IMPORTANT DATES RELATING TO TEXAS

Mini-Notes by Fern Ainsworth

- 1689 The word "TEXAS" began to develop into a definite geographical name.
- 1690 De Leon and Father Masanet reached the Nebedache village of Indians in what is now the Northeast part of Houston County, where the San Pedro Creek empties into the Neches River, and there established the mission San Francisco de los Texas. The area became known as "THE TEXAS PROVINCE".
- 1715 Spain occupied the country making headquarters at San Antonio, and the country officially designated "NEUVAS PHILIPINAS" in honor of Philip V, but the name TEXAS was so firmly fixed that since 1690 has been called nothing else.
- 1685 - 1821 There were 20 county names connected with history of Texas during the Spanish Period.
- 1685 La Salle landed on coast at Matagorda Bay.
- 1693 Mission San Juan Bautista founded on the Rio Grande.
- 1715 St. Denis captured and taken to San Juan Bautista.
- 1716 Mission Purissima Concepcion de Aeuua founded.
- 1718 Presidio of Bexar named for Duke of Bexar of Spain.
- 1719 France invaded this part of Texas and drove away priests and soldiers.
- 1719 Belisle (a Frenchman) placed in charge of 1000 persons sent to settle in Louisiana, sailed too far west and landed at Matagorda Bay. He and 4 companions went to shore to hunt, became lost in the woods and the vessels left them.
- 1721 Marquis of Aguayo expedition to East Texas.

- 1722 Presidio and mission established, called La Bahia.
- 1731 Mission San Francisco las Texas was moved to the river 12 miles below San Antonio, and the mission Purissima Concepcion de Aeuna up the river - now located at lower suburb of City of San Antonio.
- 1731 Villa of Bexar established on San Antonio River at site of the City of Antonio.
- 1746 Captain Oribio Bastera made first recorded Spanish expedition to the Lower Trinity.
- 1751 San Jacinto River named by Spanish friars when trying to pass through, could not because of so many hyacinths.
- 1756 San Augustine de Ahumada presidio founded on the Trinity River.
- 1756 Small mission on Ayish Bayou which runs through San Augustine County and connects with San Augustine Presidio.
- 1757 Presidio San Saba de las Amarillas and the Mission San Saba on that river.
- 1763 French and Indian War ended with France ceding everyting east of Mississippi to England and everything west to Spain.
- 1798 Philip Nolan captured and killed.
- 1818 J. V. Hecke, German, travelled through Texas and wrote back advising Germans to emigrate to Texas
- 1820 Joseph L. Bays, a Baptist Minister, preached at Sabine River in Louisiana. Met on Texas side in Joseph Hinds house. There were also Martin Parmer, a Methodist, and Billie Cook, a Universalist, preachers in the area.

In Vol. XVIII, page 178 and seq. of the William and Mary Quarterly Historical Magazine, there was given the report of the clerk of Hungars parish, showing the births, deaths and marriages for the year beginning March 25, 1660, and ending March 25, 1661. I now give below the report made to the monthly court for the year following, that is, from March 25, 1661 to March 25, 1662. This interesting item from the old records of this county is found in the Book of Deeds, Wills, &c, for the years 1657 to 1660. John Lawrance seems to have been the only parish clerk who took the trouble to file his returns in the clerk's office. Or it is possible that in moving the office around from house to house in those days the reports were destroyed along with many other original papers.

Consequently, it is highly probably that blacks who have reason to believe their ancestors lived in southeastern Conn. will find their roots in this volume.

The bulk of the volume consists of two alphabetical lists of names, one for blacks with surnames, and one for blacks without surnames. A third section gives information on unidentified blacks, arranged by town. A ten-page genealogy of one Carter family illustrates how this information can be used to construct a family history.

The information was gathered from census records, vital records, cemetery records and grave stones, church and war records.

Sandy Run settlement, N.C. may have begun as early as the 1750's. Some people went there from Virginia to avoid the heavy tobacco tax and were not eager to have the Crown find them. Their homesteads had often been occupied for years before the owners applied for a grant of land.

Because so many people lived on or near Sandy Run Creek, it was logical for them to establish a place of worship. The Anabaptist Church was organized in 1772 and it drew members from a wide area. Deeds for Church members show them living as far east as Kings Mountain, south down to present South Carolina, west as far as the North Pacolet and Green Rivers and north to upper portions of Knob Creek of First Broad River. Mooresboro, as a place name, came into being when Lemuel Moore gave the name to the post office established on Oct. 26, 1819.

A composite list of Sandy Run Church membership rolls, dated 1782, 1804, 1814 and 1846 attempts to provide some information about these early members. Each roll offers comments, such as "dis" or "dead". These comments are shown first under the information heading on the list and then any other available information. An asterisk by the side of the name on the membership roll indicates that person is named on the deed list. This deed list separated by Creeks and Rivers follows the Church roll.

Military service rolls for Revolutionary, War of 1812, 1838 Cherokee Removal and Civil Wars are given. There is also a brief history of Mooresboro. It is a 5½ X 8½ book - soft cover - 50 pages. Each section is indexed as written.

This is the Catholic Church records from Vols. 1 and 2 Vancouver and from Stellamaris Mission. The records were made by Catholic Fathers Francois Norbert Blanchet and Modeste Demers, the first priests to enter the Oregon Country. They arrived in 1838 with the Hudson's Bay Company Brigade but were not in the employ of the Company. They kept records of the baptisms, marriages and births made along the way, after their arrival at Fort Vancouver and on their various missions to other forts, establishments and Indian villages. The records cover the years 1838 - 1860 and are followed by a complete index. The last 82 pages of the book are the annotations added by Harriet Duncan Munnick. These were made to round out wherever possible the personalities of those whose record of birth, baptism, marriage or death is recorded in the Church Registers. For this, she relied on the original sources, in the main what their neighbors said or wrote about them at that time, what the Priests wrote in their correspondence, what census, land and pension records and cemetery stones could add. This is a very helpful addition to researchers.

This book contains all the known descendants of William Bateman of London, England, Charleston and Concord, Massachusetts and Fairfield, Connecticut. It is composed of three sections each of which is an index complete in itself. While the indexes are interlocking each has a specific function.

The first index is an alphabetical list of Batemans by capitalized first name(s) along the left margin of page. These names so capitalized are known descendants of William and their relationship to him is shown by arabic numeral. Below the capitalized name are the names of father, grandfather and great grandfather. On the righthand margin the name of the spouse is given. All known information - birth, death, marriage dates, etc. are given for both the Bateman and spouse. The names of all known children are listed.

The second index is an index by first names of the wives of each Bateman. This index is not usually provided, but it provides specifically for researchers from other families who need to locate a female member by first name only.

The third section of the book is a standard surname index of all surnames found in first two indexes. There is a Bibliography of Bateman data and genealogies.

The Bateman Connection is written so as to encompass all available resources, both written and oral, and is the product of care and cautious scrutiny. It is 8½ X 11 - hard back cover, 300 pages.

In 1709, seeking a safer home and better economic conditions in America, Justus and his father, Johannes with their families started their trip to America - Johannes died along the way but the remainder arrived in New York in 1710.

After a couple of years along the Hudson, they moved to the Philadelphia area. In 1731, Jost Hite moves his family to the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia.

Although his baptismal record shows his name as Hans Justus Heyd, there were many versions in America and the author chose to use Jost Hite, the simplist and the spelling most frequently used.

Much of Ralph Connor's information was published with (1) Henry Z. Jones, who told of the Hite family in Germany and with (2) Klaus Wust, who wrote of Jost Hite in Virginia. This first Minute Book of Lawrence Co., TN is known locally as the "Davy Crockett Docket". The famed frontiersman is listed many times throughout these recorded proceedings, as he was an early Justice of the Peace of the county. This is the first of several volumes to be published over the next few years. Primarily, these volumes deal with Bible family and marriage records which were literally torn from family Bibles and family record books and submitted with the pension application made by the widow of the Revolutionary War Soldier (or his heirs) to help establish that the widow was married to the Revolutionary War soldier, as required by the Act of Congress under which she was applying. Some of the Bible and family records include information from more than one generation of the family, therefore, more than one surname is often recorded. In Vol. I there are over 950 marriages, 375 ministers, J. P.'s, etc. 200 Bible and family records (including a few town clerk records), 1350 different surnames and 3700 names in the full name index.
