

Bremer of Salt Lake City. We had already engaged Mr. Bremer to speak at our 1976 workshop, however, he graciously agreed to conduct our workshop this year instead.

Mr. Bremer honored our organization on February 19 by conducting a mini-workshop, which was only a sample of what we may expect at our Ninth Annual Workshop, August 8 and 9, 1975. To those of you who missed hearing Mr. Bremer, I can only say that you missed hearing and meeting the most talented and capable professional genealogist I have ever had the pleasure of hearing. His knowledge of genealogy is not limited to any particular state or section of the United States; he knows the entire United States in detail, as well as Great Britain and Europe.

This will be the first two-day workshop ever sponsored by our Association, and it is my hope that this endeavor will be supported by all of our members. At the present we are still in the planning stage, but it is our intention to take our workshop to Caddo Parish Courthouse, Federal Courthouse, LSU-S Library, Shreve Memorial Library, and possibly other records repositories, on Friday, August 8. This will be done by use of a chartered bus during which time Mr. Bremer will lecture and give physical demonstrations of how to use the genealogical materials available at each of the above mentioned facilities.

The second day, Saturday, August 9, Mr. Bremer will lecture the full day on how to locate and use the genealogical sources you need anywhere in the United States or Britain. His knowledge on this subject is unsurpassed.

Hope all of you will plan to make the most of this very special workshop. You can register for either or both days, but early registration is of utmost importance. See you there!

It contains many, many pictures and charts; also family charts that begin with Claude Jarry, b France ca 1390, m 1415 to Madeleine Davy. However, it is from Pierre (Peter), fourth generation, that all who bear the family name of Jarry today are descended.

The compilers have traced and documented the family history from Virginia, Alabama, Arkansas and on into Shelby County, Texas. In that course of time there were intermarriages with many families, including Grumble, Owens, Gillis, and Bright.
