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FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK





Located about 3 miles south of Simpson High School on La. Hwy. 465. This part of Vernon Parish was in Rapides before the forming of Vernon Parish in 1871. Early settlers came to this region in the 1850s. Up until about 1905 there was a school and a church on this site. The Methodists worshiped here on a regular basis and at times other groups used the building. Simpson received its name in September 1891 when the Simpson post office had its beginning. What is Simpson at the present time was known as Pine Island Community until the post office was formed. Information in parenthesis is not on the tombstones but from the compilers' personal knowledge or records. Compiled in August 1975.

Hon Peter Vyvian Daniel, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, was the third son of Travers Daniel of Stafford County, Va. His ancestors immigrated to Virginia in 1649 and his grandfather was married to the aunt of General Washington. He was educated by private tutors and entered Princeton College in New Jersey in 1802, at age of 16, as a member of the Junior Class. In 1804 he studied at home and in 1805 began the study of law in the office of Edmund Randolph, Esq., in Richmond, Va. In 1808 he was admitted to the bar, and in 1809-10 was a representative from Stafford County to the House of Delegates of Virginia. In 1811 he married the youngest daughter of Edmund Randolph, Esq., and settled in Richmond. In 1835 he was offered the office of Attorney General by President Jackson, but refused the appointment. In 1836 he was appointed District Judge by Pres. Jackson, and in 1840 appointed Associate Justice of the Supreme Court by Pres. Van Buren. (No date of death given in the obituary.)

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Genealogically Speaking

One of the most difficult problems a genealogist will ever face is that of determining his ancestor's original domicile. Man has always been on the move for one reason or the other. Sometimes the move was forced upon him; yet, at other times it has been the result of his desire to improve his economic, religious or political status.

Whatever the force, however, the further back in time we search, the more difficult it will be to trace the migrations of some individuals.

This article is not designed to cover the entire subject of all the routes. Instead, it is the first of several on the subject and this writing will dwell upon the main land routes from Georgia through the Gulf States to Louisiana.

First, we should understand the meaning of four words: migrate, migrant, emigrant, immigrant. To migrate means to change one's place of abode. In the process the migrant is an emigrant in the country of departure and an immigrant in the country of subsequent residence. Card catalogs and indexes in libraries are arranged accordingly.

When your objective is to find the place of origin of a migrant ancestor you should exert every effort to positively determine whether the ancestor was truly a migrant and, if so, when he migrated and from where. Several records exist that will help you in this matter:

- a. The 1850 census of the United States is the first to give places of birth.
- b. The 1870 census indicates whether the parents of those enumerated were of foreign birth.
- c. The 1880 census discloses the country/place of birth of the parents of those enumerated.
- d. The 1900 census gives the year of immigration, plus whether the persons enumerated were naturalized citizens.
- e. Naturalization records usually reveal birthplaces and dates. Sometimes they name parents.
- f. Military pension applications and records usually disclose birthplaces and dates.
- g. County and local histories may reveal some information.
- h. Church records can be helpful as well as home and/or family records.
- i. Bounty land warrants and state land lotteries may be of value.

There is no great secret in finding old migration trails. The old settlers followed paths created by wild animals and the Indians and these have often become the routes followed by many of our modern highways and roads. Since the trails had already become established, land was purchased and/or claimed with those trails forming natural boundaries. Even when property was owned on both sides of a trail the trail was left as it was, free to be travelled upon.

Perhaps the most used trail leading from the Carolinas to Louisiana and Texas was the route now covered by Georgia State Highways 16, 22, and 49 and US Highway 80. Only minor changes have been made in modern times.

Using a modern road map locate Augusta, Ga. The Occaneechi Path came down from the Carolinas into Augusta. From there the settlers moved along the general route now followed by Ga. 16, passing through where Harlem, Thomson, Warrenton and Sparta are today. From Sparta the path is now Ga. 22 until you reach Milledgeville. From Milledgeville to Macon you follow Ga. 49. This portion of the trail west (Augusta to Macon) was called the Lower Creek Trading Path. The trail did not dip into what is now Macon; but, passed along a point north of the city near the Jones-Bibb county line (about 7 miles north). Today, however, the road dips into Macon.

At this point the Lower Creek Trading Path swings northwestward towards present-day Birmingham, taking settlers into northern Alabama, northern Mississippi and into Arkansas. Some of these settlers found their way into Louisiana. The path is known today as US 41 through Forsyth and Barnesville to Griffen. There you take Ga. 16 through Newman to Carrollton. At Carrollton the path becomes US 27 to Bremen and then US 78 to Tallapoosa and across the state line into Alabama.

Most of our North Louisiana ancestors left the Lower Creek Trading Path near Macon, continuing their journey westward along the Macon-Montgomery Trail (now US 80). Along the route they passed through Roberta, Talbotton, Geneva and Columbus.

Another route used by some Louisiana and Texas settlers was known as The Old Trading Path of the South. Today we know it as US 301 South out of Sylvania to Claxton. At Claxton the trail is now used as US 280, passing through Reidsville, Lyons, Vidalia, Mount Vernon, McRae, Abbeville, Rochelle and Cordele. From Cordele it's Ga. 57 to Albany where Ga. 91 takes over and passes through Newton, Colquitt and Donalsonville.

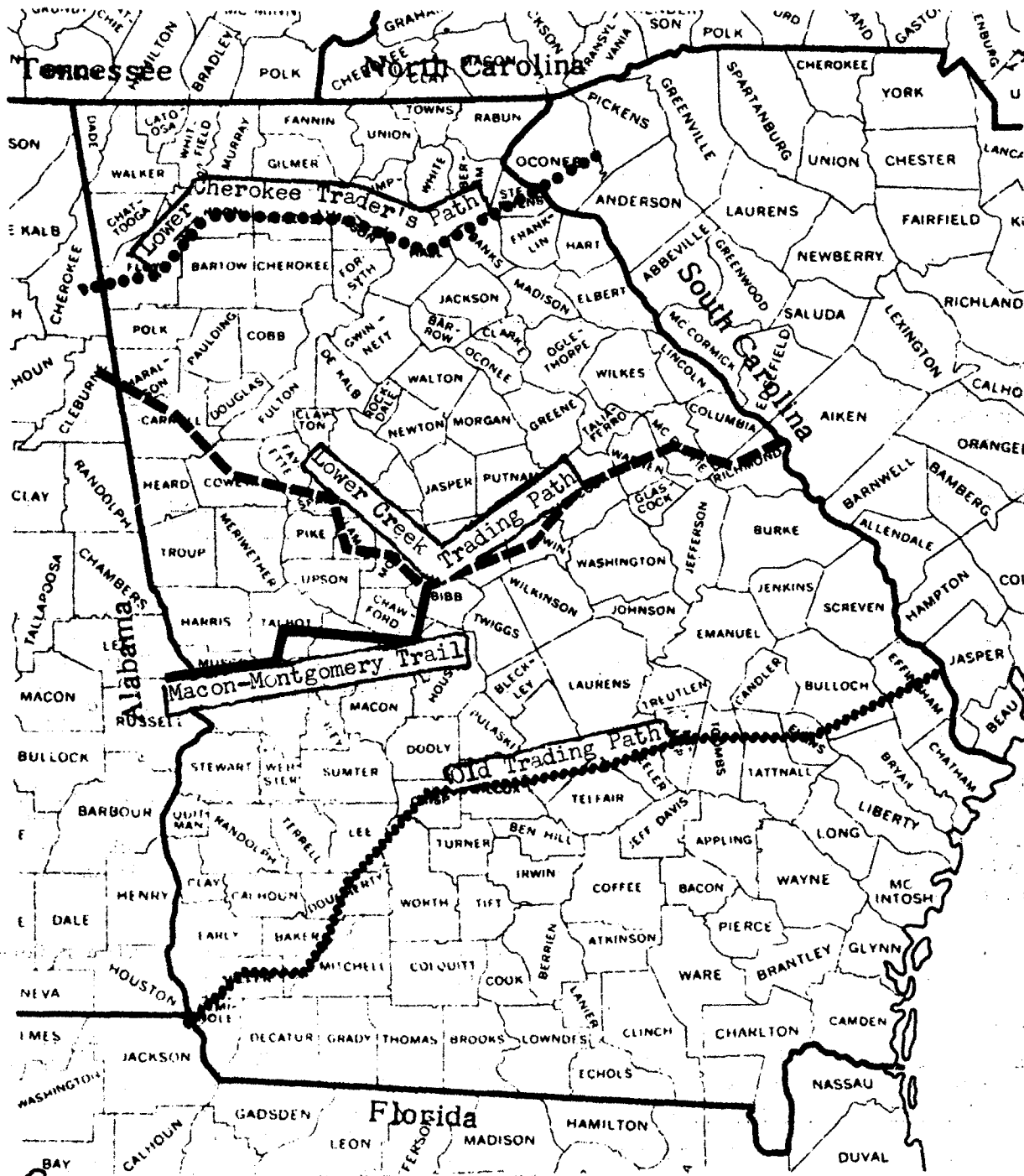
The only remaining main trail through Georgia is The Lower Cherokee Trader's Path. To find this route - which led out of Greenville, SC - start at Toccoa on US 122 to Gainesville. From Gainesville the trail becomes Ga. 53, passing thru Dawsonville, Tate, Jasper, Fairmount, Calhoun and Rome. The next stop is where Gadsen, Alabama, is today.

These, then, are the three main routes through Georgia. They are also referred to - usually by Georgians - as the Upper, Middle and Lower Trails.

There are several connecting trails within Georgia. Among them are: Augusta to St. Augustine Trail (US 1); The Pecatonica Trail (US 29, 129/441, 41, Ga. 38, US 319 and 19 - Anderson, SC, through Athens, Macon, Cordele, Moultrie to the Gulf Coast); Cisca and St. Augustine Trail (mainly between Chattanooga and Augusta - US 76, 129 and 78); Unicoi Turnpike (part of a system from Nashville, Tennessee to Augusta, Georgia, using US 76); Augusta and Cherokee Trail (emerges from the Unicoi Turnpike near Anderson, SC, and continues directly southward to Augusta); and finally the Augusta and Savannah Trail (Ga. 24 and 21).

The three main routes have been sketched on the outline map of Georgia on page 224.

The trails through Alabama will be discussed in the next issue of THE GENIE.

BOOK REVIEWS

MOTTOES AND BADGES by W.S.W. Anson. This small, hardbound volume covers well over 2,000 mottoes and badges of Families, Regiments, Schools, Colleges, States, Towns, Livery Companies, Societies, etc., British and Foreign, with translations into English of the foreign examples and occasional notes attempting to trace such mottoes which use quotations.

Each of the alphabetically arranged entries gives the motto, its language, an English translation, the name of the family, regiment, etc., and in many cases the source. Originally published in London, 1904. 192 pp. Index of Names. \$15.00 per copy from Gale Research Company, Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226.

THE AMERICAN GENEALOGIST first published by Joel Munsell's Sons, Albany, N.Y., in 1900; this is the fifth edition, reprinted by Gale Research Company. This is a Catalogue of Family Histories; A Bibliography of American Genealogy or a list of the Title Pages of Books and Pamphlets on Family History. Hardbound, 406 pp.

This edition is arranged alphabetically by family names. If there is more than one book listed for the same name, the names are listed chronologically. Footnotes from earlier editions have been omitted, and instead the title page of each book is given, with such information as seemed necessary to give an idea of the contents. Usually the name of the American progenitor with the place and date of his settlement has been noted. There are a few references on foreign families which are pertinent to American families. OZARK COUNTY MISSOURI RECORDS AND PIONEER FAMILIES by William A. Yates. Soft-bound, 78 pp. \$6.50 from the author, P.O. Box 1687, Rifle, Colorado 81650.

This volume has many of the basic records that the genealogist needs to look at in his area of research. It contains historical sketches, birth and death records, circuit court minutes, deeds, cemetery records, marriages 1849 - 1850, and a bibliography that refers the serious researcher to other material in Ozark County and the surrounding area.

AN IRISH STOWAWAY by Garnie W. McGinty and Etoyle Conly. Library binding, 372 pp. Order from Mrs Doris Gardner, P.O. Box 293, Ringgold, LA 71068. \$10.50 per copy.

This family history concerns Cullen Thomas Conly (1820-1872) and his wife, Dicy Talton (1825-1896). They married in Houston County, Georgia, in 1844. As a stowaway, Cullen Thomas Conly, came to America at the age of sixteen, in 1836, from his native Ireland. He was born near Mt. Conly in County Antrim. Six sons and four daughters were born to Cullen and Dicy Conly. The Conlys with some of his wife's family migrated to the eastern shore of Lake Bistineau about 1847.

The appendices contain thirty-one pages of photographed documentation which includes: naturalization papers, maps, deeds, tax receipts, store accounts and letters. There are a number of old photos, including one of the patriarch and his wife. If you have ancestors in Bienville Parish, this volume may be very helpful since this family intermarried with a number of NW Louisiana families.

If you are doing research in Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, and/or Arkansas this quarterly is an excellent research tool. In addition to a variety of genealogical records from all of these states, Mr Yates includes helpful articles on basic research methods. He publishes two query sections in each issue: 1) Streamlined Queries which list an early ancestor with year and place of birth, death, or marriage; name of the spouse; and finally locations where the family or descendants resided. One surname per query. 2) Queries which are in the customary format.

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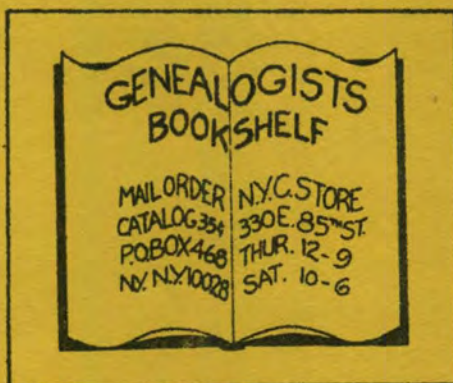
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
