



Frances Glassell (Mrs. Gordon) LAMBERT has in her possession a cookbook published in 1925 by the Shreveport Chapter of DAR. The book belonged to her mother-in-law, Olivia Clara Quattlebaum LAMBERT (Mrs. Joseph Oliphant LAMBERT), who was a long time member of this chapter.

Several of the recipes in the book have been marked, and are presumed to be favorites of Mrs. LAMBERT.

DARK DEVIL'S FOOD CAKE

One cup of brown sugar, two-thirds cup of coffee liquid, four squares chocolate (bitter). Cook this mixture until thick. One-half cut butter, one cup white sugar, two egg yolks, beaten until lemon colored, two egg whites, two cups of flour, two teaspoons of baking powder, one-half teaspoon vanilla, a pinch of salt, and one-half cup coffee liquid. Cream butter, add sugar, then eggs, sift flour, baking powder and soda together. Add above mixture alternation with the chocolate mixture and one-half cut coffee mixture.

Make two layers. Should be thick enough so that one has to spread it out with knife after mixture is in pan. Use white boiled icing for top and between layers.

NATCHITOCHE PARISH NOTES

By Fern Ainsworth

Some of the early settlers in Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana, emigrated from York County, South Carolina. The graves of many of their ancestors are located in the cemetery of the Beersheba Presbyterian Church, Route 1, York, South Carolina. The cemetery is situated on the grounds directly behind the church now standing.

The church was organized in 1769. The present building is the fourth church of this congregation. The cemetery has been used as a community burying grounds since the beginning of the earliest church. In the old part it is known definitely that there are a number of graves unmarked.

The oldest marked grave is that of Hanah WATSON, who died August 13, 1706. The second oldest grave is that of David WATSON, who died in June 1706. Descendants of both were among those who came to Natchitoches Parish.

NEW NATIONAL ARCHIVES MICROFILM RENTAL PROGRAM

The National Archives has announced that individuals can participate in the Microfilm Rental Program. This program, which is now operating, allows individuals to rent National Archives microfilm. These are the only available microfilm rolls copied directly from the original silver master maintained by the Archives.

In addition, the program introduces new lower rental fees, both for direct participants and for those who order through such institutions as libraries or genealogical societies. These new rates, the lowest available, are \$3.00 per roll for orders of 4 rolls; \$2.50 per roll when 5-9 rolls are ordered; and \$2.00 per roll for orders of 10 or more rolls. In addition, the \$3.00 postage and handling fee is waived for orders of 4 or more rolls.

The new direct-order program does not replace the present rental service, which operates through local libraries. Novice genealogists who prefer to have experienced ordering assistance can still order microfilm through participating libraries. Experienced genealogists, however, can take advantage of the efficiency of the direct order program.



LSU LIBRARIES' MICROFILM USE POLICY

For almost forty years the LSU Libraries, in cooperation with the state's publishers, has undertaken a massive project to preserve Louisiana's newspapers. The LSU Libraries has devoted much time and money to collecting and microfilming every available issue of these important records of Louisiana's life and culture. Newspaper publishers have cooperated by depositing with the LSU Libraries current issues of their publications as they are issued. These issues, together with older backfiles, have been microfilmed by the staff of the LSU Libraries, and the resulting microfilm made available to researchers, genealogists, faculty and students.

Until a few years ago, no positive copy of this microfilm was generated; the actual camera negative was instead used for reference and research. Because these newspapers are an extremely important research tool, some reels of microfilm have been heavily used and have begun to wear out. Since in many cases the original newspapers were destroyed after they were microfilmed, these precious negative microfilm reels are the only copies of these newspapers in existence.

Recognizing that an important part of Louisiana's heritage has thus been endangered, the LSU Libraries has adopted a new policy of no longer letting the master negatives be used for reference purposes. The Libraries has undertaken an extensive program to generate copies for use in microfilm readers. This will be an expensive and long-term project; in the meantime, many of these titles will not be immediately available for consultation and use. Instead, positive copies of the negative microfilm will be generated on demand; normally there will be a delay of between two to four days to provide this copy for use.

The LSU Libraries recognizes that this new policy may result in serious inconvenience to the reader. We regret this inconvenience, but we are confident that genealogists, historians, faculty and students, and all other researchers will understand that this step is taken in the interest of the long-range preservation of these indispensable historical materials.

In order to minimize inconvenience, the LSU Libraries suggests that when researchers anticipate using Louisiana newspapers on microfilm, they call ahead to determine if the newspaper is available, and to request that copies be generated for their use if necessary. The LSU Libraries will make every effort to generate positive use copies in advance of the need. In addition, the LSU Libraries will make these copies available on interlibrary loan.



In the absence of the first census records, genealogists and historians interested in the late 18th and early 19th centuries in Georgia must turn to other documents. With the publication by the R. J.
