When I began the search for my roots, my first thought was how far back I could go. I hoped to find a few brave knights or maybe even someone from Noah's Ark. With visions of my great-great-great-great-great-grandfather wearing a fig leaf, I made my way to the public library. I had heard about their abundance of records and was eager to get started. I figured I should start with myself and move backwards.

Making my way to the microfilm area, I soon found I was not going to find myself in the library. The records started at 1900 and having been born in 1953, I saw a great generation gap. I did find a little information, but decided to try contacting some of my older relatives.

Checking out my mother proved to be fruitless.. She paid about as much attention to events surrounding her childhood as I did; which isn't saying much. I moved on to visiting a few of my aunts and distant cousins. I did make a great deal of progress in that endeavor, but found my fascination had changed directions.

You have heard the old saying finding it in "your own backyard." I began to see this adventure I was seeking really occurred long after the Great Flood or King Arthur's Round Table.

Being fascinated by the pioneer stories of the eldest members of my family, I tried to experience life without modern conveniences. After ten minutes of starring at a blank television, I admitted defeat and decided that what the people of a century ago had, I didn't possess. I suppose I should have felt grateful for what I had, but I really felt a sense of loss at not having the determination and pride that I should have inherited. U.S. CENSUS LOAN PROGRAM

Dr. Robert M. Warner, Archivist of the United States, in a released statement announced the resumption of the census microfilm loan program. They chose the DDD Company to carry out a loan program in lieu of the discontinued government program. At first only the Federal census records for the years 1790-1900 will be available, but later this year the 1910 will be loaned. All orders will be filled within ten days or a letter explaining the reason for further delay will be mailed. No customer should have to wait over sixty days. If your library does not receive the information about this program have them write: Census Microfilm Rental Program, P. O. Box 2940, Hyattsville, Md. 20784.

Individuals cannot order films directly; they must order through an interlibrary loan from a library participating in the program. Users may rent the film for seven days at a charge of \$2.25 per film, regardless if it is 16 or 35mm, soundex or census schedule. Overtime charges will be another \$2.25, and damaged film will cost the user \$12.00. Films may be ordered after June 5, 1983, and the first films will be mailed by DDD on July 8, 1983.

HISTORICAL CHURCH RECORDS

The records of both Millsaps College and of the United Methodist Church will be housed in the J. B. Cain Archives in the library at Millsaps College at Jackson, Mississippi.

Mrs. Marie Gallup, serving as archivist, stated there are now 260 local church registers in the collection at Millsaps—the latest being presented this month. It is records of Marvin Chapel in Carroll County covering the period 1884-1938.

Dr. James Parks, Head Librarian at Millsaps, said that future goals include the accession of the records of the Mississippi Conference Historical Society, including the papers of Rev. J. B. Cain. The Methodist Room has a complete file of the Journals of both Mississippi and North Mississippi Conferences, as well as bound volumes of the old New Orleans Christian Advocate (1826-1946) and the Mississippi United Methodist Advocate (1947-1981).

The new guide to GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES is now available. We have been waiting for many years for this publication to be announced and it is a very welcome one.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Bossier: Know all men by these presents That we Thomas J. Garrett and Augustus Martin acknowledge and owe to Paul O. Hebert Governor of the State of Louisiana. . . Five hundred dollars to the payment of which we hereby bind ourselves...at Bellevue this 19th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six. The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bonder Thomas J. Garrett has this day obtained license from the clerk of the Dist. Court of the parish of Bossier to marry with Miss Mary Ann Dunn. . . . (Signed) T. J. Garrett. A. Martin. Filed Jany 19th 1856. (Signed) A. A. Abney Clk.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Bossier: To Vincent Walker or to any Minister of the Gospel or Justice of the Peace. . . hereby authorized and empowered to celebrate marriage between Mr. Thos. J. Garrett and Miss Mary A. Dunn both residents of said parish and state... this 19th of January 1856 (signed) A. A. Abney Clk.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Bossier: . . . I have celebrated marriage between Mr. Thos. J. Garrett and Miss Mary A. Dunn, according to law. In testimony whereof I have caused the parties to sign their names hereto in presence of the subscribing witnesses this 24 day of January 1856. Parties signed Thos J. (his x mark) Garrett, Mary A. (her x mark) Dunn. Witnesses signed Thomas B. Windser, A. C(?). Hearn, Julis A. Martin. (Signed)V. Walker Justice of the Peace. Filed March 3rd 1856 (signed) A. A. Abney Clk.

Some purchases were "for son George per v. order you". Partial payments were made at years' end and interest was charged on carried-over balances. One payment of \$30.00 for oxen was received. There was a balance due as of Jan. 1, 1885, of \$65.92.

THE SELF FAMILY

BY: Fern Ainsworth

I have been requested to do an article on THE SELF FAMILY several times, and I shall share the information I have collected over the years. I do not have a SELF line, nor have I ever done research on them per se, but since we lived in the same community, attended the same school and other activities I've always jotted down data as I saw it in my research for my family. Lloyd Self was one of my older brother's best friend and he also dated an older sister of mine.

The surname SELF is spelled many ways and according to "Old English Personal Names" probably of Teutonic origin, originally spelled Seawulf "Sea-wolf".

From Doomsday Book 1086 we find the single names, Saiulfus, schuilfus, Saulf, Saolf, Saul, Seulf.

In checking Rupp's list I only find one person who could be interpreted as SELF, and that is CONRAD SELHOFF in 1751 and, even though Filby in his "Passenger and Immigration lists index" lists four, Isaac in 1682; John in 1771; John in 1772 and Samuel in 1837, I find few of this name from Pennsylvania in my files. Rupp also names Susan and William to Barbadoes in 1654-1663 and Susan to Virginia 1654-1663..

Nugent in "Cavaliers and Pioneers" lists ROBERT SELFE as transporting 6p persons for which he was granted 300 acres in Westmoreland County 20 May 1665.

Virkus in "First Families of America" lists James Cuthbert SELF of Edgefield County, S.C. 1876.

a Baptist and only waits to convert my people. He had two

convert my people.

"This a strange year for my overseers; some, horrid
hellish rogues and others religious villains."

Comment: Perhaps overseers were judged harshly, because
those of Col. Carter's were a representative of families of
good standing in the Northern Neck. Because John Self,
his manager at Ring's Neck, turned Baptist, he is called
by Col. Carter, a "religious villain."

9 March 1778 Henry Self was sworn ensign to Capt. Smith's
Company.

In the will of Sarah Lay who died 1765 in Fairfax, Va.
she names her daughter Athesco, wife of PRESLY SALF- along
with others.

Again from Col. Carter's diary: "John Selfe, Jr. came to
Lawson's Place (the 17 October 1772) he seems to be a brisk
man-----Spring 1773 --I ordered all to go replanting
2 grains corn to the hill; not to touch the standing corn,
so that if that comes to anything, it will not be hurt.
But SELFE, a knowing fool, wanted to trust to another frost.
Which is better, John, a fresh grain in May or a wounded
plant of corn? and if a frost comes to-night, what then?
Potatoes in 3 acres killed. I am glad I reserved about half
an acre to be planted in June."

and John died October 1829 --affadavit made in Page Co., Va.
24 May 1858 by William Weakley age 79 that he was well acquainted
with John Valentine a Rev. War soldier of Shenandoah Co.,
Va., that he had service connection with John Valentine
and he was wounded in service, that he was the only man in
Shenandoah Valley by the name of John Valentine, and that he
is not interested in the pension claim of the heirs of John
Valentine; at the same time Thomas Cave age 81 appeared
who states he was acquainted with John Valentinw and knows
that John stated he was in several battles.

Mary Valentine, the widow, whose maiden name was Mary
Griffith applied in Page County, Virginia 1844 personally.

Henry Ailshite made oath and affidavit that he was acquainted
with them and that he brought John Valentine in a wagon
of his from Winchester, Virginia to the county of Shen-
andoah, Virginia shortly after the ending of the
Revolutionary War, and that he wore then a suit like the
soldiers of the regular army and he continued to be well
acquainted with him from that day until his death. States
that he himself was an enlisted soldier for eighteen months
in the regular army to the north under Col. Abraham
Bowman and Col. John Nevel and recollects that John Valentine
told him that ahter the battle of Monmouth that the army
under General Washington encamped a while at the white
plains in New*Jersey afterwards marched back into New
Jersey

* He possibly means White Plains New York.

THIS AND THAT

There was a colony of people who left Ninety Six District, Union County, South Carolina in the early 1800's and migrated to that part of Kentucky which later became Ohio County. Parts of that county later became Daviess and McLean Counties. Descendants of this group are still found in this area.

In 1676 New Jersey was divided into East and West Jersey and remained so until 1701 the two divisions were united.

In 1719 a large number of Scots Irish from Ulster arrived in North Carolina.

In 1682 the first Welsh settlement in Pennsylvania was made close to Philadelphia

In 1710 three thousand Palatines were transported to New York, finally settled in Schoharie Valley, then later to Bucks and Berks counties, Pa.

Between 1675 and 1750 New England trade ships wintered in South Carolina which resulted in many marriages between local citizens and New Englanders.

In 1800 there was a large migration from South Carolina to the middle part of Tennessee, and between 1820 and 1830 "One half of the entire population moved west."

1861 a group of forty counties broke away from Virginia and formed a new state which they called "Kanawha" which later entered the Union as West Virginia. Many West Virginia families went to Georgia and then later into Tennessee..

Delaware first settled by the Swedes 1627; is taken by the Dutch in 1655; 1664 the English take possession; 1682 it is annexed to William Penn's government; 1692 the English again assert their authority; 1694 the government restored to William Penn; in 1701 Delaware is formally separated from Pennsylvania; 1732 disputes with Maryland over the boundary lines are settled and it is finally recognized as one of the original thirteen colonies.

1732 the town of Sunbury, Georgia is settled with early settlers mainly German Protestants, Highlanders from Scotland and a few New Englanders.

1775 to 1800 over 220,000 settlers enter the area known as Kentucky which in 1776 was organized as a county of Virginia.

1804 the Arch Diocese of Maryland was formed with parishes in New York City, New York, Baltimore, Maryland, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Bardstown, Kentucky.
