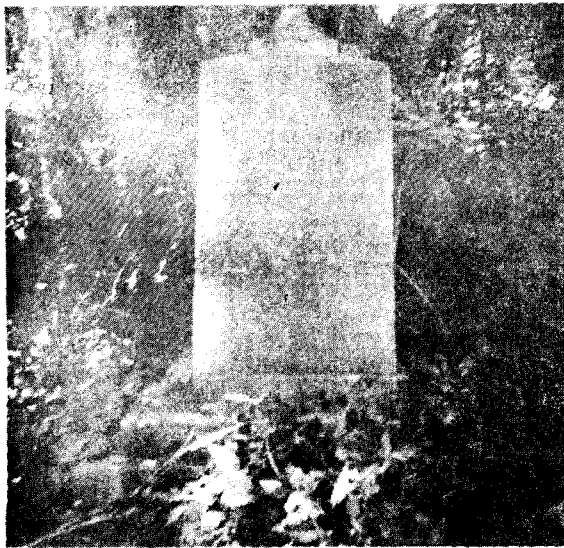
On tablets of monuments of various plats we find names of Villians, Grants, Layssards, Lacours, Rhorners, Hickman, Bush and others.

Note: I went into this at high noon, with help to get these pictures - this casket had been out for two years, but in a few days it was removed by someone - A. G. P.

For the benefit of searchers, as to newspapers and others, I make these notes: the now Deloache's Bluff was first written as Gillard's Bluff - the now Red Bayou was Bayou Varang. The Plaisance Mansion was across Red River on the Colfax side - this was built by Layssard family, bought and moved by Swafford family.

All this situated on old road between Plaisance and Cotile post office in 1800's.

About a mile around this hill across the road leading in, is what - I was told - the Carnahan Cemetery - here Carnahan, Ballio and Deloache graves, far back in the woods from a mass of broken monuments, is a colored Cemetery.

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The Dolet Hills area of southeastern DeSoto Parish, La. acquired its name from Pierre Dolet who had a large land grant there. After the Louisiana Purchase, all land not covered by approved claims was offered for sale by the U. S. Land office but sales were limited until about 1844, when settlers from Alabama and other southern states began moving into this area. Within ten years a close-knit community was established at Grove Hill with a cemetery and two churches. It is said that services were held only once or twice each month at each church, so Methodists attended Baptist services, Baptists attended Methodist services, and everyone attended the funerals in the cemetery.

Children of these families married into other families and many descendants now living in northwest Louisiana are kin or kin-to-kin of almost all of them. About 1930, some of these descendants began holding annual reunions in the old Baptist Church building on the first Sunday in May and established a cemetery fund to care for the old cemetery. This year the Reunion will be held 6 May 1973, with special church services about 10:30 a.m., followed by a big picnic lunch under the trees in front of the cemetery.

These Reunions have created much interest in the Grove Hill Community and limited records have been published by newspapers and The DeSoto Plume, quarterly of the DeSoto Parish Historical Society. In April 1972, The Genie published 18 pages of records, bound the material in a separate brochure for distribution at the Reunion, and appealed for additional information.

Mr. Will Henry Robinson of Mansfield immediately set out to find records of the old Baptist Church and located the old Minute Book of the Church Conference plus other important data. Mrs. Willie Mae Wilson Weaver of Shreveport, La. compiled all available records into one book and published it at her own expense, bound so that later information can be added. The book was completed in April 1973.

Mrs. Weaver's interest in the Grove Hill Community is deeply personal and she has made every attempt to make these records as complete as possible. She compiled the material published in 1972 and donated the new gate posts with a commemorative plaque and a wrought iron arch showing the name of the cemetery. All profits from the sale of this book will go to the Microfilm fund of the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association to purchase microfilm for Shreve Memorial Library,

The book contains Deed to Grove Hill Baptist Church 1859, Charter members 1859, a list of Pastors and members 1869-1911, and minutes of the Baptist Church Conference 1869-1911. CSA records and letters to their wives from Samuel A. Medlock 1862, and Stephen D. Lord 1864, are also included. The Methodist records include Deed to Church property, list of pastors 1863-1905 and member 1863-1915. The Cemetery records have been revised and include much genealogical information. This is such an important addition to published records of DeSoto Parish, we hope libraries and descendants of these families will obtain copies before the 200 copies printed has been exhausted. Col. John G. Richardson, son of Francis and Martha Richardson, was born in Sumpter County, S. C., Feb. 28, 1785. In 1809 he married Margaret Dubose, daughter of Daniel and Mary Dubose, of the same state. In 1810 he emigrated to Mississippi Territory, and settled in Wilkinson County. He had scarcely established himself in a home in his adopted country, when war with the Indians and with Great Britain called him to share in its hardships and dangers. He commanded a volunteer troop of horse, and acquitted himself in such a

manner that he was chosen, successively, major and colonel in the regiment in which he served. After a union of eighteen years, he and his wife were parted by the death of the latter. She had borne him eight children, all of whom, except one infant daughter, survived her. He was afterwards twice married, his second wife living but four months. His third wife was survived by him four or five years. Before his death, and within a short time of that event, two sons, a daughter and a son-in-law, in quick succession followed each other to the grave. Penelope died between 1819 when her last child was born and 1822 when John married Stacy Whittington. John and Stacy were members of New Providence Church, Amite Co., until their deaths. James Jenkins came to Miss. with John. Were they brothers?

1. EMILY CATHERINE JENKINS and her husband John Griffin, are listed as members of New Providence Church in Amite Co., Miss. until 1849. She is named in John's will in 1844. Need record.
2. MARTHA ANN JENKINS lived in Amite Co., Miss. She is named in John's will and in 1850 Census is a member of Stacy Jenkins household. No record of husband. Did she marry a second time? Records needed on this family.

The 1870 census of Bossier Parish, Town of Belleview lists Napoleon Cooper and the age is the same as that of James N. Cooper. It lists wife age 26 and two children: William b 1868 in La.; James b Jan 1870 in La. We believe he remarried after the death of Eliza Gardner, my great Grandmother and had these two children. We knew nothing of them until we read this census.

Martha Salina, is my paternal grandmother and was a most charming well-edu- cated person. From some personal possessions of hers, we thought she attended Mansfield Female Academy.

The Oak Hill referred to is, we believe, their plantation located near Lewisville Ark.

I am in search for more information on my paternal grandparents. I have been unable to trace them past Alabama or to learn the names of the parents of either James N. Cooper or Eliza Gardner.

THE ANCESTORS, DESCENDANTS AND RELATIONS OF CARLTON SABIN AND HIS WIVES INCLUDING CONTEMPORARY COUSINS AND IN-LAWS - published by Sabin Crocker of St. Petersburg, Fla. This book is not for sale but is a gift to the Shreve Memorial Library. The Author's intent was to publish this work for the members of his own family and copies to Genealogical Libraries. We are indeed grateful to Mr. Crocker for a copy of his work. For his manner in arranging Pedigree Charts and Family Group Sheets are a masterpiece in clarity and comprehension. It includes allied families of Bakeman, Blanchard, Bennett, Birdsell, Bishop, Bristol, Collins, Crocker, Davis, Emery, Eastman, Forbes, Hascall, McCoy, Mott, Pine, Roe, Sabin, Schlosser, Winslow, Wood and others. His address is Carlton Towers, Apt 401, St. Petersburg.

INDEX TO CLAY COUNTY, MISSOURI ORIGINAL LAND GRANTS 1819-1875, by Katherine Gentry Bushman, indexed by Vera and William E. Eldridge. This is an 8½ x 11" Soft Back, Price \$4.95. Order from William E. Eldridge, 832 Hillside, Liberty Missouri 64068. The book is divided into Townships, Range and Sec.

LINKS WITH THE PAST, compiled by Ethel Evans Albert is a hard back 5½ x 8½" and is priced at \$15.00. The author says that according to historians the name Albert came from Germany to America in the year 1620 and settled in New Amsterdam. The name Albert is also recorded on several passenger lists of ships from London. The author includes some very interesting letters from one member of the family to the other. This book contains 497 pages and can be ordered from the author at 2217 Cypress St., Kingsport, Tennessee.

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN CRAWFORD, 1643 by C. B. Lampkin, Jr. Box 1022 University Alabama, 35486. This is a very large family and the author limits himself to John Crawford, who was born in 1600 and came from Ayreshire Scotland to Jamestown Va. in 1643. He was killed in Bacon's Rebellion. One son came with him from Scotland, David Crawford. He must have been a very adventurous young man. The Boston Transcript of May 5, 1924, said that he drifted down the Ohio River to a point now included in the State of Illinois. The author quotes Lord Lindsey as saying "Be grateful, then for your descent from religious as well as noble ancestors; it is your duty to be so and this is the only worthy tribute you can now pay to their ashes." This book can be ordered from the above address. No price is given.

TALES OF THE AMARUGIA HIGHLANDS of Cass County, Missouri, by Donald Lewis Osborn, 322 Willow Way, Lee's Summit Missouri 64063 and sells for \$4.00. It is a small book, 5½ x 8½", soft back and contains a wealth of information about this section of Missouri. Some are facts, some legends, traditions and just plain yarns. There are Cemetery Records included. There are some Wilson and Shipley family histories included. The name alone is provocative and the author goes into detail to the many variations and stories of its origin. Former President Truman's brother lived in this area at one time.

VIRGINIA LAND PATENTS OF THE COUNTIES OF NORFOLK, PRINCESS ANNE & WARWICK, from Patent Books "0" & "6" - 1666 to 1679. Transcribed and edited by Alice Granberry Walter. The author of this book (written 1898) was well acquainted with Abraham Lincoln and Peter Cartwright from the time of their coming to the State up to the time of their respective deaths, and also having had the privilege and the opportunity of learning much about the early life and adventures of Andrew Jackson. He wrote a number of articles that were published in the Fulton Democrat at Lewistown, Illinois. These articles now appear here substantially as they were copied from those papers.

ANDREW FORD DESCENDANTS - Part I-Compiled by Elizabeth Cobb Stewart. This genealogy relates the history of Abdrew Ford of Weymouth Mass. ca 1620-1693 and traces his male descendants through six generations. He married about 1646 Ellinor (Ellyn) Lovell, b in England 1628, dau of Robert and Elizabeth Lovell. This is a summary of a mass of material on the Ford Family. The author is mainly a compiler and arranger (sometimes a researcher) of the numerous records of unknown benefactors whose respect for history caused them to gather and reserve the records used in composing this book. The index lists 32 pages of names. DURST and DARST Families of America, By Sanford Charles Gladden. This book is a wealth of information on the Durst or Darst families, as well as the 40 related families. It begins with Abraham Durst, b ca 1745--earliest records in Pennsylvania, and brings many of the families to the present generation. Each family with their generations and allied families, census records, land records, etc are delt with separately: The Virginia Families; other Dursts in Shenandoah County Virginia; Delaware and Pickaway counties of Ohio; Texas families; St. Louis, Missouri; South Carolina families. Allied family lines: Beck, Cecil, Chandler, Charton, Cozad, Craig, Damon, Davis, Deam, Dill, Eaton, Ewing, Fry, Glendy, Glotfelter, Grigsby, Guy, Harshman, Haynes, Holman, Huston, Jamison, Keithly, Kennedy, Lighter, Marshall, Miller, Morgan, Orman, Page, Perrine, Ramsey, Salling, Smith, Stroop, Thompson, Weiser.

THE FRENCH BROAD-HOLSTON COUNTRY, A History of Knox County, Tennessee. This book is the product of the Knox County History Committee, whose individual members prepared the chapters on the subjects with which they were especially fitted. It presents a colorful story of Knox County's beginning---it's founders and early settlers and it's subsequent development through later generations, who built on this beginning. It places local events in their relation to state and national history. Knox County was the seat of the territorial government and Knoxville the actual birth-spot of the state, and it's capital for the first fifteen years of statehood. Twenty-four pages of illustrations (maps and pictures) and 141 pages of biographies of Pioneer and civic leaders give this book a personal touch. The first chapter is an account of the Indians who occupied this land from the beginning and leads to Indian Wars and finally their removal to Indian Reservations. The index continues for 30 pages with too many names to mention.



THE CHRONICLE OF A SOUTHERN FAMILY: By William Hobart Sebastian, hardback 142 pages. This family appears to have descended from Stephen Sebastian, who came to Maryland around 1675. Perhaps the most eminent member of the Sebastian family, in colonial Virginia was Benjamin Sebastian, born ca 1706 in Stafford county and died at his plantation "Montpelier" in 1770. He married Priscilla Elkins in 1729. The Sebastian families, in the 1750's, migrated to North Carolina, then to Kentucky, Tennessee, Arkansas and Illinois. Contents of the book include several family pictures, the Sebastian Coat of Arms and the meaning and origin of the surname. In Southwest England, Bastian, Bastin and Bastion, etc. would seem to be derived from Bastion and Sebastian. It appears from the records that the earliest Sebastian immigrants to the English Colonies in North America came from the British Isles.

VESTRY BOOK OF ELIZABETH PARISH 1749 - 1761: Edited by Alice Granberry Walter, Paper back, 43 pages and indexed. The editor has attempted to transcribe exactly the entire contents of the Vestry Book. The two loose pages of births and deaths, which are still existing in the original copy are not included in the photostatic copies which were made of the book some years ago. They are indeed a lucky find and have been included in this book. Births from 1755 - 1761 and a list of births and deaths of the southern branch 1727 - 1728.

GENEALOGY AND LETTERS OF THE STRUDWICK, ASHE, YOUNG and ALLIED FAMILIES: was compiled by Betsy Lawson Willis and Colonel James Webb Strudwick. It is paperbacked, 8½ x 11½" with a table of contents, a foreword and index. This is primarily a book of letters of the above mentioned families. However, as the authors state in the Foreword "In order that readers might better understand the letters of the Strudwick family, I will attempt to give some background to the people and events of the letters here and in notes throughout the book". The first letter is from Samuel Strudwick of North Carolina 13 Oct 1779. It is not clear to whom it was written, but probably to someone in England, because the following letters are to several people who handled his property there. Then, as his family grew, and moved about, the letters go out to them in Slabams, Mississippi, Virginia etc. At the top of each letter and to the right is the name of the person receiving the letter. At the end of each, the authors have identified every person mentioned in the body of the letter. This book also includes cemetery inscriptions, obituaries and speeches made by several members of the family.

DIARY OF ALLEN FRANKLIN SCRUGGS: Fascinating even to the casual reader is this Journal kept by Allen F. Scruggs, a traveling Methodist Preacher. Married four times, Mr. Scruggs lived in Mississippi, Kentucky, Tennessee Missouri, Illinois and Alabama. His life spanned 98 years, and this diary was started when he was in the thirty's. He comments on slavery, the division in the Methodist Church over the issue, the Mexican War and the annexation of Texas, as well as national politics of the era. It contains family charts and Bible records, and is indexed.

Van ZANDT COUNTY, RECORDS, TEXAS - MARRIAGE RECORDS 1855-1884: Transcribed and compiled by Exa Thomas, first edition published 1966. This book contains a map of the county and a list of the early Ministers who are recorded as performing marriages. It contains a list of the grooms and brides and date of marriage. All arranged in alphabetical order. A very valuable book for anyone doing research in this county. No price or address given.

"THE ROYAL HOUSES OF EUROPE", compiled by R. G. Hill, Westbury, Wilts England, and may be obtained from Omnicraft Enterprises Ltd. Box 86261, North Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. This is a very beautiful book. The compiler has traced the lineage of the Royal Houses of Battenburg; Belgium; Bourbon-Parma; Bulgaria; Brunswick; Denmark; Germany; Greece; House of Hanover; Roumania; Saxony; Sweden and the House of Windsor. He also shows the connection between each house, whether by marriage/birth.

The remarkable thing is that these pictures were collected from Northern Artists. They are pen & Ink sketches and you will find some of them from every area of the State.

ANCESTOR HUNTING, By Mildred deWeir Smith Watkins, and was contributed by CLAITORS'S BOOK STORE, Box 239, Baton Rouge, La. Price \$15.00. This book is a collection of the "Ancestor Hunting" columns that appear in The Shreveport Journal every Tuesday afternoon and is well indexed. This book covers the first 6 years of the column.

CADDO:1,000, is a History of Shreveport, By Viola Carruth, was contributed by THE SHREVEPORT MAGAZINE, 529 Crockett St., Shreveport, La. and may be ordered from The Shreveport Magazine. Price \$7.95. Mailed it is \$8.45. One of the more remarkable characteristics of the work is the skillful way Mrs. Carruth has bridged the episodes in Shreveport's development and related them to the state and national events. It develops the beginning from the Caddo Indians to our present time and is now in the public schools and college libraries in Louisiana, Arkansas and Texas. A local book that should be of interest to anyone in the northwestern part of Louisiana.

KNOW YOUR ANCESTORS, By Ethel W. Williams was contributed by CHARLES E. TUTTLE CO., INC., Rutland, Vermont. Price \$5.50 and may be ordered from the publishers. This is a book of interest to casual reader and genealogist alike, whether amateur or professional. It is used as a text book by Mrs. Williams in classes for Family History in Kalamazoo Community School for Adults and is based on the lectures given in the first class of 1958-59. She describes the scientific methods of tracing ancestry and compiling family history. She also points out the pitfalls one may encounter and also a chapter on Do's & Dont's. This book is a must for beginners who have just started their research.

COLONIAL FAMILIES OF THE SOUTHERN STATES, By Stella P. Hardy and was contributed by the GENEALOGICAL PUBLISHING CO., 521 St. Paul Place, Baltimore Maryland. The price is \$15.00. This book is intended for a book of reference and has an index of over 10,000 names. The author has dealt only with the families of those Colonial forefathers were established before the forming of the thirteen colonies. The author states that this work will not be complete with the publication of this volume, but that he intends to publish other volumes. He hopes to be a depository of records and information, ancient or modern, touching any family of our Southern States.
