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
SECOND QUARTER 1996

OBTAINING BIRTH AND DEATH CERTIFICATES IN LOUISIANA

(LOUISIANA ROOTS, July-August, 1995)

The State of Louisiana did not maintain birth and death certificates until 1918. Records prior to that date are probably non-existent unless the parish where the birth or death occurred kept such a record.

If the individual(s) you are researching were Catholic, the birth or death would probably be shown in the records of the church or diocese where the person(s) lived. Louisiana State Archives in Baton Rouge has recently acquired the following:

Birth Certificates (Orleans Parish Only) 1790-1893.

Death Certificates (Orleans Parish) 1804-1943.

Death Certificates (Statewide) 1912-1943.

Marriage Certificates (Orleans Parish Only) 1831-1943.

For more recent records, please contact Vital Records, P. O. Box 60630, New Orleans, LA 70160. Phone: (504) 568-2561. Please include the following information with your request:

1. Full name of the person as given on the birth/death record.
2. Sex and race.
3. Parents' names, including maiden name of mother.
4. Month, day and year of the birth/death.
5. Place of birth/death (city or town, parish and state; name of hospital, if any).
6. Purpose for which copy is needed.
7. Relationship to person whose record is on file.

WEILAND-RITCHIE FAMILY HISTORY

HERMAN LEWIS WEILAND

Herman's paternal grandparents, Berene U. Weiland and Francis J. Holscher, were first cousins, both born in Germany, and who came to the United States with other family members in 1882. They settled in the German Community at Moroa, Illinois. They were married at Decatur, Illinois, in 1884, and had eight children, all born in Illinois. The family moved to a farm north of Gotebo, Oklahoma, in 1901, where two more children were born, one of which was Herman's father, Fred, in 1903. Berend and his elder sons homesteaded farmland 25 miles north of Clayton, New Mexico in 1909, and the rest of the family joined them in the latter part of 1909. Life on a New Mexico farm was hard and the elder Weiland's with the younger children moved into Clayton soon after the five year residency requirement was met. They opened a used furniture store, living in the rear of the store.

Herman's maternal great-grandfather, Charles Frederick Wilhelm Leonhardt, was born in Silesia (Prussia) in 1817, fought in the Austrian/Hungarian War, 1847-1849, under Kossuth. He came to the United States in 1854, and settled in Plymouth Rock, Massachusetts, where he opened a gymnasium. The slavery issue was really evident by 1856, and he went to Kansas. He was elected as a Senator of the Kansas free-state territorial legislature on 10 Jun 1857. He was appointed a Colonel and Aide-de-camp to Major General James H. Lane in 1858. 1859 finds Charles in Cincinnati, Hamilton Co., Ohio, where he received a Notary Public License from Hamilton County, Ohio on 15 Oct 1859. He enrolled in the University of Cincinnati Law School and received his degree in April 1860, passing his Ohio Bar Examination the same month. He became a Conductor on the slave Under Ground Rail Road about this time, transporting slaves to Canada. He moved further west to Missouri and Iowa transporting slaves. He set up a law practice in Iowa City, Johnson County, Iowa, in the latter part of 1860. While conducting slaves in that area, he met Griffith Lewis, one of the Station Masters of the UGRR. He soon became better acquainted with the Lewis family, who were Quakers. They had come to Iowa from Ohio in 1853.

Charles and Griffith's daughter, Esther, fell in love and were married in Iowa City in April 1861. Charles' love for the military service was not quenched by his marriage, and he enlisted in the New York Fifty-Eighth Infantry on 30 Aug 1861. He was sent to Hunter's Chapel, Virginia, promoted to Lieutenant and served as the Company Adjutant. Health conditions forced him to resign in 1862, and he returned to Iowa. Herman's grandfather, Henry, was born in Muscatine, Iowa in 1863. The family later moved to the Manhattan, Kansas area, where Charles served as a City Judge. In 1879, Charles was appointed a director of the Kansas State Historical Society.

Henry met Olive Eudora Rudy in Manhattan, and they were married there in 1891. Henry and Olive moved to Kingfisher, Oklahoma in 1892, and Herman's mother, Mary Lorena Leonhardt, was born there in 1901, the last of five children. In 1927, Mary Lorena and her married sister's family decided to go west and seek their fortune elsewhere. A blinding snowstorm was present in the Clayton, New Mexico area when they arrived, and they were forced to spend a few days there. They soon decided the small town was where they would stay instead of going on further. Mary Lorena met the Weiland

family daughters during the period following, and they fixed her up with a date with their brother, Fred. Fred Weiland and Lorena Leonhardt were married in 1930. Their only child, Herman, was born in Clayton, New Mexico. Herman met Willena Veretta Ritchey at a church youth camp near Albuquerque, New Mexico in 1946.


Herman joined the U. S. Air Force in 1951, as a cryptographer, and his 20-year service career saw stateside assignments in Texas (7), Wyoming, Illinois (2), Pennsylvania, California and Louisiana. His overseas assignments were in Japan, Iceland, Germany and Vietnam. The Weiland's six children were born at five different locations during those years. Their names are: Glenda, Charles, Edward, Darrel, Roger and Brian. He retired from active duty with the rank of M/Sgt at Barksdale AFB, Bossier City, Louisiana on 31 May 1971, and went to work for Arkansas Louisiana Gas Company the following day, retiring from that company in 1987. He began genealogy researching in 1977, and continues to search for those missing links. He is currently serving as Registrar for the Galvez Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution. Veretta holds membership in the Pelican Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution. Herman and Veretta both serve as Trustees of the ARK-LA-TEX Genealogical Association.

WILLENA VERETTA RITCHHEY

* Veretta's paternal grandparents were from Putnam County, Tennessee. Her great-grandfather was a Minister of the United Cumberland Presbyterian Church, serving in White, Jackson and Putnam Counties. Her grandfather, Henry Newton Ritchey, and his family moved to Grayson County, Texas in 1883, moving later to Young, Stonewall and Hale Counties in Texas. Her father, Willie Ritchey, was born in Stonewall County in 1899. While in Hale County, her father met Effie Johnson, and they married in 1922. The Johnson family were from Overton County, Tennessee, and after a stop in Sharp County, Arkansas, where Veretta's grandfather, William T. Johnson, was born, the family moved to Childress County, Texas, where Veretta's mother, Effie, was born in 1903. The Johnsons later moved to Hale County, where the two young people met and married. Willie and Effie (Johnson) Ritchey tried farming in the Floyd County, Texas area, where Veretta was born. Willie didn't like cotton farming and the family moved to Dalhart, Texas in December 1931, and on to Sedan, New Mexico in 1946. This set the stage for the meeting of Herman Weiland and Veretta Ritchey. They were married in 1949.

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

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
THE COLORFUL PAST OF THE ST. JAMES HOTEL SELMA, ALABAMA

This old river hotel was originally The Brantley Hotel and was built in 1837 on one of 101 lots auctioned off in 1819 for building the city of Selma. Thomas Brantley, a Revolutionary War Veteran came to Dallas County, Alabama with his family prior to 1819 and Thomas and his sons, General John Brantley and Harris Brantley, had extensive property holdings there. Harris Brantley's son Hilliard Brantley is also listed in several deeds around and in the Selma area. Hilliard Brantley died in Wilcox County, Alabama after 1840 and Harris Brantley moved to DeSoto Parish, Louisiana where he died in April of 1863 and left a will. Harris mentioned in his will his grandchildren, Lewis Brantley and Ann Amelia Brantley Baldwin, both of Harrison County, Texas. General John Brantley is credited with establishing the Brantley in Selma, but others in the family were likely involved. It was a river hotel located on a hill high above the Alabama River on Water Avenue. There was a boat dock below the hotel and the riverboat passengers would unload there and climb up the hill to the hotel. The hotel was remodeled and the name changed to Troup House in 1860. In the spring of 1865 federal troops burned much of the Selma business district, but the Troup House was spared because it was in use by the Union soldiers. The Hotel became the St. James in 1871 and was well known as a meeting place for planters, politicians, and sportsmen. In 1893 the Albert Hotel opened on Broad Street. The St. James could not compete and closed its doors in late 1893. The property changed ownership in the 1900s but was used for commercial purposes other than a hotel. The building has been vacant since 1986.


This old hotel is most famous for the visits of Frank and Jesse James, who stayed there when they visited their childhood friend and cousin, John Norris, who moved to Selma from Missouri.

Plans are in motion and funds available at this time (1994) to completely renovate this old hotel and put it in use again. It will contain 40 rooms and a first class "white table-cloth" restaurant. It will look very much as it did originally and should be ready for occupancy in late 1995 or 1996. Once again travelers passing through Selma will be able to stop at the historic St. James.

This is an alphabatized index to 333 English language genealogical periodicals and contains about 14,000 citations. It is based on surname, locality and topical catagories and each one gives enough information to identify the person, family or the content of the article. It gives the volume, the beginning page number and a code leading to the name and address of the periodical. A great deal of valuable information is buried in periodicals published across the country, and this index is an excellent way of getting to this material. Size 5½ x 8 3/4. Hard Bound. 284 pages.

This is indeed a record of the Cook/Cooke cousins and contains many valuable Cook records. There are Cook immigrants to VA; York Co., VA marriages, deeds, and family records; Vestry records of York-Hampton, VA; Guilford/Rockingham Co., NC deede; marriage records of Elbert, Henry, Franklin, Baldwin, Bullock, Camden and many other GA counties; census records of GA; GA land lottery records; and military records from the Revolution to the Persian Gulf War with many military pictures and documents. In detail, are given the families of Francis Cook and wife, Sarah, Thomas Cook RS born 1752, Dudley Cook, Fenton Cook, John Cook RS born 1761, Benjamin Cook, Sarah Cook and husband, Joseph Long, Nancy Cook and husband, James Reagan, Elizabeth Cook and husband, Lewis Moseley, Joshua Cook and wife, Sarah, John Cook and wife, Mary Lang. There is also a detailed section on allied families and a section on "other" Cook families. This book will be a great help in locating a Cook/Cooke Grandma or Grandpa. Size 8½ x 11½. TITLE: A GENEALOGY OF RUNNELS AND REYNOLDS FAMILIES IN AMERICA. By Rev. M. T. Runnels A.M.

COST: Not Given.

This book is a copy of an 1873 publication. The general introduction along with the origins and orthography on the name gives some 49 different spellings for the names Runnels and Reynolds. It is divided into three parts, each giving the genealogy of a family. The first part is Samuel Runnels of MA born about 1674, and his wife, Abigail Middleton and their eight children. Seven generations containing 1605 individuals are followed down to 1871.

The second part is the genealogy of Job Runnels born 13 Nov 1713, and his wife, Hannah of New Hampshire, and his eight children. Job's descendants in six generations are given generation by generation to 1870.

Part three is John Runnels of Durham, New Hampshire, whose first record is a marriage to Hannah Clark on 23 Dec 1718. Other records indicate this is probably a second marriage. John's descendants are traced through six generations down to a birth in 1871.

Information is given on each individual, some in more detail than others. The book contains seven appendices, each dealing with a different family whose records were found while collecting material on the main families. The Addenda gives citations mostly from Savage's Genealogical Dictionary. There is a Roll of Honor for all wars from King Philip's War of 1675-6, through the War Between the States for all descendants listed in the book. This is an excellent work for Runnels-Reynolds families. Size 8½ x 11. Paper Bound. 354 pages. Multiple Index.

DID YOU KNOW?

Typed envelopes will reach addresses one day earlier than handwritten ones. The optical scanner that reads the envelopes starts at the bottom and reads the zip code first. If you use "Attn." at the bottom left side of the envelope, it will be kicked out by the scanner and held until it can be manually sorted. Mail will reach its destination at least a day sooner if you use zip codes.

The postmaster can direct your mail containing a folded self-addressed stamped envelope to the dead letter office. It's a violation of postal regulations to include folded envelopes inside another because they might jam postal sorting machines. Use a No. 9 envelope, which will fit inside the regular No. 10 business envelope without folding, for the S.A.S.E.

Try looking in the M section under Map in the Deed Books both Direct and Indirect in the county or parish you are researching.

In the Desoto Par, LA books I found the following town maps listed begining in 1871 with a map of Pleasant Hill, in 1896 there was Frierson and Benson, 1897 had Pelican and Logansport, South Mansfield in 1911 and Gloster in 1913.

There were all kinds of subdivisions all over the Parish from 1898 to 1913. There were several annexations and in 1907 a map of the Spider Oil Field.

This book begins with a list of 208 cemeteries giving the cemetery's various names and its location. The book then contains an alphabetized one-line listing followed by the cemetery number. These were compiled from the cemetery catalogues, dating from 1966 to the present in the vertical files in the Old Court House Museum in Marshall, TX. Some information on unmarked graves is included when it was given by representatives of the cemeteries or family members. 
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
