Our organization had worked hard to buy the 1880 and 1900 Soundex of Louisiana and Mississippi. Being the Editor has limited my visits to the library; however, before Christmas I just "chucked" everything and went right in the middle of Christmas shopping. I had no idea when or where my grandmother, Mary Elizabeth Jones, married my grandfather, William Plesant Channell - but low and behold - I looked at the 1880 marriage Soundex of Mississippi and there they were - married Oct. 16, 1880 in Sumner County (now Webster County), Miss. After sending off for the marriage license, upon receipt I found a JONES had signed the bond (possibly her father or older brother). I wrote back to Mrs. June L. Castle, Circuit Clerk, Walthall, Miss. to ask if she could make out the initials of the J (?) Jones. She could not make out the original either.

In 1982 I will not put off the JONES any longer, sometimes if we just jump in, it is surprising what we find. Since most of my research has been on my husband's family, my "find" was a real joy to start the new year.

I encourage you to go to the nearest library or archives where they have a Soundex on the state you are interested. You might not find anything, but the odds are greater that you will. They have the Soundex of Arkansas at Southwest Regional Archives in Washington, Ark. Mary Medearis makes you feel most welcome. If you live in the Ark-La-Tex area, it is a nice one-day get-away. If you are outside the Ark-La-Tex area, both Shreveport, La. and Washington, Ark. have excellent food and lodging facilities.

The La. State Archives' Workshop, held Nov. 9-10, 1981, was a great success. More of us Louisianians need to get involved in our State Archives. Charlene Cain and Nancy Veginat are trained to assist researchers having historical and genealogical interests. The search room at the Louisiana State Archives is open to the public from 3:00 A.M - 4:30 P.M., Monday thru Friday.

LETTERBOOK OF THE NATCHITOCHES - SULPHUR FORK FACTORY 1809-1821 Submitted by Juanita Racine & Jeanie Boyett Continued from JULY 1981 GENIE - Page 150

Extracting this document, which is over 170 years old, was most difficult. Though Juanita Racine, Ruth Billimek & I (Jeanie Boyett) read and re-read this, there still may be errors in names and figures since this was written in script during the French and Spanish era. You must relate this to the time and verbal expression of the people at this trading post since Natchitoches was a hodge-podge of ethnic groups. We inserted a question mark or substituted a word where we felt doubt existed. We hope these dispatches will help preserve a part of Louisiana heritage.

26th August 1809

Gen. John Moran Supt. of trade Sir

On opening receipt No. 7 of Invoice 12th August 1808 instead of 12 pr 22 Pt Blankets as Invoiced, it contained 12 pt blue strands making a difference of \$210. 29/100 for which I have given credits in our books.

The lateness of the coming out of these goods that I expected to have received before this with the experience of former seasons convince me that inferior advantage would result to the establishments if the goods were shipped in the fall so as to arrive at the place of destination in the month of Feb or March -At the southern the trade commences in the latter month and continues with little variation till Aug & Sept after which the demands is principally for small & ornamental articles & for little amounts - by the present arrangement of shipping in the spring & summer when articles are selected from the assortment & the rest lie by almost useless for near six months whereas were we to receive them just as the trade commences our assortment would be most complete at the very time it would be most wanted to be by which we should not only receive the furs & peltries that are brought in but the money to which is sometimes considerable & is generally reserved to purchase what we have not in store - It will be perhaps be objected that we might so to make our calculations that our assortments would be always complete but when it is understood that we make our arrangements for the month Eyears that the trade raised in different years & that the Indians change some of their minor fashions as well as the whites - the almost impractibility of always keeping up an assortment will be admitted I think without difficulty especially when it is your wish that no more articles may be called for than can be disposed of in one year. Our remittances won't be made in a shorter time from the date of the invoice than they are at present and the water would be in a better state for navigating more particularly Red River which

after the month of July is embarrased with many difficulties that do not exist in good water - These difficulties frequently cause considerable argumentations on the cost of freight besides the opportunities of forwarding from Orleans being more uncertain

From our sales which have amounted since 1st Jany to near 11,000 \$ you will readily believe that we have but articles on hand at this time - There is not more than 6 or 7 lbs (?) Powder 100 lbs Lead no flints but 4 or 5 Blankets - no linens checks handkerchiefs (?) shirts - knives in fact we are almost destitute of everything except strands of calicoes & the strands would have been sold long since had I known they were in store - If a si2; u ptjer tjam tje one now expected does not come so as to arrive at or about the time promised we shall do but little business next year

A metal has been discovered about 100 miles distant from the Pawnie villages that are on Red River which from its nature of appearance we think must be platina - - A. W. Glass who returned from that country this spring brought with him two pieces taken from a mass lying on the surface of the earth weighing as he supposed 10,000 lbs - This metal appears to be unmixed with any kind of ore or other substance - It is harder than iron & like it attracted by the magnet the not so powerfully & is so tenacious that in cutting it requires to be cut entirely off before the parts will separate - is not affected by such acids as are to be procured at this place - takes a fine polish & will not fuse in a Blacksmith fire - Mr. Glass observes that it may be procured in large quantities & that the Indians make use of it to point the arrows - A piece was given to Mr. Irwin when he left this for Phila to ascertain by the chemist there the real nature of whether it is platina - If it should be would it not be worth while to encourage a trade for it with the Indians - I rather think this is what was said to be the silver ore that abounded in the part of country occupied by the Pawnies & of which mention was made in one of my former communications -Its relative value as to other metals is not known here -

The freedom of this communication. with its length I trust will be executed as it has preceded from a wish to benefit an establishment in which I am sure you take no little interest - Whether the benefit will be ideal or real its with great deference submitted to you -

I read by the same mail a letter from Mr. Saul in which he informs me that two items in his account were objected by you by reason of their being incurred for my private use - I never knew Mr. Saul had charged them on the one for \$61 75/100 I had here at the time it was due & supposed my father paid the other of \$16 - as Mr. Saul never notified me of it - as my father is in the habit of paying small sums of that nature for me - The receipt of \$61 75/100 is enclosed as I have no duplicate of it I must bet the favor of its being returned as it is included in the amount of \$200 allowed for furniture which is holding myself accountable for I presume it is not necessary to render vouchers -

I had thought from some observations made by you and George Logan (?) when I had the honor of conversing with you then - that inventories would not be called for every quarter - in the month of June it is particularly inconvenient - I have been obliged on several instances to detain large parties of Indians 2 or 3 days - but had it not been for my error of conception I should have rendered one each quarter - The a/c current I have neglected because it states nothing I had hoped it would have been superseded by a better form - but for the future your directions shall be strictly attended to in making up my accounts - the a/c current with the list of balances for the quarters that are wanting shall be forwarded - Inventories were not then taken therefore cannot be had -

The goods shipped from Baltimore in July are near to hand - they will come quite too late for the present year and will be much too short for the ensuing - we have had no powder since 20th Sept last - Carps (?) will be insufficient - The Kentucky Powder has a bad reputation in this country that of Duponts is the best American Powder that has ever been here & is preferred infinately before any other by the Indians - of the Samples sent F & F F glazed are the best for this Post - Mr. Saul sent me 3000 lbs lead in June last & by his letter of advice used with yours I observe he has forwarded 1521 lbs in addition and gun flints or strands are sent by him -

We shall want in addition to this invoice for the ensuing year Callicoes, spl (?) blankets, strands blue & red , scarlet cloth, rifles & powder the quantity (as I observe you have curtailed all those articles scarlet cloth excepted) you will judge of when you see our invertory and observe I am & the store is - if the kind of callicoes described are not to be had they may be substituted by what is called primitive callicoe great quantities of which I saw in Phila for sale at low prices - I have a piece of scarlet cloth & I shall be obliged to return on a/c of its high price & object particularly to that quality when shown me in Georgetown

The Sentinal at this time is of much more importance than at the time when the arrangement was made that you attended to - As we had but little in store then - , whereas at present our store is nearly full - if furnishing 3 men the Sentinal will be withdrawn I must prefer retaining the Sentinal -

THE "CAMPO" CEMETERY

Santa Barbara - Sao Paulo State - Brazil Compiled by Betty Antunes De Oliveira

This cemetery, known as "O Cemiterio dos Americanos" is located between Santa Barbara and Americana on a sugar cane plantation. No one knows how many have been buried there since July 1868 when Mrs. Beatrice E. Oliver was the first to be buried.

The cemetery is located on property which belonged to her husband, A. T. Oliver. The Brazilian law at that time did not permit any non-Roman-Catholic people to be buried in the official cemetery.

If the American Colony ever had a book in which the death of its members was registered, it disappeared. There are many graves not identified. In 1954 the "Fraternal Society of American Descendants" was formed in order to maintain the links of brother good among the descendants of those first families and to maintain the cemetery.

Col. Wm. E. Norris was the earliest born person buried in the cemetery (1800 - 1893). The first to be buried there in an urn after being cremated in Sao Paulo was Walye Dyer McMullan; he died on 20 July 1978. The oldest person buried there is Lorena P. Green (1874 - 1977) aged 103 years.

WASHINGTON CEMETERY

The Washington Cemetery is located 1/2 mile northwest of Washington, Arkansas. It was established in 1862 on 5 acres of land purchased by the Presbyterian Church from W. W. Andrews. It is still under the auspices of the Presbyterian Church.

The cemetery is well kept and most of it is in family plots which sold for \$50.00 to \$100.00 each. Each plot is 20' X 24' and will hold 10 graves. There are approximately 75 Confederate soldiers buried here and a large monument erected by the citizens of Washington stands at the rear near the center of the cemetery. It was built around 1900 Although the cemetery was established in 1862, there are monuments dating back as far as 1838.

Mobile, Ala. July 15th 1863 Mrs. Mary E. Nobles

Dear lady - I avail my self to Write you a few lines in ancer to your kind letter concerning the death of your Husban you wanted to no how long he was sick he was sick about two Weeks with the tiffoid fever during Which time he talked a great deel a bout you and his Dear children and a bout home it appeard that it was his hole study I tried all that I could to get him off home on furlooh but could not do it he was sent to the hospital and then I could not Get the chance to see him any more I staid with him all that I could till he was sent off to the hospital I was not at his burial I was on gard at the time he was Buried But Cain was thare and said he was Buried very nise we throwed in money to send him home and filed to get a furlooh for a man to cary him home he was kept out of the grown two days trying to get a furlow to send him home and failed to get it so we had to burie him at Mobile his number in the grave yard is 334 and his name is on the headbord and the dait he died the money that was made up to send him was made use of in puting him away it cost a bout 35 dollars to put him nise I will send his cloths home to you the first chance and your sissors with them and as for my trouble you are welcome to it and a thousan times as much for I think it no trouble to me when I think of those he has left behind his desolate family who now has to morne his loss forever it is a solemn thing to think of yours and thousand more being left in the same condition and perhaps thousand more before this War shal end you said you had lost the best friend you ever had or ever should have it is hard But we must put our Trust in him who has said I will be a father to the fatherless and a husban to the Widow I hope he is gone to Heaven for I dont reglect of heare of his making use of any bad language since he has bin in camp he was well thought of by all the company he was a good soldier and his officers thought a grate deal of him and would have sent him home if they could have done it while I am Writing there has nome orders for a hundred men of us to be sent up to enterprise for something and I don't now what P. S. I will close By saying to you that I am well at this time and hope this may find you and family enjoying the same blessing give all my friends my Love So fare Well I remain your Friend as ever truly till Death

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NATCHITOCHES PARISH, LOUISIANA NOTES

The NASH FAMILY of North Carolina, I think, should be titled THE NASH FAMILIES of North Carolina. However, almost all articles I have read do not connect or even attempt to connect the various families. Be that as it may, you will usually find the names of ABNER, THOMAS, MICHAEL and FRANCIS appearing in each family if they had that many male children.

I quote one of the most used paragraphs in any NASH FAMILY History you may reas. "Abner Nash, a native of Virginia, came to North Carolina in 1763. He was a delegate to the Revolutionary Congress in the province, a member of the Council of Safety, Speaker of the first House of Commons after the Revolution, Speaker of the Senate, governor of the state (1780-1781), and a delegate to the Continental Congress (1782-1786). He was one of the closest friends of the Blounts, particularly William Blount, whom he made guardian of his son, Abner (Ashe - Biographical History of North Carolina. Vol. I 403-404)". One has to be very careful in quoting printed histories - authentic as they may be. I have read this particular quote in may books, etc., but I think the statement should be studied and deeper research is indicated.

There is an interesting item from THE BLOUNT PAPERS (Archives at Raleigh North Carolina) in a letter from WILLIAM BLOUNT to John Gray Blount 1783, and I quote: "Can you tell me what to do with my Ward Abner Nash (See copy of Abner Nash Will in the Frank Nash Papers, 1775-1797 N.C. Dept. Archives and History, 12 Dec. 1786) for I never was more at a loss what to do with anything then with him, Mrs. Nash declares she can keep him no longer, no merchant, lawyer nor in short no decent person here will take him on any terms and my wife is much opposed to his living with me, and as T. Ogden is to live with me in the future I have hardly room for him and if I had I have not the Colour of business for him."

There is much more in the letter, but I only quote this much of mis letter concerning his ward, Abner Nash), but there is much more relative to Abner Nash in the letter.

A typical account of this family is as follows: (Dictionary of American Biography by Dumas Malone.)

"John Nash emigrated from Wales to Virginia about 1730. He married Ann Owen and they had these children: 1. Abner, born circa 1740 at Templeton Manor, late Prince Edward Co., Amelia in hay be they and they may be. I to 2. Francis, 3. Thomas.

Abner removing to North Carolina in 1762 settled at Halifax. He married (1) Justina (Davis) Dobbs (widow of Governor Dobbs--from same section of Ireland as the Nashes). Married (2) Mary Whiting Jones. Abner was Governor of North Carolina and as a Regulator gained considerable reputation in the Revolutionary War." and Enpire 1715-1715 U.C. F., A. L. M. M. M. M. M. M. L. P. L.

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Following is the author's comment: Note the Nashes came from Wales, and also from Ireland, the same section as the Dobbs. This could have happened, but one wonders if sufficient research was conducted before making the statements.

In an account of Abner Nash, Governor of N.C., given by Frank Nash and printed and reprinted many times, gives the typical story. Abrer was son of John Nash and Ann Owen and were the first in North Carolina giving very little different data as others.

The tradition that the Nashes came to this country, or even to N.C. about 1730 can be found in almost all the publications of the life of these men. Existing records prove this to be incorrect. We know the Nashes who came to N.C. came from Virginia, and it is possible they were closely connected with the ones in Maryland, and in fact may have been closer to the New England families than has been heretofore noted. It should be noted also that many of the families into which the Nash Families married belonged to the Qua ker belief.

In my research the first mention I find of any Nash in N.C. is that of Frances, 21 Nov 1695, and it is shown below as it appears in the instrument itself.

This bill bindeth me Richard Burtenshall my haires Executors or Administrators to pay or Case to be paid Unto Joseph Chew his haires or asignes the full and Juyst some of three pounds tenn shllines courant mony to be paid in Good Fatt Beafe or porke to the Receiver Liken upon my now dwelling plantation or some where Conveniently in Corrotock precinct as witness my hand this 21st of November 1695.

Witness
Frances Nash his marke
Harvey (Mecerell) his marke

This Bill Proved in Open Court this 31st of Jeniuary Anno 1698/9. Attestes by mee John Bennett Clarke. (This man's name is not John Bennett Clarke but John Bennett - Clerk) Note that in some areas Clerk is still pronounced Clark.

Because there are so many conflicting stories pertaining to a particular family of Abner Nash, the dates the Nashes came to America, the date they came into North Carolina, and the parents of Abner it seems the problem occurred due to so many of the wives' nam being Anne. Tradition and oral family data sometimes becomes facts when they are not true facts. Sometimes generations can cause a conflict of dates and parents' names. I am reminded of one family whose oldest living relative, about 90 years old with a keen mind and a good knowledge of his ancestors told everyone his grandfather's name was Edward. The truth of the matter

was that Edward was the immigrant ancestor and in that vein he called him his grandfather, while his real grandfather's name was something entirely different. It caused researchers much work to prove to members of the family the old man was speaking generally instead of specifically.

From the July issue of this publication I have listed many Nashes who came to America before 1700, and the typical story about the Nash Family coming to America about 1730 is wrong, as well as the statement the first Nash into North Carolina was after 1730 is incorrect also.

There have been many publications naming the brothers of Abner and some of the authors give Abner's children. Following is typical: (Malone page 383) John and Anne (Owen) Nash of Templeton Manor, Prince Edward County, Virginia, had the following children:

I. Abner born ca 1740 Married (1) Justin (Davis) Dobbs about 1770, the widow of Governor Dobbs Married (2) Mary (Whiting) Jones

Children:

1. Fredercik

1762 removed to Halifax, North Carolina 1770's removed to New Bern, North Carolina Member of House of Burgesses 1779 Governor of North Carolina

2. Francis Nash born 1742 Married Sarah Moore Died October 7, 1777

The below data - as taken from the D.A.R., Vol. 5, page 192

Mary Nash was the mother of Francis Nash, who in 1775 was lieutenant colonel of the First North Carolina Regiment. In 1777 he was made Brigadier General of the Continental army and died of wounds received at Germantown. On the day of his funeral Washington requested "All officers whose circumstance will admit of it, will attend and pay their respects to the brave man who died for his country."

Nash County, North Carolina was named in his honor, as was the city of Nashville, Tennessee.

You will note from the genealogy appearing in Malone's record gives only two children of John and Anne. Other publications give the names of 4 brothers and 3 sisters. In the will of Abner Nash he mentions at least 5 children.

In the above genealogy it mentions only one brother of Abner, (Francis) yet we find 6 March 1769 Chowan County, North Carolina, will of Thomas Nash and he names his brother, Abner as guardian to his children, so we know Abner had a brother, Thomas. approach to the z nemiu ...

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Abner's will he mentions 5 children, and we know he appointed William Blount as guardian of his son, Abner, Jr. (See this article as taken from the Blount Papers regarding Abner, Jr. in a letter from William to John Gray Blount 1788.

The 1790 Federal Census of North Carolina lists the following Nashes as head of households (A census cannot be always relied upon, and there are many errors, but they are a good springboard for further research).

One suggestion may help some of you who have found information in a quarterly. Check later issues for corrections. I know everyone is as careful as possible, but occasionally some errors do get printed and I notice they are often corrected in the next publication.
