SPECIAL REQUEST

I am very proud of the way the ARK-LA-TEX GENEALOGICAL ASS'N., INC. has always responded to the cry for help from the State Archives. In fact we were awarded a certificate for our endeavors in the past. Again they need our assistance. In a letter from LE COMITE DES ARCHIVES DE LA LOUISIANE we are informed that action should be taken to preserve microfilm collection in the Microfilm Room of the Middleton Library at LSU-BR. No security or working copies of the microfilm were ever made and the staff is compelled to make the reels of original microfilm available for research use. As a result, this original film is becoming badly scratched and we have been informed that at least some, and possibly many, reels have been lost or stolen.

Since many of the original newspapers were destroyed following filming, the loss or attrition of this microfilm is also the loss of the only existing copy of the information contained. There is a pressing need for a project to address this problem by duplicating the surviving microfilm to provide working copies to be used by Library researchers and security copies to be stored in the State Archives.

DR. DONALD J. LEMIEUX considers immediate action on this project to be imperative. Unfortunately, the budget for the State Archives precludes such an undertaking unless help from such organization as ours is received, and he is requesting our help.

I am asking each of our members to make a donation for this project. I would like to see it come through this organization so we will know how we are responding. Checks may be made to the ARK-LA-TEX GENEALOGICAL ASSOCIATION and indicate in the place provided that this is for the Archives Project. This is deductible for income tax purposes as we have our tax exempt number now. OR you may make the check payable to LE COMITE, but do NOT make the check payable to State Archives because it is a subsidiary of the Louisiana State Department. Whatever you do, and I sincerely hope you will do something, please send your contribution through this organization. And I THANK you in advance for your generosity and cooperation.

We have never failed in something like this, and I know all the members are vitally interested in this facet of preserving material.

- 3. ELIAS SELF born 17 Feb. 1824 Washington Parish, La. died 7 March 1898 and buried in Middle Creek Cemetery, Sabine Parish, La. Married 8 October 1850 Amanda Ann JAMES, born 17 Aug. 1828, died 18 August 1916 and is buried at Central Cemetery in Natchitoches Parish, La. They were the parents of 6 children; William E. born 1851; Flavius Elijah born 1854; Jane born 1861; Louise J. born 30 Dec. 1863, David Walker born 23 June 1865; and Thomas Monroe born 30 July 1868.
- 4. WILLIAM JACKSON SELF was born ca 1828 Washington Parish, Louisiana and married 16 December 1852 ELIZABETH L. ADDISON born ca 1836; the daughter of Archelaus ADDISON and Mary Ann SIBLEY. There are records of four children but are probably more. Mary J. born ca 1854; William A. born ca 1856; Gertrude A. born ca 1858 and Elizabeth M. born ca 1867.
- 5. DAVID WASHINGTON SELF was born 21 Dec. 1833 in Pike County, Miss. died 6 August 1896 in Sabine Parish, La. He is buried in SELF Cemetery Sabine Parish, La. The only entrance to the cemetery is through Hodges Gardens. He married 11 Jan. 1853 Elizabeth Letitia (Betty) SIBLEY who was born 2 Feb. 1833 in Washington Parish, La., died in Hornbeck, La. 1915 and is buried beside David in the Self Cemetery. She was the daughter of Robert F. and Avarilla(ALBRITTON)SIBLEY. Children born to this union were: Ava J. born 21 Apr. 1854 d 12 Mar. 1936, buried in Toro Cemetery, Sabine Parish, La. Married 21 Jan. 1874 Isaac F. Chance; Samuel Elisha born 25 Apr. 1855; Ellen born ca 1857 died young; Dr. Robert Lunsford born 13 May 1858; Franklin D. born ca 1861; John William born 10 November 1863; De. Christopher C. born 17 June 1869; Ella Elizabeth born 17 June 1871.

David W. SELF joined the Civil War as Captain and later made Major was in Co. B - 17 Regiment La. Inf. (Sabibe Rebels) (Rifles) Camp Moore, La. He was present for muster call 30 Sept. 1861, March and April 1862. Absent for wound received near Vicksburg, Miss. On 4 July 1862 on Roll of Prisoners of War captured near Vicksburg, Miss. He was Major at that time. On the Federal Report of killed, wounded and missing 6th and 7th April 1862 his wound was classed as serious by M.C. Leonard; General J.C. Pemberton at Jackson, Miss. was in command. This is taken from microfilm in the State Library at Baton Rouge, La.

THE SELF FAMILY(cont.)

The story is told that DAVID WASHINGTON SELF was sent home from the Prisoner of War Camp to die. He told them the doctors said the wound would not heal. His wife opened the wound and got some leather out where the shot went through his pistol holster. As soon as this was removed and he began to recover he got on his horse, crossed the Mississippi River and began fighting again. He was paroled in Natchitoches, Louisiana 12 June 1865. He was the first Sabine Parish School Superintendent, and was Tax Assessor 1860 until 1877. In 1860 he was the Census Enumerator, was Sheriff of Sabine Parish 1884 - 1888 and was in the Louisiana State Legislature 1888 - 1892. He and his wife were the parents of 8 children:

- Ava J. born 21 April 1854, died 12 March 1936 and buried in Toro Church Cemetery. She married 21 Jan. 1874 Isaac Chance and they were the parents of 7 children.
- Samuel Elisha born 25 April 1855, died 9 Oct. 1910, buried in Self Cemetery. He married Sophronia L. Phifer and were the parents of 11 children. They are both buried in Self Cemetery.
- 3. Ellen born ca 1857 and died young.
- 4. Dr. Lansford Self born 13 May 1858, died 4 Oct., 1914 and married Lela A. Tatum 6 Nov., 1879. She was born 28 Oct., 1860 and died 2 Feb. 1932. They are both buried in Self Cemetery. They were the parents of 7 children: Ed., Dewitt, Ellis, Luna, Eula, Ollie and Walter Morris.

Their son Robert Dewitt, known to his friends as Uncle Dewitt. He was born 1880 and celebrated his 100th birthday Dec. 6, 1980 at Anacoco, La. He married Loudie Ferguson 4 April 1909 and they were the parents of 4 children; Robert Dewitt, Jr., Inez (Mrs. Vernon Pringle of Shreveport, La., and a member of the ARK-La-Tex Genealogical Association); Mrs. Margaret Dove of Shreveport, La.; and Mrs. Della Thompson of Anacoco, La.

Mr. Dewitt was born in the Toro Community located in Sabine Parish, La., and it was here that he spent his boyhood days where he joined the Toro Baptist Church of which his Grandparents were Charter Members. This church and cemetery is located in what is now Hodges Gardens. It is also in Hodges Gardens where his Grandparents, David Washington and Letitia Sibley Self built their home. It is of such families that America is most proud.

In the July 1977 Natchitoches Parish Notes I wrote an article about the establishment of the community called Vowell's Mill. Since both Vowell men married daughters of Jim SELF i think it would be good to review a little of that history. In the July 1984 issue of THE GENIE the names (initials) as given in the record is not correct. On page 162 it is recorded Martha A. SELF was married to W.G. VOWELLS 20 Feb. 1873. This should read H.G. instead of W.G.. In the marriage of Mary J. SELF it is recorded as W.F. VOWELLS and it should read W.H. These were two sisters who married brothers. Vowell's Mill was named after them because they were responsible for obtaining the first mail route, and also they owned the mill on Spring Chori.

The story is told that the father of the SELF girls went to Texas, however, the story is also told thay before they left Mr. Jim Self died and they buried him on the . Vowell Place, and as the rest were leaving early the next morning they went out and found Mrs. SELF lying dead close to his grave. I do not vouch for the authenticity of either of the stories, but I know there was a Vowell Cemetery but it is impossible to find it now.

There are deeds in Natchitoches Parish Courthouse mentioning Indian Territory (I.T.) in which the name SELF appears as well as Vowells. Mr. Gilcrist married one of the Vowell girls and went to I.T.. It is claimed the Self Family had Indian Blood and I assume this is correct because they are mentioned in those deeds.

THE SELF FAMILY(cont.)

In the Spanish Archives of General Land Office in Austin, Texas a league of land was granted to Jacob SELF in Liberty County in 1831.

In the records of TORO BAPTIST CHURCH in Sabine Parish, La. we find 4 SELF men listed as Charter Members 20 September 1848. Eli, Elijah, David W and Wm. J.

In Sabine Parish, Louisiana settlement between 1832 and 1860 we find in 1851 James I. and John.

In 1859 Alfred Self is listed as a settler.

in 1847 the first recorded marriage in Sabine Parish was Hannah SELF who married Joseph Simpson.

In 1847 John SELF witnessed the marriage between Alfred Litton and Nancy Critchfield.

In 1860 David W. was assessor

In 1860 census D.W. is shown as owning over 6 slaves

In 1861 Martha attended school at Bellwood, La.

In 1861 Elias and David taught school at Mt. Carmel and Middle Creek.

In 1861 The Sabine Rifles was organized with D.W. SELF as captain. He was afterwards the sheriff of Sabine Parish. Frank D., Albert, William and Frank, Jr. were all members of that military unit. Both Albert and Frank, Jr. died in the war.

In 1865 D.W. was State Representative.

In 1871 D.W. was Police Juror

In 1877 F.D. was Tax Collector

In 1883 D.W. was sheriff as was Frank D. for the same year.

NOTE: David W. (D.W.) and Frank (Franklin) D. were sons of William

Self of St. Helena Parish, La.

In Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana is the Succession Record of JOB SELF #1224 dated 12 February 1862. Minor ALBERT SELF. Wm. A. Collins and Wm. D. Stayton appraised the property.

Wesley Chapel & Cemetery, Tensas Parish, LA

The oldest place of worship in Tensas Parish is believed to be the Wesley Chapel, built about 1852 on a site 10 miles west of St. Joseph on Delta Plantation. The building is still standing with a quaint old cemetery. Many of the pioneer residents of the parish are buried there. The cemetery contains 53 marked graves and many known, but unmarked graves. The earliest marked grave in the cemetery is dated 1843. This date was inscribed on a marble slab, along with the name W.E. FORD and a Masonic emblem. 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ABSTRACTS OF THE HISTORY OF THE HAYNESVILLE UNITED METH-ODIST CHURCH 1855 - 1982 Claiborne Parish, Louisiana Submitted by Fran HARP NASH

The Haynesville United Methodish Church had it's beginnings in 3 localities on the outskirts of town in the middle of the last century when this section of the country was settled. The Methodist Episcopal Church South was started at "Old Town", the Methodist Protestant Church started as a brush arbor (present site of Shady Grove Cemetery) and Ward's Chapel, later New Salem, was probably begun a few years later than the first two. Land for the first church was donated by J.C. TAYLOR, and a little log church was built and used until it was destroyed by fire. Between 1855 and 1860, a frame church was re-built by Joseph W. CAMP and a Choctaw Indian. Construction was interrupted by the Civil War, but finished after the war. In 1878 or 1879 a storn destroyed the church and it was re-built in 1880 or 1881 by John W. McEACHERN and an old Negro man known as Uncle Gus GILMORE. Some of the lumber was re-used. There was no heat in the church until Miss Lillian BROWN, the organist, started a fund to buy a stove. The last quarterly conference was held at Old Town in 1897, the church was used for other purposes including funeral services until torn down in 1932. Charter members of these pioneer churches were the families of A. N. BROWN, Tom BROWN, Frank BROWN, C.A. BURNHAM, Joseph W. CAMP, Jim MOSS, J.C. & A.C. SALE, and R.A.N. WINN. Now the Haynesville Cemetery is located on this site. In 1900, the First Methodist Episcopal Church South, a frame building built by Crate MOORE, of Homer, was erected on the site where the present church now stands. Destroyed by a storm in 1902, it was re-built by Rev. R.B. KIRKPATRICK, a Presbyterian minister, and Thomas W. CAMP. In 1922 the present brick church was erected, Rev. A.J. GEARHEARD, pastor. The children of Mr. & Mrs. W.Z. TAYLOR donated the pipe organ. Methodist Episcopal Church, South pastors:

WARD'S CHAPEL or NEW SALEM CHURCH
Although there is no cemetery or other marker to show
where Ward's Chapel stood, an old record dated 16 July
1871 stated that a regular church meeting was conducted
by John A. MILLER, pastor and John S. BURNHAM, secretary.
In 1872, the name of the church was changed to New Salem,
signed by presiding elder S.S. SCOTT and R.G. FLURNOY,
pastor. Some early members were the families of Luther
