

This season of the year is a reminder that the date of the annual Workshop is rapidly advancing. Our lecturer this year will be the well known lecturer and genealogist, Rita B. Worthy. One of the saddest articles I have ever read in a Genealogical Quarterly is mentioned here, and I hope the response will be overwhelmingly fruitful. I quote a few excerpts and then abridge the rest. Quote "There was no January issue due to major disasters we have had. On Jan. 11, 1982 fire destroyed our home and HISTORICAL TRAILS LIBRARY. On April 3rd a tornado came through our county and destroyed our barns, timber, fences, and the trailer we were living in." She goes on to state that the LIBRARY is again open due to donations of books, records, quarterlies, etc., by the public. She states the mimeograph she bought after the fire was so damaged by the tornado it was not usable. I think Genealogical organizations as well as individuals should immediately rush to help this library. The name of the quarterly is THE ANCESTRAL CIRCLE - Southern Genealogical records - Editor Mrs. Mary Estes Beckham, Rt. 1, Box 373, Philadelphia, MS 39350. I would hate for my records, books, etc. to be lost, and I am sure mine do not have the exposure nor help others as much as this library does, so please let us all help.

The next item is one of great interest to everyone who is interested in the securing preservation of records. It deals with an archives for the State of Louisiana. Money for this has been appropriated three times and somehow it just never comes to fruition. The money, although appropriated for an archives, is funneled into another item and the archives is never built. In regard to this Dr. Donald Lemieux, State Archivist has requested all members of this organization to call the <u>GOVERNOR</u>, <u>YOUR STATE SENATOR AND REPRESENTATIVE</u> - TOLL FREE NUMBER of the HOT LINE IS 1(800)-272-8186 - while those in the Baton Rouge area should call 342-2456. Tell the person who answers the phone that you want your Senator and Representative (Give their names) to support an amendment to provide CAPITAL OUTLAY FUNDING for construction of a new State Archives. Please let us keep this phone line HOT until we get an archives building. I appreciate the petitions that have been filled for me, resulting in at least 500 names being sent to Dr. Lemieux. Please keep them coming.

I am sure almost every organization of this nature has had problems getting their publications printed and mailed out, and I am sure the machine they use has something to do with this. This organization is no different, and we had been saving for a new printer realizing it would take some time before we could afford even a new mimeograph. Every organization should have a MABLE WOLFE because when she saw our efforts, she very unobtrusively offered to purchase new equipment for printing. We had hoped to buy a new Gestetner mimeograph, but I am happy to announce that the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association has a new A.B. Dick offset printer, along with a new A.B. Dick Copier. All of this because of the generosity of this lady, and my heartfelt thanks goes out to her and I say THANK YOU, Mable! The greatest thing I could wish for each of you struggling organizations who do so much for the Genealogical Community, is a MABEL WOLFE. I am sure I express the sentiment of each member of the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Assn. in conveying our gratitude.

Cusseta Cass Co. Texas August the 28th 1876 Mrs Mary E Nobles Our Kind Friend

We for the purpose of answering Your Most kind and welcome letter Seat ourselves this morning we were very proud to hear from you all and hear that you were all well. This may inform you that we are all up but Maminy (?) she has had an atattack of Fever and is not clear of Fever yet but is better than she has been but she had a right tight Spell and is not over it yet but I hope she will get along very well now but Mary my children some of them are never well Garoline has been in bad health for about four years or more with Nerve or Muscle disease like unto Saint Vitus dance but has been gradually mending for about two years and is now as fleshy as you ever saw her and we think she will finally get well at last off after being under the Doctors for several years but She is writing this letter and Babe is under the Dr. at this time and has been about a year She has a spinal afflecttion She is improving though She never has been confined to her bed at all But has suffered a great deal and suffers yet with her Back Nealie is not very Healthy you know she never was her throat troubles her a great deal it is sorter like Fada Anns used to be Janey I believe is alright yet and Budy they are tolerably healthy yet we all enjoy ourselves very well for all our bad luck and health we never have had much good luck since we came here and we might call it good luck too I recon a part of it any how Mary none of the children has never married yet and seems like they are like you say yours are they dont intend to soon but perhaps it will be time enough for their good I was very glad to hear that your boys was so Smart for you have had such a hart time in this world we heard directly you went out there to Louisiana that you had married Old Nr Welden but never got the strait of it and maybe there was no strait to it Mary we all want to see you so much that we cant write we were So glad to hear from Lydia give her and family our love and best respects we would be so glad to See her and all of you we were sorry to hear of your Ma.s death but it is a debt we have all got to pay Sonner or later and maybe it was the best for her She has Seen so much trouble

Mary I would like to hear from Loucy whether she ever got well of them fits or not what has become of her since her Ma died we heard Lucy had done very bad but if she has we should like to know what has become of her any how Mary I would be glad if you would come to Texas if you would come to see us for we all want to see you and hear you talk and talk to you we have a very good crop this year especially corn - cotten is not as good as it seems like it ought to be this is a toleable good farming country nothing extra though but take everything as it

comes and I think it is a mighty good country to live in there is a good Society hear as there is almost any where we all like this country and are well satisfied Mary write to us as soon you get this and direct your letters to Cusseta Cass County Texas we live nearer Cusseta than we do to Douglassville John Bonds and Cull live in about a mile of us John is down with a spell of Bilious fever and Willie is having the chills Louisa is got a big boy about 6 or 7 months old he is a big fat boy his name is John Marshall Hariet has one about a year old it is a girl James Channell went out west this year he lives Coryelle to Texas they were very Bad dissatisfied And says they are coming back here this fall he stayed here one year before he went out west and Carrie wanted to go So She could be close to her Ma and the last _____ we heard from her She had not Seen her Ma they are all scattered about Mightly Carrie and her folk. Mary the children all send their love to you and your children and say tell you to be sure and to come to see us if you do come to Texas I recon you will get tired of reading this uninteresting letter Mary Martha Cain is living in about 6 miles of us and her son in law and daughter but her Son Jin never came She came last fall I recon Jiney will marry and come this fall Martha is in bad health I don't know but she has consumption she has a very bad cough and has for some time well we will close for this time write soon and let us hear from you from Martha Channell and family to Mary E. Nobles and family

The following note was received from Merle & Edwin Stevens, 1707 3rd, Brownwood, TX 76801, along with several copies of Civil War letters.

Dear Jeanie -- In regards to the Jan 1992 issue of "The Genie" I would like to comment on pg. 17, Clairborne Parish Cemetery submitted by Carolyn P. Avery. Several years ago, this cemetery was in "The Genie" and then again, I submitted it in the April 1980 issue with additional information. The cemetery is called either Wilson or New Hope, as this was the place of the New Hope Church at one time I believe. I do not descend directly from these people as I.H. Stevens was a brother to my great grandfather. I.H. Stevens' father-in-law was WALTON (not Walter) WILSON as well as his first cousin. I wasn't sure if you might want to run the name of this cemetery and when it was published before or not.

To add interest to the cemetery, just in the past few months, a cousin who lives in Homer, La. has become interested in genealogy, and he has come up with some fantastic records from my La. rel tives. He does descend from I.H. Stevens and has gathered the original Amensty Oath for WALTON WILSON and 4 Civil War letters Walton Wilson wrote to his wife. He is on the trail of other Civil War records & letters. I'm sending copies on to you in case you want to try and transcribe them for publication. If you would like, I'll send copies of the others, if and when I get them.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Wilson or New Hope Cemeter was in pg. 96 of the April 1980 GENIE. A Claiborne Pr., La. Cemetery appeared on pg. 17 of the Jan. 1982 GENIE, and was not titled when submitted for publication. We do try to publish all material sent us, but will try to be more cautious in the future about reprints.

Linchburge February 11, 1862

Dear Wife

I seat myself this morning to let you no where I am and what I am a doing. I am here in this hospital I had the measels and I haint got over them yet nor wont (?) in a week or two as quick as I get able to travel I have to try to get a discharge and come home. I wrote to mother that I thought if I could get a discharge that I would get home by the first of June but if I do by the first of July I think I will do well if I can return (? there but several doctors said that I could if I would be examined - if allow to be at this place and if I can get off I will come home as soon as I can. This makes five different hospitals that I have been in since I left home.

Sicily you ort to see what a pretty boquet I had sent to me just know the ladyes in town are continually a (?) them in to the soldiers there is some of the pretyist flowers right here you ever saw if I can I will get some of the sead

of them and bring them home with me.

Sicily I want you to write to me as soon as you get this letter I drimp last knight that I received a letter from you when you write want you to wright a bought all of their (?) connection as to their health and when you hear (?) from Walkers and Eyers kids and whether they are well and how they are a getting along and all of the neighbors generally.

Sicily I want you to tell Mr. A. Thompson if he pleases that I want him to cut my wheat and hall it to his gin and thrash it and pay himself ought off they wheat or ought of that bacon if he did take it and he will oblige me very mutch by so doing. Well Sicily this is the third tryal I have made to wright this letter today I am so week that I caint sit up ten or fifteen minutes at a time It is all I can do to wak across the house I am weaker and poorer than you ever saw me in this world This is after dinner and I will tell you what I had for my dinner I had two eggs a cup of butter milk and butter to go with my egg and some dryed peaches and some white jelly dryed peaches is good too Them that aint very sick lives on fresh beef with me now ought any salt on it or as good as none and light brad that would choke a dog to eat it some times a little coffee and then beef soop beef soop oftener by odds than coffee or tea sometimes they have some Pears Richmend I doant think will be our property much longer A day or two ago there was some gun boats with in twelve miles of the place and the people thinks that they will try to take it in a few days I saw a statement in a paper the other day that said we had a hundred an eighty thousand men a Corinth Mississippi I think if that many men cant hoald it no more nead not try they Yankees has got New Orlens 'You have heard that long ago. I want you to write how many companys has left a fought there in your hearing and if there (?) losing more men left the settlement and but wrote since I left those leaves me a mending slowly I am in hope they will lines find you all enjoying good health if I caint mywelf Sicily my dear take they best care of our little stock you can so if never get home or do for you and my poor little Sicily for a heep to live on but thanks be to God I have some hope of returning so no more but Remain your affectionate husband

Oakland Cemetery is the oldest cemetery in the Shreveport corporate limits. It was created by ordance on July 20, 1849. Many Confederate veterans, epidemic victims, merchants, clergy, former slaves and mayors are resting there. It was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977. There are many interesting stories - some fact, some fiction - surrounding the land. Part of the land was donated by the wife of William Bennett and later of James Cane of Cane Bennett Bluff fame. In 1858-59 an acre was purchased from the city by the Hebrew Mutual Benevolent Assn. and the first Jewish cemetery in town was founded. Most of the founders of the Hebrew Zion congregation, later B'nai Zion are found here. There is also a potter's field, termed "Place for the Friendless.' Since much distruction has befallen the cemetery in recent years, we hope that the following will in some small way help the, what was once a beautiful resting place, "To Bloom Again .

Bill Randolph and helpers copied this cemegery some time ago. This was a great effort. The cemeterv is on card file at the Shreve Memorial Library. Others looked for a legal description before this article went to print; our sincere thanks to them for their efforts - they wish to remain anonymous. There are very references to the NASHFAMILY in the Territorial Papers, but when we search the American State Papers (After the tarritory was organized into states) we find much data in the volumes dealing iwht land.

Property located 40 miles above city of Natchez in Jufferson Co.

In Vol. 5 of U.S. Territorial Papers (Miss.) Michael Nash signa petition 1802. QUESTION: Was Michael NASH the husband of Sibyl Lewis? This needs more research in Jefferson Co., Miss.

There are 2 records or Pedigree Charts which shows Martha Jane NASH marrying James Parrott. She born in Texas 1832, her father, William Nash, born in Miss. in 1801, died La.

William Nash's father is shown as William Nash, born in North Carolina, and marrying a Perkins. This Perkins Family came from Miss. to Natchitoches Parish early and lived in what is now Vernon Parish.

Other Nash Pedigrees show Robert Nash born in Georgia, a son of Colville Nash, born Laurens County, S.C., son of John Nash born 1786 N.C.; his father was also John Nash born in N. C.

The William Nash Family whose daughter, Martha Jane married James Parrott, is also related to the Wrinkle/Rinkle Family who were in Rapides and Natchitoches Parish quite early, went to Navasata, Texas and then returned to Natchitoches Parish, La. They intermarried with the Bloodworth and Halt families of Natchitoches Parish.

I have made out an a/c of the differences between your a/c current of my books marked A. If you will give me credit for the debit side of that a/c and charge me with the credit side the balance of \$283. 91/100 that you have stated against me will no longer appear. That the draft favor Cortez for \$600 should remain charged so long against me is singular when it is clear by the abstract of day book fowarded that the funds of the factory were credited by that amount in cash received for the draft on the very day of its date. I ought therefore either be credited for so much advanced the factory at that time or the charges withdrawn. For without that sum how could it have been that I held in my hand \$200. 01%/100 on 30th Sept. 1809 or that the different vouchers for the entire quarter could have been paid or what funds were taken for the payment? As by copy of cash book enclosed to you in my letter 9 May 1810 & in abstract of day book for quarter ending 31 Dec 1810 - It will be discovered that \$132. 50/100 only were received for sales during the quarter ending 31 Dec 1809 & that including \$191. 25/100 charged to myself there was paid in the same time \$273. 572/100 (vouchers for which were forwarded) leaving a balance of \$59. 73 3/4/100 in my hands 31 Dec 1809 as stated in my letter 9 May 1810 --If the trouble will be taken direct that all the cash entries of abstract of day book may be posted from 1 April when a balance is settled by Mr. Irwin was a \$180. 12/100 to 31st Dec when as above mentioned the balance was \$59. 73 3/4/100 my statement will be found exactly as I have made it not varying the tenth part of a cent -

I have in conformity with your a/c current stated the Draft in favor I. Cortez 31st Dec 1809 for \$250 to my Debit tho in my Books it is first entered to your credit - afterwards credited by cash for which it was sold - If then I am charged with cash \$441. 25/100 which includes the Draft for \$191. 25/100 credited in my a/c current now forwarded -

I mention this distinction as your copy of Cash Book forwarded 9 May 1800 Cash as credited by T M Linnard for \$441. 25/100 but charged at the same time \$250 received for the Draft -

It will be explained by referring to abstract of Day Book for that quarter ---

Last of all I had a very serious attack of billious fever that continued & sometimes during which having no person to oversee the treating of the Peltries it is probable they were slighted in that operation - I doubt if they are much injured. I was present great part of the time they were packing & for myself

Bear Skins we frequently take in a little worm eaten - they are often better, a little worm eaten in the flanks of the skin than when they have innumerable bullet holes in the best part of the skins - I have to regret extreamly that cause of complaint should be given & promise if ever a similar accident occurs again while the factory is under my charge to hold myself accountable for the Damage that may be sustained, except the loss of 50 or 100 skins yr pass on which among so great a number cannot perhaps be assorted - - we pack the skins as well as the means we have will permit a small Jack Screw is all the force we have to apply & many of those last sent were put in press a second time that the Bear Skins should be so irregularly packed so short in number I cannot account for unless they were opened by the Patron to cover other loading which is a thing so often done I presume it might have been done in this case as the Deer skins that were forwarded by the same Person differed only but one in number from the Bill of Lading & invoice it would be singular that the others which were few in number E less in the Packs should be so incorrect - I did not deem these skins more damaged that the deduction made on Invoice therefore - did not note it

I find the skin house is not sufficiently large to keep the Peltries to advantage - It will benefit the factory if you will permit another nearly of the same size to be erected - the Cost of one similar will be about \$250 - but if one could be built of Brick on this declivity of the hill so as to put the Skins under ground as it were - they would require much less beating and be much better preserved - so far south as we are latt, 31.46 the long duration of warm weather is very trying upon them -Stone is not to be had but at a very high price - there being none immediately in the vicinity of the Post - Bricks \$100 per M of a very common kind - Lime \$4 per barrel -

If shipped Deer Skins would be a good article of remittance & you will please inform me what they are worth by weight or size the price would answer a great many might be taken in - if encouragement was given to the Indians to keep them --- I have suggested this from seeing an advertisement offering for sale at George Town at auction a number of them with some furs.

I hope the Invoice of Goods you have prepared for us will arrive soon - they cannot come to soon.

Mr Smith the agent here informs me that in assorting the parcel at Natchez there was a large preportion very nice & good the 1/2 most of what I have seen was very common & hairy - he goes to Natchitoches a few days & has promised me to forward to you Samples of that which is there -

My information that the province of Texas was in the hands of Mr Magee was premature yet the known destination of a majority of the inhabitants of St. Antonio's & the declared intention of Magee to hurry on to that place without delay gave it so much the appearance of truth that it was believed here until contradicted -

The expedition is now considered as having failed owing to a number of causes, among which are the inability of the Commander, the discordant materials of which it is composed & perhaps not the last the mission of Doctor Robinson so good as use has been made of the Mexican by the Spanish authorities that no expectation is now entertained that the party will be joined

by any considerable number of natives - indeed a capitulation has been tendered & refused upon the conditions demanded which plainly indicates that no fears whatever or thought of danger may arise from it.

Although privately printed and distributed in limited numbers, these volumes have long been recognized as essential to the study of Santa Cruz history. Rowland was a tireless and dedicated researcher who taught himself Spanish in order to read the surviving documents of California's Spanish and Mexican era. Drawing on material from his newspaper column, 'Circuit Rider', and translating original Spanish letters, deeds and records, Rowland chronicled in detail the story of Santa Cruz's Mission, the rise and fall of the pueblo Branciforte, the arrival of American settlers and the County's development in the early 20th century.

This edition makes available for the first time all of Leon Rowland's historical writings about Santa Cruz. Also included is his last bock, Los Fundadores, an exhaustive genealogical register of the founding families of Northern California. The book is illustrated with photographs, many of them from the original books and contains an introduction by Sandy Lydon, Professor of History at Cabrello College. The book attempts to name specifically the inhabitants of Southwest Virginia, in particular the pioneers on the Western waters who returned into the initial settlements, beginning about 1745. The early adventurers came from diverse cultural backgrounds, migrating from Europe, Pennsylvania, Maryland, New England, the Carolinas and Eastern Virginia. Although the times were punctuated by mobility, many who traveled the major migration pathways through Southwest Virginia would settle and become adventurers on the New Holston and Clinch Rivers - the first of the Western Waters.

From original records (both official records and contemporary private papers) the home life and community development of the settlers of the New River area have been traced through the pioneer period (1745-1800). It contains information on discovery and settlement of the region under the Wood's River, Greenbrier and Loyal Company grants and specifically names the settlers who claimed land. The military records of the French and Indian War and the claims made for land in Kentucky are included. The public service claims, pension records and service records of the settlers during the American Revolution are provided. Almost 200 men of the Tory persuasion are specifically named. Those who took the Oath of Allegiance are listed.

The records of Augusta, Batetourt, Fincastle and Montgomery Counties are used to show the activities of the New River settlers.

In compiling this history of Floyd County's people and places, Dr. Wood drew on the memories of old timers in the area. Civil War veterans were still living when he began this endeavor and their recollections are a vital part of the book.

Patriotism is highlighted by references to veterans of the Revolutionary War, the War of the Rebellion and the World War. Close family ties are evident in the location of homesteads and the intermarriage of families in communities. Education is shown to be highly desirable by those that acquired it and became "well known". The establishment of various churches is recorded.

Over 100 families - Brammer, Graham, Lancaster, Lawrence, Phillips, Phlegar, Scott, Short, Spangler, Turner, Vest, Wood and many others are sketched in detail, some at greater length than others. How familiar places and watercourses in the county were named is related - truth or fiction is not known.

The 587 square miles of Hamilton County lie at the southern limits of the valley of East Tennessee and possesses the typical features of this geographic province. From 1801 to 1807 it was within the newly created county of Roane and in 1807 was carved off to be a part of Rhea County with its County Seat at Washington. All the while Hamilton was closed to pioneer scttlement.

The southern border of Rhea County was the Indian line established by the purchase of 1805. The only whites south of this line were licensed people living with the Cherokees as artisans. The United States required additional Cherokee lands by the Calhoun Treaty of Feb. 27, 1819, including the acreage between the Indian Line and the Tennessee River. In October of that year the Tennessee legislature organized this territory as Hamilton County. All this land was now open for settlement, except for six reservations granted to the Cherokees who had made improvements at these sites.
