Because of the destruction of records twice in Ireland, it is sometimes very difficult to obtain records needed so desperately. Civil Registration of Non-Catholic marriages commenced in Ireland April 1845. From this date all such marriages are indexed in Dublin. Prior to 1845, a marriage may only be located by searching the Marriage registers of the various churches serving the area where your ancestor lived. In a rural area this would not be too difficult, but in Belfast the task would be quite difficult. The Irish Genealogical Service has compiled an Index relating to the various Protestant Churches in Belfast that have in their custody records prior to 1845. They will research this Index for you at a cost of \$5.00 (U.S.) . 29 June 1983 the Federal Register, Vol. 48, No. 126, Page 30012 published a list of the names of safe deposit boxes which were turned over to the Federal Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) Treasury Department during the late 1920's

and 1930's. The depression forced many banks to fail. The unclaimed property consists of family papers, coins, jewelry and other personal objects that may have sentimental value. Claims from individuals are to be considered before claims from states or other organizations. Names are listed alphabetically by state, city, town of bank location. You may or may not have a claim, but we ask that you contact the State Archivist and ask him to have the State file to claim the unclaimed portion of these records so they will not be destroyed. It is to be hoped our State Archivist has some knowledge of this particular problem and can assist the people involved. Many times people keep birth certificates, bibles, and other pertinent materials in their safety boxes, and if this is true we need to save those materials.

A booklet has been published titled "GENEALOGY OF DESCENDANTS OF JOB SELF BORN ABOUT 1790"which gives some data relative to a SELF FAMILY which settled in Louisiana ca 1840. There

The SELF Family:

JOB, Spencer, Eli and Joseph are also mentioned, and it could probably be proven they are all sons of William, Sr. of Hancock County, Miss. These are not to be confused with the children of William, Jr. who were mentioned in his will dated 1846; Elijah, Eli, Elias, William Jackson, David Washington and Franklin Dawson by his first wife. He then mentions Thomas Jefferson Self his youngest child, being the only child of my present wife Elizabeth Ann. In the family meeting (Succession record of William Self, Jr. St. Helena Parish, La., Records No 163 Box S4 filed 14 April 1846) mention is made of the children of Elijah Self, Reuben B., Raleigh C., both of Washington Parish, La., and Aristides Bennett (Husband of Chirty Self) who were the nearest relatives and not heirs residing within 30 miles of this place. William Self, Jr. was born in Georgia ca 1798 and died 21 March 1846 in St. Helena Parish, La. He was married three times; (1) Jane Walker (2) Elizabeth Ann Sandifer, and (3) Frances (Fanny) Bankston.

The first 6 named sons in the will as shown above were the children of he and his second wife, Jane Walker:

- 1. Elijah born 9 May 1819 in Hancock County, Miss., and died 25 January 1902 in Sabine Parish, La. He married Louisa Ann Sibley 26 December 1841 in Washington Parish, Louisiana the daughter of Robert F. and Avarilla (Albritton) Sibley. She was born 6 November 1825 and died 28 June 1900 in Sabine Parish Louisiana. They were the parents of 12 children, and they are both buried in the Many Cemetery, Sabine Parish, Louisiana.
- 2. Eli born ca 1823 Washington Parish, Louisiana and died 1852 in Sabine Parish, La. In 1844 he married Sarah Ann Sibley born 17 October 1825 and was the daughter of William L. and Elizabeth Watson Quilling. They were the parents of four children.

NATCHITOCHES PARISH LOUISIANA NOTES:

was listed in the 1840 Natchitoches Parish enumeration a JOAB (JOB) ? Self. According to the record, as taken from the booklet, Job Self married Tamer Stringfield in Bibb County, Alabama - date not given, but accoring to marriages of Bibb County we have marriages of two of his sons: ALFRED SELF married ELIZABETH MARTIN 6 Feb. 1825 JAMES J. SELF married TAMAR K. BOSTON Job and Tamar were the parents of 6 boys and 2 girls, they are listed as follows but may not be in their birth sequence.

NANCY married a JONES Tamer married a LEAK

It is probably true that the SELF Family who came through Mississippi (Hancock Co.), into Washington County, Louisiana and thence to the Sabine Parish, Louisiana area were related. Perhaps Job and William were both the sons of William who was in Hancock County, Miss. in 1820 over45 years of age.

There was a John SELF in Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana before 1811, because he makes a deposition in a trial relative to the John Litton claim for 600 acres on Bayou Tortoise. He stated he had known Litton since 1811 when the said Litton came down Red River from Pecan Point where he had been on a hunting expedition.

The SELF Family, of which we have the most data, is that of William, son of William of Hancock County, Miss. He was born 1795 - 1800 in Georgia. In early records where his name appears the names of Jacob, Elijah, John, Andrew, Balem,
