

- Scallywags, Rogues, and Ruffs: All Those Ancestors We Don't Talk About Every family has them, skeletons in the closet—those things that are not talked about in front of the children, and when they are it is only in whispers and euphemisms. How do you access the records of prisons, asylums and courts to find the truth behind the story?
- My Ancestor in Court From the County Court to the Supreme Court, court records may hold clues and answers to questions that you have about your ancestor. Case studies will be used to illustrate the types of records found and their use in solving problems.
- **Dealing with Record Loss** Fire, Flood, or Theft, Strategies to Overcome the Loss. Whether the courthouse burned, the clerk tossed them, the relative, autograph hunter, lawyer or surveyor took them, they succumbed to heat, humidity, insects or fading ink. The solution: In many cases it's possible to overcome the problem, but it requires diligence, perseverance, and willingness to look beyond the obvious.
- Introduction to Forensic Genealogy An overview of forensic genealogy and the role of the genealogist in these types of cases. We will discuss some of the major types of cases in which a forensic genealogist may be involved, such as guardianship, oil and gas, unidentified and unclaimed persons, and probate.
