



SOME LAND RECORDS RECORDED TWICE

Frequently when a new county was formed, the land owners who were "cut off" into the new county, took their deeds of title to the new court clerk and had them recorded for a second time—in the books of the new county. You may find the same deed on the books of the parent and daughter county. And keep this in mind when you find that a courthouse has burned—many took their deeds again to the courthouse to be re-recorded. Always check the oldest surviving deed and will books and/or the first will and deed books after the loss of records in a county for re-recorded deeds and wills regardless of the dates shown for these books of record. The dates shown on the covers of a record book may have been selected by the bindery and may not be inclusive. Some records are recorded many, many years after the act took place.

HISTORIC NEW ORLEANS COLLECTION

The Historic New Orleans Collection has surveyed nine cemeteries in New Orleans; St. Louis I and II, Lafayette I and II, Cypress Grove, Odd Fellows Rest, Greenwood, and St. Joseph I and II. This cemetery project is an excellent source of information about families and craftsmen in New Orleans.





"Choestoe" means "where the rabbits dance", a word in their language that indicates this tranquil setting. In the early 1800's, Virginians, North and South Carolinians spilled over into this area to settle. 102 pages including index.

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TITLE: EARLY MARRIAGE RECORDS OF CASEY COUNTY, KENTUCKY 1807-1915, by Phillip A. Rice, Kathleen Goff, Charlotte Mason and Edward Mason

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Two volumes of the official marriage records in the Casey County Courthouse, Liberty KY are included in this book. This county was first discovered in 1779 by Col. Wm. Casey, great-grandfather of Mark Twain (Samuel L. Clemens). It was here that he built Casey's Station on the Dix River, and it was for this man that the county received its name.

TITLE: WINSTON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI MARRIAGES 1834-1880, compiled by Lucille Simms Mallon

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Winston County, MI was established 23 December 1833, and was one of many counties formed in that year from the territory acquired by the Choctaws by the treaty of Dancing Rabbit in 1830. 46 pages.

TITLE: LUNENBURG COUNTY MARRIAGES, 1750-1853, by John Vogt and T. William Kethley, Jr.

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This volume is arranged in three parts. Part I, the REGISTER's master listing of all last names, also shows the frequency of their occurrence, permits the searcher to consider all the possible variants of a name. Once the researcher has determined

the various names desired, he can proceed to the alphabetical listings of marriages first by husband's last name (Part 2) and then by wife's last name in a separate listing (Part 3).

TITLE: NOXUBEE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI MARRIAGES, 1834-1869, and INDEX WILL BOOK A, 1884-1861, compiled by Lucille Simms Mallon

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Noxubee County was formed in 1833, from the Choctaw Cession of 1830. This book is a handy reference to marriages and wills for an early period in this county. Marriages are arranged by date within each letter of the alphabet. An index to Will Book A and to brides' names are arranged alphabetically.

TITLE: NESHOPA COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI MARRIAGES, 1877-1889, compiled by Lucille Simms Mallon

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Located in the east central part of Mississippi lies the county of Neshoba, created in 1833 from the Choctaw Cession of 1830. Books I and II of the marriage records are included in this volume, complete with a full name index of brides.
