#### T.M. GATLIN FAMILY BIBLE

This is the Family Bible of Thomas Mitchell and Martha Winifred Gatlin who were married March 14, 1838. They were first cousins - he the son of Hardy Gatlin and she the daughter of Hardy's brother, Furney Gatlin. She was a Gatlin before she married Thomas M.

This Bible is owned by Mrs. William McLelland Jr. of East Point, Louisiana, and the Bible is in her possession at her home there.

Thomas Mitchell Gatlin was the father of Thomas Hardy Gatlin. Both Thomas Mitchell Gatlin and his wife Martha Winifred Gatlin are buried at Fairview Plantation, Keatchie, Louisiana. (See the "Genie" Jan. 1971).



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#### HARRIET PRUDENCE PATTERSON

Harriet Prudence Patterson, born in the year 1743, was of Welsh and English decent, on the maternal side she was Welsh, on the paternal side English. The Patterson family emigrated to America, when Prudence was a child. The family first settled in Maryland, and later moved to Pennsylvania.

Prudence was 15 years of age when the family moved from Maryland to South Carolina and settled near Charles Town. Here, Prudence grew into young womanhood met and married John Hall, also of an English family.

John Hall was six years his wife's scnior, having been born in 1737. Prudence Patterson was 20 years of age and John Hall 26 when their marriage took place in 1763.

On June 17th, 1764, Margaret, the oldest child was born to John and Prudence Hall. They became the parents of nine children, and it is quite probable that several of the children, if not all, were born during their sojurn near Charles town. But sometime prior to the American Revolution, they left Charles Town and moved to Upper S.C. and settled in York District. Here, they bought land on "Little Allison Creek" and built their home among a large grove of fine old trees, near a big spring of cool sparkling water, and ideal place for a residence and strange as it may seem, this very place was destined to play an important part in the history of American Revolution. Here a big brick store was erected which not only served the people for miles around as a trading point, but also became the distrubuting point for salt. Salt was a scarce article in those days of history, in speaking of it states that during the American Revolution, women rode horseback from as far as Camden to this place to purchase a supply of salt-which was limited to a certain amount to each family. The salt was hauled in wagons from Virginia by slaves. And here, Purdence became a heroine of her day. To make a long story short, she saved the life of a man whom the Indians had scalped and left to die -- she had a number of milk cows ranging at large, as at that day there was an abundance of range, and often the cows failed to come at milking time. On this occasion she mounted her horse and rode out through the dense woods to find them. She crossed an Indian trail and spring branch. She heard a noise of mosning and groaning of some one in great distress -being a pioneer woman and of a fearless and intrepid character, she rode on till she found the man lying in water -- she rode quickly back and spread the news. The man was rescued and nursed back to life. His name was John Forbess. He lived to a ripe old age. He is buried in Ebenezer Cemetery, leaving behind many descendants living in this community.

Bethel Presbyterian Church was organized about 1780, and while I have no record of it (but I can get it) I am of the opinion that Prudence and her husband are charter members. Dr. David Bigger of Rock Hill, who is a fine historian told me that a number of years ago this sketch of the life of Prudence Hall was read out on occasion of "Home Coming" at Bethel Presbyterian Church. She was lauded as a heroine and praised as a devout Christian Woman. In her younger day, she often walked the distance of 10 miles to attend Divine Worship at old Bethel Church. John Hall was a true "Whig", he fought in the American Army leaving at home a brave hearted little woman and house full of children to care for themselves.

Harriet Prudence Patterson...Cont'd.

My mother who had the most marvelous memory of any on earth, told me history enough to fill several volumes, but I was young then and made no effort to remember it all -- how I wish now that I had. But at any rate, Prudence and three other women rode horseback to Charles Town during the war, when the British beseiged Charles Town, under the guise of purchasing medicine for you must know that women of those days often administered simple medicine. They were held up by the British as spies but this protest that their mission was to purchase medicine -- they were allowed to pass the British ranks -- they got their medicine and returned but not until Purdence had delivered an important message to the American Army, which she carried sewed up in her petticoat! She had outwitted them, but oh, how they hated her! I wish I could remember all of the little doggered rhymes the British made about these three women, but I can only remember these lines: "Prudence Hall, Peggy Strain and Beckie McCall".

Last summer, I began to write out a complete history of this beginning with John Hall and Prudence Hall, which by the time you have read this far, you will understand, are our ancestors, but after writing up several 8X10 tablets I have never found a place to quit! I was only writing it for my nieces and Nephews, whom I thought might some day want to know their family history.

But I am so glad to give up any information you desire, but lest I tire you, I shall hurry on, but before dismissing at this point, let me say that John Hall, our notable ancestor, fought in the American Revolution as a brave American soldier and patriot and at the close, returned to his burned and devasted home, for the British, when they invaded upper S.C.; burned the brick store, which was the distributing place for salt and the home of John Hall. at that time they burned Hills Iron Works. But John Hall was not destined to live long after. He died in 1784 and lies buried in Bethel Cemetery. His grave stone bears this inscription:

"Sacred to the memory of Hohn Hall, who departed this life in the 47th year of his age. He leaves a wife and nine children to lament his death."

The youngest child of John and Prudence Hall was Major Temple Hall, who was but three years of age at the time of his father's death, having been born in 1781. Harriet Prudence Hall, wife of John Hall, also lies buried in Bethel Cemetery, beside her husband. His remarkable woman lived to be 96 years of age. And to write up a sketch of her life as my mother so often told it to me would fill a good sized book. She was my mother's great-grandmother. My great-great grandmother. Her tombstone bears this inscription:

"Sacred to the memory of Prudence Hall, wife of John Hall, who departed this life Aug. 15,1839 in the 96th year of her age. She dies in the full assurance of a blessed immortality."

Issue of the above: Margaret Hall, born 1764. I have no dates only that Margaret Hall and Dr. Hetley were the parents of Harriet Hetley, who was born in Union Co. May 5th 1789. Hetley was an Englishman, many years the senior of Margaret. Harriet Hetley, their daughter, at the early age of six or seven, developed a bone disease of the leg, they called it "white swelling". A rich uncle of Margaret's from Charlestown came up and took Harriet to live with them. They had her leg treated and she recovered completely and remained with them until she was sixteen, receiving a good education and being reared as their own child, cultured, refined, educated and dressed fine. She was said to be very beautiful, and popular belle of that day. At the age of 16 she returned to upper S.C. to live with her grandmother Prudence, who in the meantime after the death of John Hall had moved to Union County to a place called "Sylvan Spring" a sort of summer resort and opened up a boarding house and here, she (Prudence) had made the second matrimonial venture -- marrying a man by the name of "Harris" from whom she afterwards separated. Then she came back to York Co. but not to the same place from which she had lived during the Revolution. The reason for this I have never learned, they still retained ownership, for the land deeds show that their former house on Allison Creek remained in the Hall and Gillespie families till about 35 years ago, wahs sold to a Mr. Coules who still owns it. The West family came to this country from Germany. Now, don't get the idea that because they were Germans they were the kind the "Dough Boys" went over to squash during the world war!

The West family, a fine splendid people represented the class of German people who are clean, thrifty and honest and honorable, determined to make a living and lay up something besides. The elder West and his wife, my mother told me, could never learn to speak English, they sat around their fireside and conversed with each other in German. They were weavers of broadcloth and tailors by trade, and brought their equipment with them -- tailors scissors, cards, wheel and a big walnut loom. I don't know how many children were included in the West family. I only remember hearing my mother speak of these, her Aunt Elizabeth West, her father's sister, her Uncle Matthew West, whose wife's first name was Rachel, and who left S.C. long years ago, because people took up the idea that Uncle Matthew's wife and mother who lived with them were "witches". Uncle Matthew West owned one of the finest plantations on Little Dutchman Creek, fine land in high state of cultivation and fine apple orchard, fine well filled barns fat cattle and horses. A neighbor adjourning Uncle Matthew coveted this plantation, joing his. This ruse, raised a great fuss, they threatened to "tar and feather" Aunt Rachel. Uncle Matthew could not stand the indignation and abuse so this man offered to buy his place at almost nothin; Uncle Matthew sacrificed everything--practically gave it away -- took his family and moved to Mississippi. He had an only child when he left S.C., a little boy named William West. I am under the impression that your William Voley West of Ky. is a decendant of Uncle Matthew West. Joseph West had another brother, whose name I have forgotten, but he was a shoemaker by trade. The West family had settled on "Little Dutchman" Creek which is a tributary to "Big Dutchman Creek". They lived

neighbors to the Halls and it was here that Joseph West met and married the beautiful Harriet Hetley when she was 18 years of age. The first year or so of their young married life was spent in the home of the elder Mr. & Mrs. West. Then later Joseph West rented a piece of land that was owned by the Indians—in fact all this country was then known as "Indian Lands", this place was a fine piece of land also bordering on Little Dutchman Creek, had log dwelling with half story above and log kitchen in the yard.

Here, Joseph West lived, here he and his wife made their home, here their nine children were born and reared to maturity and here Harriet Hetley West died, Feb. 8, 1846 and lies buried in Ebenezer Cemetery, her tombstone bears this inscription:

"Sacred to the memory of Margaret Robinson, daughter of John and Prudence Hall, who was born June 17, 1764 and departed this life in 1822 in the 58th year of her life."

Harriet Hetley had two brothers, Thomas McMackin and Elias Carruth. They were born and reared in Union Co. at least, till they were about 16 & 18 years of age, when they went west. They were younger than Harriet. They struck out for themselves early in life. Two barefooted boys, with their earthly belongings tied up in a bundle hung on the end of a stick across their shoulders. They came by to tell their sister, Harriet Hetly West, "goodbye". She never saw them anymore. I have never learned how they got separated but the tradition told to me is that Thomas landed in Tenn. eventually became a big hotel man, that he started with nothing and rose to wealth, that he had a way of singing out his menu -- "Here is your ham and here's lamb and here's your jam, "etc. Elias landed in Miss., became a big land owner and slave holder, and there Aunt Peggy Wilson on their long move from S.C. to Ark. by covered wagon stopped to "camp" one night on the roadside near the home of a big plantation owner. She inquired of the servants who lived there, they told her and that "Marse Elias" daughter was getting married that evening and they were preparing for a big wedding. She begged to speak to the gentlemen, who granted her request. She was shown into the living room and met a fine handsome portly old gentleman with ruddy complexion and iron gray hair. His conversation divulged the fact that he was native of S.C. and related to the Halls and that his sister married Joseph West. I never knew that Uncle Jackson West's name was Elia Jackson. To all the land deeds and papers, he signed his name E. Jackson West. He has one wife buried at Yor, Elizabeth West, wife of E. Jackson West.

#### Mrs. Ladd J. Lumpkin

NOTE: Mrs. Lumpkin was Annie Farris before her marriage to Ladd -- She was our parents Aunt. In other words, Aunt Annie to Mother, etc. She lived in Rock Hill, S.C.

Annie Farris Lumpkin was the daughter of Harriet Louise (Louisa) West.

Daisey West Watkins is the grand-daughter of Martin West, brother to Harriet Louise West.

### RUSK COUNTY TEXAS

## Contributed By Mrs. Fern Ainsworth

A rare copy of the famous old buplication, THE HENDERSON TIMES, was found among its' historical papers giving the 1850 census of Texas, as well as an article, parts of which will be given below in quotation marks.

"Texas was first settled by the French, toward the close of the 17th century, but they were driven out by the Spaniards in 1690, when it was annexed to Mexico. On the final separation of the latter from Spain, Texas was, jointly with Coahuila, united against the wishes of the Anglo-Texas inhabitants, to the other states, as a Central Republic. To curb opposition, a Mexican army invaded the country, but was defeated at San Jacinto, April 21, 1836. This victory secured the independence of Texas and nine years later (1845), the state was admitted into the American Union and is now an important member of the Confederacy."

There are states that have been under the more flags than Texas, but almost everyone, including children, have heard of SIX FLAGS OVER TEXAS. Those flags represent the governments of France, Spain, Mexico, The Republic of Texas, The Confederacy and the United States.

There were very few Anglo settlers in Texas as early as 1820, but shortly thereafter, Moses Austin and his son, Stephen, brought in settlers from Tennessee, Louisiana, Alabama and Mississippi, and by 1830, there were more than 20,000 Americans in Texas.

In the 1850 census, Rusk County was the second most heavily populated with 8,148 inhabitants; Harrison County led the state with 11,822, while Dallas County had only 2,743 and Harris County, with Houston as County Seat, only 4,668.

Henderson and Rusk County is the story of Indian raids in one of the largest settlements in the State; of pioneering by a rugged people when Texas was a Republic and gradual growth for almost a hundred years until the discovery of oil in the County. The Cherokee Indians owned the land until many years after Texas became a Republic.

It was given to them before Texas gained her independence, and included territory between the Sabine and Trinity rivers. The Indians owned the land as individuals because Mexico refused their request to own it as a nation. Relations between the early white settlers and the Indians were friendly many years, or until a well-known white family was massacred. The other whites rose up and drove the Indians from the area, killing Chief Boles as well as many others of the tribe.

There were a few adventurous white trappers who worked in the waters of Cherokee Bayou, Martin's Creek, Johnson's and other streams during the winter and found that Logansport, Louisiana on the east bank of the Sabine, a ready market for skins and furs. In 1825. Haden Edwards and Burnett saw the possibility of coloninizing this area. The first 3 families to apply for land in Nacogdoches Land Office were Thomas and Leonard Willams and William Elliot in 1826. Thomas land was located in what is now Caledonia Community. Leonard, assumed to be brother of Thomas, got 4428 acres where the township of Mt. Enterprise is now located. WILLIAM ELLIOT, the son-in-law of THOMAS WILLIAMS, received 4428 acres in the present community of Concord. THOMAS J. RUSK, for whom Rusk County was named and whose monument now stands in the City Square of Henderson, was then practicing law in Nacogdoches and witnessed the signing of these early instruments.

By early 1832, settlement was established in Mt. Enterprise and CHARLIE VINSON is supposed to be the earliest merchant there. After the victory at the battle of San Jacinto a steady stream of settlers poured into this county.

In 1843, an act forming Rusk County out of Nacogdoches, three commissioners were appointed and the surveyor, J.N. BROWN made the survey which included a part of what is now Gregg County. Five Commissioners were appointed to acquire land and lay off the county seat. They were: ROBERT L. LANE, TAYLOR B ROWN, SR., JOHN G. MILLER, JAMES SMITH AND JAMES WALLING.

In 1846 JOHN M. BECTON, a Presbyterian minister, erected a building to be partially used as a school, partly as a church. The school known as Rusk County Academy, the church as First Presbyterian Church.

The TEXAS STATESMAN is believed to be the first newspaper in Rusk, first published March 1849, with the Henderson Times starting after 1850.

The Wood Hotel was the first Large hotel, followed by the Tutt which was probably the forerunner of the Whitson, now the Randolph. R. B. TUTT was the early owner and operated the race track where many famous horses ran. Early doctors were: J.A.S. PARSONS, A.M. WYATT, and W.S. POE, who also served as druggists.

Following the annexation of Texas with the Union in 1845, settlers from all parts of the country came to Rusk County in increasing numbers. Schools were erected, mails were delivered several times each week, with routes through Henderson, Marshall, Tyler, Nacogdoches and Shelbyville.

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Two fraternal organizations were in Henderson early; the Masonic Lodge organized in 1845, Sons of Temperance also about that time, and Odd Fellows about 1850. Tradition has it that TRAMMEL TRACE was Rusk's first public roadway, and many interesting stories have been told about it. Until 1825 Henderson was known as Shawnee-town, as this area was included in Nacogdoches County.

An early Indian trail which extended probably from the Mississippi River through Ft. Smith, Arkansas to Nacogdoches. NICHLAS TRAMMEL ferryman between 1820 and 1830 at the crossing of the Trinity on the old San Antonio road. This trace ran due north and south in most of its course forming the boundary line of Rusk County, and named as such in the act that recited the lines as marking 2/3 or more of its eastern boundary, particularly that dividing Panola and Rusk Counties. As an Indian trail it was ancient, and NICHOLAS TRAMMEL merely straightened and made it a path and finally a road. It runs due north from Nacogdoches, turns northeast Pinehill a mile to the left, and on through the MARTIN League, past the Harmony Hill Cemetery and Tatum, then between Hendrick's Lake and Black Lake to cross the Sabine at Rocky Ford.

Trammel made regular trips to Galveston and other points returning with slaves and other contraband, which later made their way into the United States. There was a network of such traces through the East Texas area as well as the Neutral Strip through which contraband filtered to the Mississippi River and on into eastern parts of the United States. The Lafitte Brothers were very versatile when it came to extablishing an operation such as theirs and you will find one of their men located on each artery, whether it be stream or road, to handle operations, observe traffic, movements of soldiers, etc. In fact it is accepted that Nick Trammel blazed the Trammel Trace especially for the Lafitte Brothers.

Two miles west of the DANIEL MARTIN home, settled about 1828, there came into being in very early times a locality known as Nipand-Tuck. Later it became Harmony Hill, but there is no sign of them now, no post office, no remnant of the business section that flourished before and during the Civil War, but both the names survive in deed records.

Albert Tatum came to Texas about 1836 to help SAM HOUSTON in his nation building. J. REEL, JOHN W., WILLIAM, JIM AND ALVAH KUYKENDALL, WOODALLS, DOLLAHITES, ATWOOD, STOVALL, MCCOLLUM, AND CALLOWAYS, all families related to each other were here real early. They were Primitive Baptists and built a log church before Harmony Hill had its name.

Matt chamness, a merchant; BROOKS RICHARDSON, brother-in-law to CHAMNESS: DR. WEAR, established first drug store; BEN WILHELM started a blacksmith shop in 1856 which passed to his negro helper MACK DECKARD: CALLOWAY operated a gin, gristmill and sawmill.

AUTREY was the shoe maker; he also made spinning wheels; BERRY ADAMS was a wheelwright; GEORGE HARRIS: LAWSON, ALFONSO AND MONTGOMERY KEENER: ALEX CARTER: W.M. GLADNEY: A.V. HENDRICK: JIM ROBERTSON: J.M. TROSPER: J.M. MAYS: BILLY GRIFFIN: HOMER HARRIS: J.H. LANGHORNE: TATUM MENEFEE, from Alabama; N.M. REESE: MOSES MELTON CROW: JULIEN S. DEVERAUX, FROM Virginia in 1840; HULLUM DUKE REDWINE, from Miss. in 1850; JIM ROGERS: W.T. BREWER: L.W. CULP: WILLIAM CRAIG. TO Texas in 1839. He was a native of South Carolina, born 1785, and a Methodist preacher: ANGUS, JOHN AND DANIEL WAGONNER, from Tennessee); W.HH. WELCH: WILLIAM EASLEY: JOEL EATON: ROBERT GIBSON: W.H.H. HARVEY: W.N. MCANULTY: HENRY PINKSTON: CALEB PHILLIPS: J.H. ROUNTREE: WILLIAM YORK: W.B. ECTOR: M.D. LEVERETT, BOUGHT LAND L\*%(: J.G. SEXTON; JOHN ASH: C.S. BEAN: JAMES ETHERIDGE: GEORGE SCOTT HARRIS, a Baptist preacher bought land 1850; LEMUEL STONE, E.B. ALFORD, born and reared in Alabama, to Texas before 1850; ARCHIE A, WILLIE F., AND ROBBIE BEALL, who founded the Beall Chain of stores by that name are descended from early settlers of Rusk County; EDWIN B. HAMLETT, born in Virginia 1826, with parents to Tennessee until 1859 when he came to Rusk County; JAMES MADISON LANGHORNE, of Virginia also an early settler; JOHN C. MILLER, judge in early days of Rusk; JUDGE WILLIAM WRIGHT MORRIS, was born HALIFAX COUNTY, N.C. in 1805, to Alabama about 1840 and then to Rusk in 1849 bringing with him his widowed mother, MRS. AQUILLA MORRIS (nee MARY BACHELLER), and his sister who was widowed also, MARTHA MORRIS SPIVEY And her three children, DIXON FLEMON, WILLIAM WRIGHT and ELLEN SPIVEY. ELLEN married GEORGE H. GOULD, a descendant of a long line of Americans who came to this country from England in 1639 and settled in Massachusetts; STEPHEN DECATUR MORRIS, brother of JUDGE WILLIAM WRIGHT MORRIS, was married to MARY BRADFORD, of Alabama, before 1860; EDWARD CHESTER OBERTHIER, was son of FREDERICK, born Philadelphia, Pa. 1797 and SARAH HUBBARD OBERTHIER, a native of Virginia. They were married in Danville, Virginia 1825 and Edward was born there 1846. In 1850 to Rusk County, Texas; CHARLES BRUCE RICHARDSON born 1808 in Spotsylvania City, Va., kept a diary, and it tells much of the travel and hardships in the early days. When quite young, in 1827, he made a trip to West Virginia and then on down the Mississippi River into Louisiana to look for a new home. It took weeks battling flooded streams, facing wild animals and often thrown with people who had strange and different ways from his. A quote from his diary follows:

"I arrived at the mouth of Red River about 10 o; clock at night and was landed in the dark with no house in sight. I felt gloomy indeed. A man named HALE (I think) lived thereabouts, who was a friend of JAMES BOWIE. BOWIE is the man who fought the celebrated Natchex Island fight and killed a man named WRIGHT with his two-edged knife, since called a Bowie Knife. HALE and those about him, talked of nothing but the fight and other lawless deeds that made me shudder. I felt strange in such company; I just from the Old Dominion."

He managed to make it to Monroe, Louisiana, and located his Uncle Samuel Richardson's widow who had married a Dr. HAMBLEN. He stayed with them until May 1830, when he decided to go back to Virginia to see his relatives. Although his father offered him part of the family farm if he would stay with them, he told them he would rather spend 7 years on the fertile lands of Virginia than remain 20 years on such poor land in Virginia. On the trips to and from Louisiana he met and married SARAH ELIZABETH BOSWORTH, of Kentucky. After their marriage they established a plantation on Bayou Macon about 30 miles from Vicksburg, but when General Grant began to lay seige to Vicksburg in 1863, the plantation was flooded by the Southern Army to hamper Grant's progress. Learning the Northern Army was on the verge of raiding his place they burned a hundred bales of cotton, threw the seed cotton into the river, gave 2000 bushels of corn to the Southern Army, destroyed his library, sank their piano in the bayou, gathered up their livestock, family and about 50 negroes and came to Rusk County; DR. WILLIAM M. ROSS, a scion of distinguished ancestors, was the grandson of HUGH of Scotland and son of HUGH II and LUCRETIA LACY ROSS of North Carolina. ministered to the ills of the pioneers of East Texas, he also was a trained and capable surveyor, was the second sheriff of Rusk County and allowed his home to be used each Sunday by various churches for services. One wing of the house, built in 1845, was used as a clinical hospital for those too ill to stay home and in the yard was a small building that served as jail. His wife was MARY ALL GILLESPIE.

The HARMONY HILL CEMETERY is the oldest in the county. Two acres were donated by JOHN W. KUYKENDALL in 1852 and following are a few interesting notes:

On the west side is a child's tombstone which has gradually tilted to a 45 degree angle by the growth of a great cedar tree. The child was a PRUITT, the death date is readablebut the christian name is not.

R.B. WOODALL born 1826 died 1885 (was member of old Camden Masonic Lodge)
J.P. MCNEESE 1818-1889
GOERGE SCOTT HARRIS 1820-1886

ELI HILL WARE, a native of Spartanburg, S.C. died 8 Aug. 1858.

(There is nothing left of the old WARE Home save a few foundation rocks. He came to Texas in late 1830. He bought his first tract of land in 1842. He was a school teacher and married BETTIE VINSON, had large land holdings, owned a tannery, and the man who married the widow of ELI WARE, MAJOR J.W. FLANAGAN, made shoes for the Confederacy.

Eli Ware built a school house early on his property Some of his first students were: SEBURN, JOHM W., JOHN & MARTHA GRAHAM, ALLEN V, EMMA, SEBURN, ALBERT, SMITH OR LASS, WES, ANNA & FANNIE HENDRICK; PAUL RONDA, WESLEY & "COON" TATUM; WILLIS, MATTIE, and PHOEBE McMURTRIES; GEORGE GREENWOOD; HOMER and DICK KELLY; ROBERT, GEORGE W., LAURA, MATTIE, and AMANDA JONES; JIM & ZEKE LAWLESS; JOE PERRY and DR. JIM TATUM.

Rusk County Academy was formed 1845 at Henderson and named the trustees as listed: JAMES SMITH, Wm. B. OCHILTREE, ARCHIBALD H. WATKINS, ROBERT W. SMITH, ROBERT L. LANE, ELIJAH ALLEN, EZRA WILSON, Wm. HALTON, Wm. HOWETH, JOHN W. MASSIE, ISAAC FERGUSON, WILLIAM WOOLWINE & JOHN HAMMONS.

The Mount Enterprise Male & Female Academy was created in 1853 with the Board of Directors as follows: Wm. H. ESTELL, DAVID SOLLINS, A.P. GALLAWAY, M.D. CHARLES VINCENT, BIRD LINTHICUM, WILLIAM HAYS, JOHN L. SALMON, ROBERT E. WYNN, S.W. MARCH, M.D.G. BOOKER, THOMAS JONES & Wm. HARLE, M.D.

In 1854 the Church Male & Female Academy was created with the following Board of Trustees: JOHN ROBERTSON, JOHN STRONG, SAMUEL MASON, JACKSON PRYOR, ANDERSON W. SMITH, NEWELL TULLIS & Wm.P. WRIGHT.

The Henderson Female College was created in 1856 with the following citizens in charge: C.C. SHUMATE, A.B. GRAHAM, M.D. ECTOR, M.D. GRAHAM, & W.W. MORRIS.

Millville Male & Female Acamemy was created 1858 with the following Board of Trustees: SAMUEL HENDERSON, JAMES YANTES, JOHN VINCENT, Wm. MONT GOMERY, HARRISON EDENS, STEPHEN COLEMAN, JESSE WALLING, JAMES C. VERNON & DR. O.E. BURT.

In 1864 the Henderson Masonic Female Institute was authorized with the following trustees: A.J. SMITH, Wm. STEADMAN, THOMAS A. OLIVER, J.M. DOD-SON, Wm. H. ESTILL, BENNETT BOGGESS & JOHN P. GRIGSBY.

It would be thoughtless in this category of schools not to mention the tragedy of the New Boston School. On the morning of March 18, 1937, TED HUDSON opened his new broadcasting studio in the Randolph Hotel building, although he first had to operate by remote control through another station already established in a nearby East Texas town. Mr. Hudson's selecting that day to launch this new radio

station, for within the next three days his voice had been listened to with great interest by millions over three nation-wide radio hook-ups. The station went on the air at 7:00 A.M. and nothing out of the ordinary happened for some hours. Just the usual formal programs, talks by the mayor and others a welcome by a newspaper man, some local talent, etc.

Shortly before 4:00 P.M. traged, which staggered a world struck in nearby New London community & brought this new radio announcer very close to millions of people.

An explosion occurred just before school closed for the day, killing 294 children & teachers, crippled many others, & destroyed the large school building in an instant. In a short time Ted Hudson was on the scene not only to report & satisfy morbidly curious radio listeners, but to help direct rescue work. Every morgue & funeral home in a dozen towns & cities was filled. Hospitals were overflowing, & frantic parents knew not where their children were or even if they were dead or alive. This was the worst school disaster in the history of public education in the world.

### CHURCHES:

The early Missions of East Texas served as places of worship, along with many other functions, but as this county was settled by early pioneers, they brought with them the freedom to worship God as their conscience dictated thus the many denominational chruches.

There may have been earlier churches out in the county, but county records seem to show that the first one was the First Presbyterian Church under the leadership of REV. JOHN M. BECTON. Other pastors were: The Reverands R.M. LONGBRIDGE, R.H. BYERS, W.K. MARSHALL, JAMES KNOX, S.C. ALEXANDER, MCBRIDE, D.J. JUNKIN, J.G. HENDERSON, S.W. MITCHELL, C.W. CHAMBERS, Z.B. GRAVES, JOHN VAN LEAR, J.P. WORD, A.L. WHITFIELD, H.S. DAVIDSON, R.E. HOOKER, W.O. NELSON, S.D. LOGAN, R.C. HUTCHINSON, L.P. McCLENNY, P.W. BRANDON & T. FRANK GEORGE.

## COMMUNITIES:

Postal records of 1856 show Post Offices were operating in the following communities in Rusk County: ALMA, BELLVIEW, CALEDONIA, CALHOUN, CAMBRIDGE, CAMDEN, CENTER, COTTON PLANT, FREDONIA, HENDERSON, HARMONY, HILL, MILLVILLE, MOUNT ENTER-PRISE, MURVALL, NEW DANVILLE, NEW SALEM, PINEHILL, SAN COSMA, SAND HILL & WALLING'S FERRY.

COMMUNITIES: The origin of many of the communities of Rusk have been forgotten, but if you are familiar with the names of early settlers you might guess quite easily; BRACHFIELD, CRIM'S CHAPEL, LAIRD HILL, LEVERETT'S CHAPEL, CHAPMAN, SEXTON CITY, OVERTON & TATUM. CYRIL became MILLER & then JOINERVILLE, for old (DAD) JOINER intrepid oil prospector who brought in the first oil well in the great East Texas field, on the nearby DAISIE BRADFORD (MILLER) farm. Another community named for an early settler REKLAW, WALKER spelled backwards for an old early settler.

Other communities, the origins of which names might be guessed: PLEASANT HILL, PLEASANT GROVE, OAK HILL, GOOD SPRINGS, CONCORD, CALEDONIA, CHURCH HILL, MONROE, CROSS ROADS, PINEHILL, but what about GLENFAWN, LANEVILLE, MINDEN, MT. ENTERPRISE & NEW SALEM? ELLIS GLENN was an early settler of GLENFAWN. MINDEN probable named by the early settler H. W. WATSON who came to Texas from MINDEN, LOUISIANA. OVERTON named for FRANK OVERTON, one of the first settlers, & was long a town of pioneer families; BARKSDALE, BARTON, COHAGENS, GREEN, MOORE, MOTLEY, POPE, TUCKER, TURNER, SMITH & WILSON all settled here early. The first community, known now as OLD TOWN, is about one mile north of the present location. Early settlers were: BARTHOLD HIGHTOWER, HALTON, LAWLER, MADDUX, JUNKINS, STEGALL, WOLVERTON, SORY, ROSS, MARCH & WESTFALL who came here from Germany in 1840.

TATUM, named for the TATUM Family was settled by following families: ALBERT TATUM, FORT, MCNAUGHTON, HEMBY, HELVENSTON, KIRKLEY, ALLEN, KINARD, SUGGS, OWENS, ALLISON, CANNON, KUYKENDALL, KELLY, PINSSTON, CYPHERS, FORSYTH, MENEFEE, DANIELS, ALEXANDER, MULINS, YOUNGBLOOD, McCARTER, MOORE, LAWRENCE, HOLMES, SHARP, SAHW, LOYD, JACKSON, & PRUITT.

PINEHILL was nick-named RAKE-POCKET in ts early days. HENDERSON HILLIN supposed to be earliest settler, and it was unintentional. Said to have been traveling through the area in an ox wagon and ran out of feed, so he just built a cabin, started a feed crop, and a new town was born. He wrote friends in Alabama, Georgia and Mississippi and by 1848 the REESE, BUCKNER & WHITE Families joined him. Other early families here were: WATKINS, BRIDGES, DURAN, WYLIE, SANDERS, BARLOW, ROUSSEAU, SHAW, OSBORNE, DUNN, MILNER, HICKEY, COOPER.

Down through the ages many famous, infamous and unique persons have known Rusk County, some of them here for a long time, others only temporary. Special mention should be made of GENERAL SAM HOUSTON, J. PINCKNEY HENDERSON, GENERAL THOMAS J. RUSK, WILLIAM JENNINGS BRYAN, LWILKE SAKKAN, R. ANDERSON JARDINE, & FRANK DALTON. The last three probably are some of the unusual ones. Wearing a big white hat, flowing long white hair, a mustache and goatee and went under the name of FRANK DALTON. Afterwards he admitted he was JESSE JAMES the outlaw, but he was never able to convince the courts of this. It is a known fact that he knew plenty about the DALTONS the JAMES, YOUNGERS & WILLIAM QUANTRELL under whose flag he fought during the Civil War.

COMMUNITIES: Another unusual person, KWILKE SAKKAN, who came to Rusk and chose to remain was a native of Africa, a member of the Kamatakke Tribe of Hottentot. When 12 years old he was captured by the fighting Zulus who nailed him to a sacrificial stone and lighted a funeral pyre at his feet. American Missionaries rescued him and brought him to America. He was traveling with a circus when it came to East Texas. He liked the land so well he stayed, married and lived in Texas, appearing many times speaking and comparing life in America with that of Africa.


Another unusual person, R. ANDERSON JARDINE, was a little-known vicar of St. Paul's Church at Darlington, England, spent only a few short days in Rusk County, Texas, yet when he died several years later in Bedford, England the news fell heavly upon the people of Rusk as well as millions around the world. BISHOP R. ANDERSON JARDINE is the man who performed the marriage ceremony for the Duke and Duchess of Windsor after EDWARD abdicted as King of England "to marry the woman I love".

RUSK COUNTY, TEXAS, verily a giant in the early counties of this area, and the past deserves a tribute, but in the words of HENRY WADSWORTH LONGFELLOW

"Look not mournfully to the Past. It comes not back again. Wisely improve the Present. It is thine. Go forth to meet the shadowy Future, without fear, and with a manly heart!"

NOTE # 2

LEE - LEIGH - LEIGH

There were at least five, and possibly more, different families of Lees in early Natchitoches Parish according to descendants of the families. Because of this, note # 2 cannot be published in one issue; James Lee of Tenn., Zachariah Lea of N.C., Francis B. Lee of Georgia, another family, Patrick O. Lee, is probably not related to the above.

# 2A There were two brothers, James and William who came from Lea Hall, Cheshire, England to Virginia circa 1739. There was another Lea, John C., who either came with them or very shortly afterwards, whose relationship to the two brothers is not known, but certainly they came to Virginia about the same time, lived in close proximity there and all three moved to N.C. ca 1750-51 settling at a place afterwards named for them, Leasburg.

James Lea, the oldest of the immigrants, is the ancestor of this particular family in Tenn. He was born in England 1718, came to Virginia between 1739 and 1740, and died 2 June 1788. His will was proved in Caswell County Court, North Carolina March 1792, but was made in Orange County. He married Anne Tolbert and had several children but only six are known to the author:


