REPORT FROM THE GENEALOGY ROOM OF SHREVE MEMORIAL

YES! Virginia, we do believe in Santa Claus! In fact, we have had Christmas in June here in the Genealogy Room at Shreve Memorial Library. Two new Recordak microfilm readers, a microfilm cabinet, a new card catalogue, nearly a thousand rolls of microfilmed Federal census population schedules, and 146 book titles (204 volumes) have been added to our collection. We have added several periodicals through our exchange program with other societies.

The Federal census population schedules for 1790, 1800, and 1810 are now complete and available for use in the room, either in book form or on microfilm.
