To fill the breach, a committee has been formed to assume the responsibility of continuing The Genie. Mr. Pete Nance has agreed to act as coordinating chairman of the publication committee. Three ladies - Mrs. Willette Adley, Mrs. Martha Dunlop, and Mrs. Barbara Smith - have volunteered to be responsible for accumulation and preparation of material to be used in The Genie. These ladies will need all the assistance that the rest of us can give them.

Our annual Workshop on August 11th was quite a success. Mrs. Mary Warren had a wealth of pertinent information on Georgia and the Carolinas and her program was well received by all those present. We enjoyed not only her genealogical material but also, equally as much, the warm friendship of this fine speaker and her daughter, Eve.

On September 15th the annual Symposium of the Society of American Archivists was held at Centenary College, Shreveport, La. Having been invited to participate in this conference, a great number of our members availed themselves of the opportunity to hear a succession of nationally recognized speakers who presented a variety of material relative to archival data - sources, by whom used, use to genealogists, etc., and the use of oral history in local history. It was a very informative program.

SHREVE MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The organizational meeting of Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association was held in the Genealogy Room of Shreve Memorial Library in 1955. This has always been our headquarters and as authorized by library officials, is so stated in our charter.

We are very proud of our home and give it our whole-hearted support. Since 1960, this Association has contributed, or caused to be contributed approximately \$40,000.00 in books, microfilm, materials, cash and equipment to the Genealogy Department. Many other groups such as patriotic and lineage societies, D.A.R., U.D.C., Colonial Dames, etc., civic organizations and individuals have also contributed greatly to the holdings of this department as well as other sections of the library. Under the direction of Mrs. Juanita Rembert, Head of the Library, this has become the top-rated genealogical-historical research library in the entire State of Louisiana.

Anything affecting this library is of great concern to all of us and the recent announcement that it may be moved into the old Post Office Building is cause for dismay, alarm, and protest. The same arguments used to have this old building declared obsolete can be used to oppose its conversion into a home for Shreve Memorial Library.

1. The old Post Office Building is so deteriorated that minimal repair and maintenance would be too difficult and expensive to justify.
2. Design and construction make remodeling for continued use by federal agencies almost impossible.
3. Its location in the center of the downtown business district, with no way to provide adequate parking facilities, creates serious traffic problems and interferes with business activities in the area.

These were some of the arguments used to obtain a new Federal Building for Shreveport in a more suitable location. They also show clearly that this old building is totally unsuited for use as a library.

In addition to these arguments, we want to point out that library buildings must be specifically designed and constructed to meet many special requirements. Some of the basic and most essential requirements are:

1. Fireproof construction throughout with special humidity control, cooling, heating and ventilation systems.
2. Soundproofing and special acoustical features to provide the quiet necessary for study and research.
3. Vaults and storage space for valuable irreplaceable books, documents and microfilm.
4. Workrooms for receiving, cataloging, distribution and maintenance of library holdings.
5. Separate, well arranged reading rooms for different types of materials and different interest groups.
6. Special wiring and space allocation for microfilm readers, copy machines, movie and slide projectors, and other electrical equipment, with ample provision for additions in each department or division.
7. Street level entrances for patrons who are handicapped by heart disease, emphysema, lameness or other ailments. Please note: Many handicapped citizens of Shreveport and Caddo Parish must rely upon library materials for their major activity and interest. They can never enter a raised building with high entrance steps, such as the present Library and Post Office buildings have.

8. Adequate, adjacent safe parking facilities must be provided. Handicapped patrons are unable to walk or propel wheelchairs several blocks and many women are reluctant to walk down certain city streets, even during business hours.

The several hundred thousand dollars that may be spent in an effort to convert the old Post Office Building into a makeshift, unsatisfactory, temporary home for Shreve Memorial Library could better be applied toward the cost of permanent well designed new building. Libraries are high on the criteria for use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds so this new building should present no serious financial problems at this time.

No more fitting plans could be included for the Bi-Centennial Celebration with its American Heritage theme than to provide a suitable home for the priceless collection of historical records and other holdings of Shreve Memorial Library, which is recognized by everyone who knows as the finest and most extensive in the State of Louisiana.

Libraries are highly cultural institutions. The ideal location for a fine new library building would be near the Civic Theatre and Barnwell Building, to make this an even greater cultural center for the City of Shreveport. This area is easily accessible to the downtown area and for patrons throughout Shreveport and Caddo Parish, as well as visitors who come here to carry on research.

A library would be far more appropriate here as evidence of our cultural interests than a sports arena, public swimming pool, picnic grounds, boat dock or some other noisy, cluttered, hard to control and maintain recreational facility. If Shreveport is to remain "A City on the Grow", it must also show some proof that it is "City in the Know" -- interested in development of the mental capacities of its citizens as well as the development of their biceps.

We respectfully request that the Library Board of Directors, officials of the City of Shreveport, and of Caddo Parish give careful consideration to the need for a new library building which will stand as a symbol of their wisdom and service to this community for many generations to come.

REPORT ON MICROFILM PROJECT

Microfilm copies of Clerk of Court records from six Louisiana Parishes have been ordered from the Genealogical Society of Salt Lake City, as follows: Assumption, Iberia, Plaquemines, Point Coupee, St. Landry and St. Mary. When this film is received, it will be checked, labeled and deposited in the Genealogical Department of Shreve Memorial Library.

This will complete the records from 52 parishes. Records from the remaining seven parishes will be ordered as soon as it becomes available. Microfilm from 38 parishes (3,287 rolls) was obtained as donor copies through an agreement between the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association and The Genealogical Society of the Latter Day Saints of Jesus Christ. Funds to purchase film from the remaining parishes are being raised by the joint efforts of this Association, many Lineage and Civic organizations, and individual patrons of Shreve Library. HENDERSON LODGE No 99 F. & A. M.
COTILE, LOUISIANA

Location of this lodge is back of the Dark-Neal Cemetery at the crest of the hill, where some of the Cedar trees and the old caved in cistern still show signs. This was a two story building on Henderson land.

Henderson Lodge No 99 was organized in 1848, and was carried on until 1851 by Dispensation of the Grand Lodge of Louisiana, the reason we do not have a list of Charter Members.

MRS. ANNIE GARLAND PARKER

If this Association presented awards of merit to its members, our Mrs. Annie Garland Parker would be the top winner. She has been a major contributor of material for publication in The Genie and is directly responsible for 13 new members in 1973. More important, Mrs. Parker is a perfect example of what the ideal genealogist should be.

Last year, she and her husband celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary. This is the only indication we have of her age, but neither time nor a loss of hearing have lessened her active enthusiastic interest in genealogy and her generosity in sharing her records and knowledge with others.

After years of collecting records on families of the Kisatchie area of Natchitoches, Rapides, Sabine and Vernon Parishes, she has become an authority on early settlers of this section of Louisiana. Her greatest pleasure is in sharing her records with others who are interested in these people and in discovering new information. She has done much to increase an interest in Genealogy in this area of our state.

Working in cooperation with others, many cemetery records have been compiled and published in The Genie. Some of her Masonic Lodge records are published in this issue. Records from four cemeteries: Campbell Creek, McGlothlin, Hill, and Knight, are on hand for future publication, as well as records from the old Congregational Methodist Church of Hemphill, La.

In a recent letter, she states that she will send more material soon and is now doing research on the CREWS and HOLLY Families.

If we could all follow the example set by Mrs. Parker, then Genealogical Research, Genealogical Records, and Genealogists would soon attain the respect and attention they deserve in this state, where they have been neglected by too many people far too long.

In 1819 he removed with his family to this parish, and has resided for nearly forty years on the place where he died. His children grew up around him. Two of them, a son and a daughter, died after they reached maturity. His wife after sharing with him for fifty years was taken by death. About the 20th of December last Father Taylor was attacked with pneumonia and died 31 December 1857. He was laid to rest in the family burial grounds, near Clinton, La. where he had so long resided.

Great loss of life: Explosion of the steamboat Farry Fern, at 2 P.M. on the 28th ult. the steamer Farry Fern, Capt. Benjamin Woodward, bound from St. Louis for Pittsburg, loaded with cargo and twenty or thirty cabin and deck passengers, when at Bosley's Bar, near North Bend, eighteen miles below this city, exploded one (the center) boiler out of three and destroyed parts of the boat. It soon burned to the water's edge and sank.

BOOK REVIEWS

If you are interested in Madison County, Tenn., early records then FAMILY FINDINGS, a special edition, published by Mid-West Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 3175, Jackson, Tenn. 38301, may hold some answers. This 110 page, 8½x11", paperback contains some heretofore unpublished official records that should be of interest to anyone doing family research in Madison County.

One unusual feature is a census of the county's children of pre-school age 1838. There are abstracts from book 1, court records from 1821; excerpts from early county newspapers 1823-1830; tax lists 1823; loose marriage bonds 1823-1832 and record book from Griffin's Funeral Home. Price \$3.00 pp.

A FAMILY RECORD: STEPHENS, by Donald Lewis Osborn contains 20 pages in paperback form, may be ordered from the author, 322 Wollow Way, Lee's Summit, Missouri 64063 for \$4.00 postpaid, size 5x8".

This is strictly a lineage book. It contains descendants of Benjamin Stephens, bn. 1779, Orange County, Va., and his wife Agnes Nelson of Orange Co., Va. There are many dates as to births, and marriages but few court records. Other family names include Scott, Ryle and Calvert.

A SILVER SPOON by Katharine Harsell Rich is a companion volume to her NO SILVER SPOON published last year. It is an 8½x11" paperback; contains 146 pages printed on one side only. It may be ordered from the author at 72 Terrace Road, Walnut Creek, California 94596 for \$6.00.

This book deals with Redds and Richies but contains much from Nichols' HISTORY AND ANTIQUITIES OF LEICESTERSHIRE, dating back to early 12th century. It contains many maps and family charts of Royal families. She traces the Coulson family from England to Pennsylvania. Much is included from the autobiography of John Lowe Butler who joined the Latter Day Saints and traveled with the pioneer group in 1852 to Utah.

HISTORICAL DEVICES BADGES AND WAR CRIES, by Mrs. Ruby Pallister, is a reprint of the 1870 edition published in London. It is a hard back, 435 pages, indexed, and may be ordered from Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226 for \$22.50.

This well illustrated book (293) should be of value and interest to one interested in Heraldic symbols and their mottos. Cross references show names connected with badges and other symbols.

A few family histories are used to show relation of devices. One of the most famous is that of Henry VIII and his wives; Katharine of Aragon, Ann of Clives, Katherine Howard, Katherine Parr, Jane Seymour and daughters Mary and Elizabeth. Also that of son, Edward VI. Also mentioned is Arthur, the mystic King of Britian, 6th. Century.

I do appreciate authentication
But too much "elsewhere" explanation
Tucked down in the footnotes

One day recently, confined to bed with both feet elevated and a slippery satin covered heating pad on my right shoulder, I started reading a marvelous book which contained records on some of my most illusive families. It was a gold mine of information for me, just as it will be for many of you.

Can you imagine trying to hold a heavy book, read the fine print in footnotes with a big magnifying glass, write down all the references you will need to consult, and at the same time try to keep a slipping sliding electric pad in place on your right shoulder! It was an exercise in much more than complete, total frustration. At least $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ of every page was footnotes.

For some strange reason, I developed a sudden aversion to too many footnotes, no matter how important they may be, and simply had to express my feelings on this matter. I once heard a brilliant university professor say that footnotes should be kept to an absolute minimum, with references incorporated in the text if at all possible. To him, I dedicate this very unpoetic poem of protest.
