

PRESIDENT'S PAGE

We have been so busy planning 1985 that it came as a surprise that the first quarter is gone already.

Our programs this first quarter have been very informative and interesting. January featured using computers in genealogy. Mrs. Leslie Riebesehl, librarian from Shreve Memorial Library, presented a program on using our Genealogy Room to the best advantage. At the March meeting, Hubert Humphries, a retired LSU-S history professor, taught us how to interview people properly. Mr. Humphries worked for several years as head of the Oral History department of the Archives.

April begins a series of programs featuring little known sources of genealogical information. Jerry Bloomer, curator of Norton's Art Gallery, will inform us of the availability of the genealogical collection housed in the gallery. At the same meeting Frank Kriestenberg from Rose-Neath Funeral Home will explain how to obtain records kept in funeral homes.

In May, the rector of St. Paul's Lutheran Church will speak on Lutheran records. Sharing the May program will be Mrs. Lesley Hilburn of the Sesquicentennial Committee. She will give us a forecast of the celebration of Shreveport's 150th anniversary.

In June we will begin our Seminar for Beginning Genealogists. This seminar will take the place of our annual workshop. We are very excited about our new seminar. These 2½-hour classes will be taught once a week for 6 weeks at the King's Highway Christian Church. These lectures will cover organizing genealogical material. County court house records will be covered in detail, as well as state and federal records. Using a library, migration trails, ethnic settlements of southern states, evaluating family traditions, and church records will all be topics of this seminar. The June and July meetings will be part of our seminar.

We ask your cooperation in spreading the word about our seminar. Its success depends on our efforts in getting the word to the interested parties.

The \$25 fee will include a 6-month membership in the Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association, as well as the seminar. A special rate will be available for family groups.

The second Saturday of August will be our Book Fair. The Book Fair was so successful last year, that we are asking Joyce Bridges to do this again this year.

Because of our Sesquicentennial and a renewed interest in Shreveport, we have decided to publish an index of approximately 15,000 names copied from tombstones in Caddo Parish. This index includes the major cemeteries in the parish, and many of the small ones. This printing culminates a long ago project of the Association begun by a local genealogist of note, Bill Randolph, in the early 1970's while Richard Colquette was president. I consider it a privilege to help to bring to fruition so ambitious a project of two outstanding historians.

Ancestral Charts, Volume I is now on the market and the early sales are encouraging. Sharon Potts is to be commended for her hard work and perseverance. She is looking forward to publishing Volume II in the summer.

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SHREVEPORT'S SESQUICENTENNIAL YEAR 1835 - 1985

A CONDENSED HISTORY OF SHREVEPORT, LA.

With the purchase of Louisiana in 1803, many settlers came into the area, and by the year 1830, some had come into the area now known as Caddo Parish. The United States, for many reasons, made a treaty with the Caddo Indians who lived in this area whereby they bought their lands. One stipulation of the treaty was that Larkin Edwards, Sr., who had rendered many services as interpreter, was to have 640 acres. The treaty was made 1 July 1835.

Unlike many towns, Shreveport originated strictly as a river town. Its site was always known as a natural point. The Indians knew it, and their ancestors knew it. You can still see evidence of their mounds.

Captain Henry Miller Shreve, a daring steamboat captain and Superintendent of Western River Improvement, first saw this land that was to be named in his honor in the Spring of 1833. He was sent to the Red River to break up a log jam and driftwood enmeshed in sandbars. These jams had accumulated in large masses in sections of the river bed for a distance of more than 160 miles and were known as the "Great Raft". As a result of Captain Shreve's exploits, the river was opened to commerce, thus bringing growth and prosperity to the area.

In 1834, when Shreve had cleared the raft to the bluffs on which Shreveport is now located, he chose the bluffs as a campsite for his crew. Recognizing this as a strategic point for Red River development, he joined the movement which was soon underway for the establishment of a town at this place.

Eight men, whose names will live forever in the history of Shreveport, are the incorporators of the Shreve Town Company, who purchased from Jehiel Brooks for \$ 5,000 a 640 acre tract of land on which Shreveport is located. The articles of incorporation are dated May 27, 1836.

These eight men are: Henry M. Shreve of Kentucky, James B. Pickett of South Carolina, Thomas T. Williamson of Arkansas, Angus MacNeil of Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana, Bushrod Jenkins and Messrs. Bennett Cane of Arkansas, and Sturgis Sprague of Mississippi.

HISTORY OF SHREVEPORT CONT'D

Captain Shreve had his company survey and map out what is now known as Texas Street more or less in the center with streets named Travis, Fannin, and Caddo on the north; Milam, Crockett, and Cotton on the south. The street on the river front was named Commerce Street and the street called Common Street, where the Methodist Church is which was built in 1845, was the western border. The new town was named Shreveport in honor of Captain Shreve and you recognize the names of the Texas Alamo heroes.

The Charter of 1839 approved March 20, 1839 by the Louisiana Legislature incorporated Shreveport as a Town and specified a Trustee form of government. An election was held the 1st Monday in May, 1839 to select the five members of government of the Town of Shreveport.

The first council meeting was held September 2, 1839, The Honorable John O. Sewall presiding as Mayor.

Business boomed and the new town of Shreveport grew. An early population figure gave a count of 4,000. There was a time where steamboats branched off the main river at Twelve Mile Bayou to go up through Jeems and Buffalo Bayous to Jefferson, Texas, which was also a new town built shortly after Shreveport.

Some of the first stores were owned by people whose names are familiar even today- Homer Jordan started Jordan and Booth, M. Levy had a store, and Phelps Shoe Store. Eli and Amidi Gras were dealers in plain and fancy groceries and feed stuff. There were several early sawmills located on the Red River and Cross Bayou. One named Victoria Lumber Company was so called in honor of the English Queen Victoria.

Because it was in some degree isolated, Shreveport became the Capitol of the State of Louisiana in 1863. Three sessions of the legislature were convened in Shreveport before the conclusions of the War between the States.

The iron clad "Missouri" was being built and equipped here, though never finished. There were many forts and batteries located here. Some of these were: Fort Jenkins, was located where Schumpert hospital now stands; Ft Johnston, Fort Smith, located across the Red River and Camp Boggs was located somewhere near St. Vincent's academy.

History shows that the victory at Mansfield saved Shreveport without bloodshed or fire.

HISTORY OF SHREVEPORT CONT'D

As commerce grew, all the surrounding country wanted to avail themselves of the traffic and trade resulting from steamboat transportation on the Red.

The people of Minden in Webster Parish built what was called the "Shed Road". It ran from Red Chute to what is now Bossier City. This was a hand graded road bed through stiff buck-shot clay lands impossible to travel in wet weather. This buck-shot clay is so sticky when wet that it will ball-up bigger and bigger on the feet of the mule so that before many steps it would have such weight as to make travel impossible. However, when dry it made a hard and good road. Therefore, to keep the rains from ruining this entry into Shreveport, the road was roofed over with cypress planks for its distance of 12 miles. It was owned by the Watkins family, who got their money back by charging toll for its use. The area of land it traversed was called in those days the "Slough of Despond."

Because of so much rain and mud the people of Shreveport built what they called the "Plank Road." This was simply sawed planks laid down to keep the wagons from sinking in the mud in the rainy season. It went from about where the Methodist Church is on out what is now Texas Avenue to about where the K.C.S. overpass is. Another early improvement in transportation was the "street car system."

This was a mule hitched to a car that ran on a wooden track up Texas Street.

The early growth of Shreveport depended heavily on extractive industries which developed the resources of the area. Agriculture, oil, gas and lumber have contributed directly to the growth of manufacturing and indirectly to the expansion of service industries and other forms of employment. They are still vitally important to the local economy.

In the 150 years since incorporation, the area has grown into one of the two largest metropolitan areas, with an estimated population of over 352,600. It is also the center of the Ark-La-Tex area which reaches into northeast Texas, Southwest Arkansas and all of northwest Louisiana.

Since 1950, the growth of the city on the Red River has been rapid and the growth spurt of the 1970's along with the dredging of Red River it looks like we will soon be recognized as a major port of the Red River again as well as enjoy the growth of a metropolis.

NATCHITOCHES PARISH NOTES: BY FERN AINSWORTH

By the cessions of Louisiana and Florida, the United States succeeded to the territorial rights and obligations of Spain in these provinces. In acquiring the public domain the duty of protecting the rights of individuals devolved on them. The inhabitants of the ceded land were secured in their lawful possessions by express treaty stipulations. The labors of land commissioners charged with the duty of investigating the landed titles derived from the former government, and the subsequent legislation of Congress in confirming a large number of claims pertaining to this public domain.

In 1825, the area know as the Rio Hondo, which is the area between the River Hondo and the Sabine River, was offered to the public for settlement.

The people who had settled there previously and wished their claims recognized had to prove their rights to it. The following list are those whose claims were approved.
