#### WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?



So many times budding genealogists jump into their research with great enthusiasm, but without some pre-liminary preparation; and inevitably, they come up against a 'brick wall', and, then wonder where to go next, or how to solve this research problem. May I suggest to you, new genealogists, three things you must do first before you hurry off to search for your 'roots'.

#### STUDY HISTORY

The first thing you must do, and it is a 'must' before tackling any research problem, is to study all you can on the historical background of a particular state, county, or area where your people lived. Many

factors in history shaped the lives of your ancestors - wars, epedemics, economic problems, persecutions, politics, droughts, unemployment, etc. All these and many more had a profound impact on your ancestors. For example: Hundreds of Regulators (who had organized in 1764 to resist oppressive and corrupt public officials, but resorted to violence) and their families left Orange County, North Carolina within a short time, after their crushing defeat by the Royal Forces in 1771; and, moved to the Tennessee country. By knowing what was going on in their area, you will be able to know what events were shaping their lives, what caused them to move, or to settle where they did.

#### HISTORIES OF CHURCHES

While you are studying histories of the actual locality, don't overlook the histories of churches and religious denominations. You will find that the various religious groups would migrate together. Many of these sects kept some kind of records—some records are better than others, however. There are depositories for many of these church records in various university libraries. A study of the religious background of your ancestors will give you an appreciation of their customs and their migration to and across this great nation.

#### MAPS

The next thing you must do is to equip yourself with a map, as near the period of time your ancestors lived in that county, and study the physical description or surface features of the state, county, or area where you are working. It is important to have some knowledge of the location of rivers, marshes, mountains, and other natural barriers; because, topography dictated the migration patterns of settlers in to and out of an area. Your ancestors might have traveled into counties, or over the boundaries into other states before arriving at their destination. By knowing the migration routes, you will be able to find them in some of the records in the counties and states they passed through.

#### BOUNDARY DISPUTES

There have been boundary disputes between states, such as, North Carolina and Virginia; Tennessee and North Carolina; South Carolina and North Carolina; and etc. Quite often the two disputing states would grant land to their citizens in the disputed area; and, when the boundary was finally settled, one group of land holders would find they were now in a different state and their title to the land would be threatened. Just such a thing happened to some North Carolina land owners, who found themselves in South Carolina's jurisdiction when the boundary between the two states was settled in 1768. South Carolina required that these North Carolinians surrender their old Letters of Patent from the Province of North Carolina; and, procure new

would deem the land vacant and would grant the same to others applying for that in a Such problems like this would generate some kind of record.

#### COURT SYSTEMS

The third thing you must have, and the one most often ignored or avoided is a working knowledge of the court system of the state, and county. The reason researchers side step the courts and their records is because, generally speaking, their records were difficult to read, and to understand the legal terminology. The records, usually aren't indexed and almost never abstracted or published, thus making it difficult to find needed information on an ancestor. Nevertheless, a knowledge of the various court systems, idyocincracies, type of record kept, their contents, laws which governed the keeping of specific records, which courts kept probate records, which kept deeds and marriages, would aid you tremendously to find those records which will help you genealogically, and those which will not.


#### LAY GROUNDWORK

The degree to which you lay some groundwork before proceeding to do actual research may well spell the difference between success in solving your research problems or failure and frustration. Remember it doesn't take much to be a poor genealogist; but, it takes a little longer, some effort, study, lots of time, and determination to be a good one.

#### THE MYSTERIOUS POLLY NASH OF NATCHITOCHES

Recent issues of <u>The Genie</u> have carried a series of research notes on the Nash family of Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana, and their still-elusive origins — as well as notes on earlier Nash families to which the compiler of the series (Mrs. Fern Ainsworth, President, ARK-LA-TEX Genealogical Association) believes the Natchitoches Nashes belong. This present contribution on Polly Nash is offered as a mere (but interesting) sidelight on the family.

The origins of Polly Nash of Natchitoches are unknown. The fate of Polly is unknown. The Nash family of Natchitoches on which Mrs. Ainsworth has been working -- that of Thomas Nash (b. cal754 NC; d. after 1850, LA) and his two wives Emily/Sally Slater and Anna Going -- does contain a daughter Polly who, tradition holds, was the wife of one James Groves, although no record of the marriage has been found. Descendants of this Polly Nash Groves states that she bore a daughter by Groves in 1806 and a son on 25 April 1810 (although the latter does not appear on the census that was taken later in that year<sup>2</sup>). This Polly Nash is said to be the same, Mary Groves who appears as the wife of James on the 1850 enumeration, as well as the wife who is buried beside him in the Glass Window Cemetery at Hineston in Vernon (formely Rapides' Parish, Louisiana, under date of 14 September 1855, although both presumptions are based upon tradition rather than evidence. The current grave marker of Mrs. Groves is of fairly recer: manufacture, and it is stated that some data was added to the newer marker at the time of its erection. This researcher has not seen a documented transcription of the original marker. Moreover, the traditional birth data given for the children of Polly Nash Groves raises questions which have not been resolved by any evidence found to-date. While it is entirely POSSIBLE that the Polly Nash who bore children in 1806 and 1810 by James Groves was still his wife in 1850; it is remarkable that no further children were born to them in the course of their exceptionally long marriage. Young wives of that era did not normally cease childbearing at age 29 (the age attributed to Mrs. Groves) unless the marriage was dissolved through death or separation. Clearly, more documentation of the life attributed to Polly Nash Groves, between 1811 and 1855, is needed to resolve existing doubts.

Meanwhile, in 1816, one Polly Nash appears in the extant records of the Natchitoches Parish courthouse and the nearby military fort. At the time that she came to her mysterious end, her property was found to be in the home of one James Smith -- a gentleman who was an Indian trader (like James Groves) and one for whom other ties to the Nash family have been found. It is unfortuante that the records which chronicle Polly's tragic fate are seriously incomplete. In some respects, the few papers filed in her

succession suggests that hers was a "vacant succession" -- that is, one for whom there were no known heirs, or at least none that appeared and claimed kinship. There is no Tableau of Distribution or Final Account to indicate how the proceeds from her auctioned estate were disposed of.

Following is a transcription of the official hearings relative to the disappearance of Polly, as well as a transcription of her estate inventory which sheds some additional light on her lifestyle. The contributor invites correspondence from others who may have data to share on this Polly Nash or on the wife of James Groves.

Personally before me the undersigned apered Leut. Wiley J. Gordin who made oath that he had Sent Sum Handkerchifts to this woman POLY NASH to be hirned. The Boy returned & informed that She was not there & in about half an hour or an hour I Sent him Back again. he returned the Second time and informed me that She was not there & said that he was informed that She had Come up to Mr. Irvins. I had two or three days before been informed that Shee was about to take up with Mr. Irvin and my Knowing that She lived with Sergt. Fox as his wife, I [he?] thought it his duty to tell Sgt. Fox that he was acting very foolishly to be Laying out all his money upon her and advised him to quit her as Shee was about to take up with Another Man. Fox then Said that he had been Soo & that he did not know whether it was So and that if he found that it was the Case he would quit -- and Said at the Same time that She was a Very Strange Woman or that She Acted Very Strangely or Some thing like that Lately. -- he then said that a Man by the name of Hancock had tould him that he had Seen her Last(?) up by the Garison & that he wanted permission to Go out toward the Spring to See if he could See them together & if he did that he was [illegible word] that he would Never would live with her Again and if he did find them that he would Give Irvin a damd thrashing. I tould him that for his Satisfaction that he Could Go & See & that if it was the Case advised him Never to have any thing to do with her Again. he tould him Fox that a man that had Fought as much as he had in the Army & that Earned his money hard -- that wages was Low now on the P Establishment and his time of Service nearly Expired, he thought it most prudent for him to take Care of it to Travell Holme On. -- he then went to his quarters and in about fifteen Minutes after this deponant Saw Fox go out at the Cate and went towards the Spring. He had a little Small Cain in his hand, an Oak Stick about the Size of a Man's thum & this deponant saw no more of him Fox

Untill Evening. That a few Mornings after, say two or three, he asked him if he had Seen Polly & that he answered No & that he had been toald that they had Run away together. This deponent says that it was on Wednesday or Thursday Last that he had Sent his Boy for the Handkerchifts as before mentioned.

To wich declaration She made he [r] mark.

Enclosed are some pages of document extracts made from photocopies sent me by the Bossier Parish Clerk. I copied the census information from microfilm. If you feel the information is useful to anyone else, you might consider publishing it in THE GENIE.

Some of the words seemed awkward (necessitous and necessitory), but the use of something that looks like "f" when double "s" is needed, made them seem plausible. The terms which I have called "precis verbal" were used throughout. Dictionary definitions would allow the meaning to be "concise statement". Someone familiar with legal terminology might think that would be a foolish thing to stumble over. I was never sure of the Deputy Clerk's first name, but "Joannes" Smith seemed most satisfactory.

My knowledge of printing processes is scant. I thought if you reproduce these pages by some photocopy method, they would be acceptable as is. But if a stencil must be cut, I am afraid the small type and single spacing will leave you feeling I have done you no favor.

If you publish this in THE GENIE, I invite correspondence about the family. My great-grandmother, Mary Ann "Polly" Dunn was a daughter of Elisha Dunn and his first wife, Sarah (?). Sarah was born ca 1803-1805 in Alabama. Mary Ann was born ca 1838 (age 32-1870) in Alabama or Arkansas. She married Thomas J. Garrett, Jr., 24 January 1856 in Bossier Parish; died March 1877 in the Red Land-Plain Dealing area. I would like birth dates and places for Elisha and Sarah Dunn; death date and place for Sarah; and birth date and place for Mary Ann Dunn.

If you do not publish this, I would appreciate your publishing a query, as follows:

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## THE BABBS OF LAURENS COUNTY

by Robert E. Babb, Jr.

In 1652 Phillip Babb came to America at the request of the Massachusetts Colony to try to bring order and respect for the law on the Isles of Shoals, nine islands whose waters abounded with fish, but described by Captain John Smith in 1616 as "a many of barren rocks, the most overgrowne with such shrubs and sharpe whins you can hardly passe them, without either grasse or wood but three or foure short shrubby old Cedars."

Having taken an Oath of Allegiance at Kittery, Maine, Phillip set up his residence on Hog Island, largest of the group, where there was a good spring. The following year he was made a magistrate. He is elsewhere described as being one of the "earliest and most important of the Shoalers to emerge from obscurity, a constable, taverner, and general factotum, he kept cattle, sheep, and hogs in the valley back of his butcher shop."

Phillip died in 1671, leaving his wife and five sons, the oldest about ten, the youngest born after Phillip's death. Mary, his wife, died about a year later and the five boys were placed in foster homes on the mainland.

Thomas Babb, the second of the boys, was raised in Hampton, New Hampshire. There he met Bathsheba Hussey whom he in time marned By 1700 they had moved to New Castle County, Delaware, where he became a prominent land owner. They had three sons and four daughters. When in 1735 Thomas received a patent to 600 acres in Frederick County, Va., he sent his second son, Thomas, Jr. to occupy and improve the land as required in the patent. Later the third son, Philip, was to move to Virginia to assist his brother.

Thomas, Jr. was the husband of Sarah Foulk, and they had five sons and one daughter. He was a Quaker and one of the founding fathers of the Hopewell Monthly Meeting near Winchester, Va.

Joseph, fourth son of Thomas and Sarah, married and lived in Frederick County until after the birth of his third son. In about 1766 or 1767, Joseph, Mary and their three sons moved to the Pied mont area of South Carolina. In November of 1767 Joseph received a grant for 250 acres on Beaver Dam Branch in what is now Laurens County. Before Joseph a death there were two daughters and another son born. The children were Abner, Thomas, Sampson, Joseph Nancy, and Mary (Polly).

Abner, oldest of the children, in later life moved to Henry County, Georgia The other three boys remained in South Carolina, though some of their descend ants have spread westward to Georgia Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, and Texas. Those remaining in the state have spilled over imo Greenville, Spartanburg, Cherokee Pickens, Abbeville, Greenwood, and Anderson counties, with a few scattered elsewhere. Most of those still residing in Laurens County live either in Laurens proper or in the western part of the county.

This is Rev. Joseph E. Babb (1772-1843), well known Baptist Minister (page 426). He was father of ROBERT NEWTON BABB by second wife Margaret McNees Cook Babb (daughter of Robert McNees on page 10). ROBERT NEWTON BABB and wife, Ann Pinson Babb moved to Union County, Arkansas in 1850.

# THE BABBS OF UNION COUNTY, ARKANSAS

ROBERT NEWTON BABB, born in Laurens County, South Carolina, in 1816, and his wife, Ann Pinson Babb, born 1824, also in Laurens County, moved to Union County, Arkansas, near the Louisiana line, in 1850. Six children were born to Newton and Ann, John Hendricks, Joseph, Thomas Jefferson, Abijah Pinson, Sarah Ada and Clara Anna. Ann Babb died in 1859 and Newton died in 1865. Except for the third son, Thomas Jefferson, the other children left Union County.

THOMAS JEFFERSON BABB, the third son, born in 1853, married Martha Eugenia Murphy in 1879. Nine children were born to this union and are listed below with their spouses, Jeff Babb died in 1931. Martha Babb, born in 1860, died in 1941. Both are buried in the family plot in Woodlawn Cemetery at El Dorado.

I want you to write to me whether if either of them are so or not he said that I wouldant draw all of my money but I did and he said that I would go to my Regiment in ten days and this is the thirteenth day he said that I wouldant get a discharge or furlow at this place but I would come home after a while in better health than I am at this time he also said that we would prosper in this life and gain a great deal of wealth tho we never would be independently rich tho he said we will make a plenty to live easy I hope it will be so tho I am a fraid after this war is settled if it is ever every thing will be so high and such high tax to pay that it will be a hard matter for any poor person to get a long.

Well we have a great deal of wet wether ought here tho it is tollerable warm we never have had but five or six large (?) frosts (?) here but they snow has been three or four inches deep in Richmond which is a bought one hundred and fifty miles from here.

Well Sicily I will start Julias (?) ring and one for my sweet little girl in this letter I have sent one to you and one to Polly and one to Harriet and I will send one to Emily Isadorah (?) in my next letter to mother I have one on my finger with they Enitials S A W of your name and I have one that I will print (?) W W on it and keep it also I have sold several at twenty five cts and forty cts

But Sicily I am a doing fine know I get a tollerable plenty to eat and with a warm stove to set by good water to drink. The following is another Civil War Letter submitted by Edwin M. Stevens, 1707 3rd, Brownwood, Texas 76801, and was transcribed as correctly as possible.

November 22nd 1862

Danville Va Mrs Sicily Ann Wilson Dear Wife

I seat my self this morning to let you kn that I am well or at least I feal as well as I use too before I came to Virginia tho I am not as stout as I was tho I have gained my usual weight. I waid a few days ago and waid one hundred an twenty six pounds which is rather more than I use two weigh I think I am as fat as I ever was before tho I doant have no idey when I will get off (?) regiment on they account of the Small Pox a raging so in the City there is (?) two or three cases break ought every day nearly there has been five cases of it in this hospital that I stay in they doctor thinks that there is another case of it here know tho it doant look like one of the other cases that I have seen.

Well Sicily I have drawd my money at last which mounted to One Hundred and Thirty five Dollars an 60 (?) cents so I can buy as mutch clothes I kneed to they are extreamly high they cheapest pants is worth fifteen Dollars and a coat is Twenty five thoes are they cheapest Genes (?) is worth four and five Dollars per yard so if it is as high there as you say it is you had better not try to send me any cloths an sell your cloth for I cant send any of my money home and I have a plenty to buy all of they cloths that I schal kneed so if you have not started them doant do it it is very doubtful whether I will leave here before Christmas or not then when I do leave I expect to go to my Regiment until every thing changes very much. Sicily Iwent ought an they its they other way to buy a few little articles an such prices as I had to pay I never heard of before they very sorryist kind of fine crinly(?) is a selling for one Dollar an twenty five cts tho I got a very good one for that price and one spool of thread sixty cts one quir of paper one dollar and Fifty cts and one pack of Envelopes Fifty cts those four articles cost me Three Dollars and Eighty five cts this is the kind of Paper and the Envelope is one of the back (?) common spool of cottin No 4 (?) black India ? but small. Tobacco is worth one dollar per pound and Whiskys and Brandys sells as Brandy is selling for Sixteen Dollars Peach Whisky Eighteen Dollars per gallon to buy eather of them by the drink you have to pay twenty five cts for it. Flour is a selling for Thirty Dollars per barrel but is a selling from

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## BARTHOLEMEW STOVALL TRICENTENNIAL (1684-1984)

Descendants of Bartholemew Stovall, who arrived in Virginia from England in 16884, are planning a gathering for August 17-19, 1984 to celebrate the 300th anniversary of his arrival.

The principal event of the three day gathering will be a catered picnic on the site of the old Stovall plantation at the junction of Deep Creek and the James River. This is about twenty miles west of Richmond. Many other events are planned with special attention to facilitating the exchange of genealogical information.

It is hoped and expected that many people from all over the country will attend - possiby a thousand or more. There are tens of thousands of Stovall descendants living today and they are a family that is interested in their forefathers. There are several books on the family in existence and at least two more are currently being prepared. Also Stovalls are featured in many family histories.

With the principal event at the old plantation site and with Historic Richmond, world famous Williamsburg, the George, Sr. - George, Jr. ferry site across the James at Lynchburg and even Washington, D. C. nearby with side trips to them available the whole affair should be of great interest to many. Many new "cousins" will be found and all will go home with a better knowledge of their heritage.

## NATCHITOCHES PARISH LOUISIANA NOTES STATE LAND OFFICE RECORDS

## SUBMITTED BY FERN AINSWORTH

one must first have at least a cursory knowledge of United States and Louisiana Statutes and procedures in relation to Louisiana lands, Here follows a very brief history of the lands and laws relative to land districts in Louisiana.

In 1803 the U.S. Congress authorized President to take possession of Louisiana. In 1804 Louisiana was split into 2 territories. See map#1. All lands south of the 33 N lat. from the Mississippi River west to the Western boundary and the Isle of Orleans constitute the Territory of Orleans. By act of Congress in 1805 the Territory of Orleans was split into 2 land districts. One was the Western District of the Terr, of Orleans and the other the Eastern District of the Terr. of Orleans. See map #2. In 1810 the U.S. Congress claimed the land north of the Isle of Orleans, East of the Mississippi River and West of the Pearl River as part of the Territory of Orleans. See map #3, These parishes became known as the Florida Parishes because they were once part of Spanish West Florida. In 1811 the Territory was divided into 1 land districts. Land offices were established in Opelousas for the Western District of The Terr. of Orleans and in New Orleans for the Eastern District of the Terr. of Orleans. The third district was established North of the Red River with a land office to located according to Presidential Proclamation. See map #4. In 1812 Louisiana was admitted as a state. See map #5. In 1812 also the land known as the Florida Parishes was declared a land district. See map #6. In 1820 the land office for this district was established in St. Helena and the district became known as St. Helena Dist.. In 1823 the U.S. took possession of land on the western border known as the Rio Hondo lands. This land had been claimed by both the U.S. and Spain since the purchase of Louisiana. Land claims in this area were then processed after the final acquisition of this land by the U.S.. See map #7. In 1838 a land office was established in Natchitoches to serve the people in that area. It became known as the Natchitoches Dist. See map #8. In 1848 the Natchitoches District was modified and some tand placed into the District North of the Red River or the Ouachita Dist.

the U.S. Congress or state legislatures were accomplished by various offices. There were at least 4 distinct types of offices that handled this. These were the U.S. land office, the U.S. Surveyor Generals office for Louisiana, the State Land Office and the Louisiana State Surveyors. All of the records from these various offices have found their way to the Division of State Lands. The following is a flow chart of the life and fate of some of these offices.

After careful review and research of the voluminous records of the Division of State Lands I have determined several record types that should qualify for microfilming by the Genealogical Society of Utah. This required searching through the records at the Land office, which are quite extensive, and records that are housed at the State Archives. Many of the documents at the Archives were in an unorganized state and required 2 days to find and evaluate. The determination to microfilm is based upon the content of vital "vital" information, access to that information, and nonduplication of that information from previously filmed sources. There are ocassions when certain records normally wouldn't qualify for filming but because of the fact that the book acts as an index or access to other records I have included those records in my recommendations. I find the following records to be of interest:

Claim papers - These records embrace those papers neccessary to prove a claim to lands purchased, settled, granted, etc. from or by the previous governments. This generally refers to lands settled prior to 1812. These claims are usually based upon Spanish, French, or British documentation. This claim was filed in a U.S. District Land Office under various Acts of Congress. There were claim acts in 1805, 1807, 1812, 1816, 1823, etc. that governed the types and manner of filing claims. These aren't all of the claim acts either but just a short list. Claims were filed by act in each seperate land district and sometimes by deputy commissioners in that land district. Sometime in the past the original order for filing these claim papers was disturbed. They were "reorganized" in such a manner as to render many if not most of the original finding aids ineffective. This has led to a general confusion of the nature, content, and use of claim papers. Access to these records is now accomplished either by consulting the U.S. Tract Books or by use of the Exhibit of Private Land Claims. The records are organized now by Township and Range and Section #. Some are indexed by use of the American State Papers. To explain the indexing

of these records will require extensive notation before each record series on the Operator's Report. These claim papers are composed of Original and transcribed copies of Spanish, French or British land transactions, applications for claims, affidavits from the claimant or witnesses, orders for surveys, surveys, and written testimony. This documentation can usually give us the name of the claimant, the date of settlement, abstraction of titles, family histories and size, ages, and place from which the claimant originally lived. They can be a very important source of information for colonial vital information. The claim paper can be found in the following cabinets;

Supportive documentation to the Claim papers

In most cases some documentation was either lost or removed from the original file or misfiled when the claims were reorganized. This means that most claims have some information not found in the original file that may be recorded in the transcribed records of the office. These records are transcripts of some of the claims and actions taken to confirm or reject various claims. These records in themselves are incomplete but when combined with the Claim papers can provide a fairly complete source of information. Since no uniform titles to the volumes are given I will list the records by general type and give a summary explanation of the record type.

- British Spanish French Documents. These are original or transcript copies of documents used as evidence to support claims. It may include deeds, titles, grants, concessions, patents, etc.. Most are dated from 1760 1813 and are generally not able to be found in Parish land records. I feel that these are records removed during reorganization from the Claim Papers. It is my opinion that they ought to filmed.
- Notices & Evidences These are transcripted records in book form of the original notices to filing of claims and the evidence filed in that claim. It may contain notices and evidences not found in the Claim papers as they exist now. Orders of Surveys and surveys may be included in these records.

Act 55 7 volumes Act 96, 124 & 125 2 volumes

Sale Letters These are deeds & transfers of lands between individuals and relate as evidence used in land claims, proofs of assignment of various other land transactions, etc.. All material privious to 1812 would be of particular value since it may be the only documentation of this transaction recorded anywhere in the State.

Warrants These are the certificates issued either by the State of the Federal government for lands. They are generally found to consist of the name of the warrant holder, the date of the warrant, the warrant #, and a discription of the land issued under the warrant.

Choctaw Script This appears to be a record of script issued to Choctaw indians for land that they assigned for valuable consideration to other individuals. They give the name of the indian, the name of the assignee, and certificate numbers. This can be a very valuable record in the fact that in giving the name of the indians occassionally they explain the relation of one indian to another.

Certificates and Registers of Certificates Certificates of Patents were issued to individuals who purchased land from the government. They will contain about the same type of information as found in warrant records. Again these aren't prime genealogical records unless you want a record of those who are the original purchasers of public lands in the State.

- All Pre-emptions under various acts North of the Red River 34 vols. Some are self indexed and the others we haven't found indexing for yet.

- F15 Transcript records of Pre-emptions, Southwestern, Greensburg, and North of the Red River Districts. These are record books unique to these districts concerning the proofs, approvals, and rejections of pre-emptions by the commissioners or registers. They may duplicate some information found in the original papers but will suppliment that lost from the papers when they were reorganized.

Soldier's Proofs Those soldiers (Confederate) or their beneficiaries who were wounded during the war were entitled to receive certain amounts of public land. In order to qualify they had to submit proof of disability.

The mode of proof was different for each different act. There are at least 5 different act under which this distribution of land was accomplished. They are Acts 55, 96, 116, 124, 125. Only Acts 55, 96 and 116 really provide any information of genealogical value. These acts may give full name, previous company and rank of soldier and a discription of the injury and why it is a disabling injury. The Soldier's Proofs are found in cabinets A27 & A28.

- Decisions and Registers of Certificates These record are the decisions and rulings of the Commissioners or register on the validity of the various claims. There are also often times a register of the certificates issued by the commissioners or registers. There may be evidence of the claim included and the reason for the rejection or the acceptance of the claim. This can provide a valuable insight to the claimant. The register of certificates can also give you the final certificates number which is used in most future reference to the claim.

Pre-emptionsUnder several acts of Congress from 1811 onward ther are provisions where certain individuals are given a preference to the selection and purchase of Federal public lands. This preference right is known as a pre-emption land claim.


Pre-emptions are of varing genealogical value. Some acts only require the name of the applicant and a description of the land desired. Others may require the name of the individual, date of settlement, and proof of settlement or cultivation in the form of personal testimony and affidavits of witnesses. These claims would give you the name, date of settlement, family size, age of the claimant, marital status, etc.. The pre-emption papers have been organized into several different systems from the original order. Some are indexed by names with indexes at the beginning of each volume. Others are based upon location of land by Township, Range and Section 1. These would be indexed through the U.S. Tract book records. Pre-emptions are divided into several different retord types. They included but are not limited to Notices Applications, Declarations, Affidavits and Proofs. Depending upon the Act these subgroups of pre-emptions can be very good genealogically or quite barren. Pre-emptions are found in the following cabinets:

A24 Pre-emptions All districts. Arranged by township, range, and section.
18 vols. Self indexed and by use of the U.S. Tract books.

United States Tract books These are the records to which most records in this office are indexed by. These records can be used as a general index to almost every record in the Division of State Lands. They contain the name, description and location of land and a reference to all related material to that land transaction. They are arranged by township, range, and section # for each district in the state. All volumes are indexed by a seperate index

Exhibit of Private Land Claims These are abstractions made of the land claims made in Louisiana under various acts from 1805 onward. They supply an excellent method of indexing certain claims in which the township, range and section are shown. They also give reference to the entries made in the American State Papers or other documentation. In the case of the Rio Hondo claims they serve as the fastest and easiest index to those claims. I feel they are extremely valuable because they list many claims that were unlocated and therefore not found in the U.S. Tract books.

Some of the record of the Division of State Lands are now located at the Louisiana State Archives. I have made an extensive survey of the records there at the State Archives. I have determined the relative value of each document in terms of Genealogical content. I found about 40 different sets of documentation that I feel are valuable to us. Most of this documentation is an extension of the records found at the Division of State Lands office. We are reviewing these documents to determine the feasibility of either incorporating them into the records of the Division of State Lands or filming them seperately at the State Land office.

The authors have tried to establish proof of the records by checking Court, Military, Church, Cemetery, Family and Bible Records. 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
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
